Responsive Services

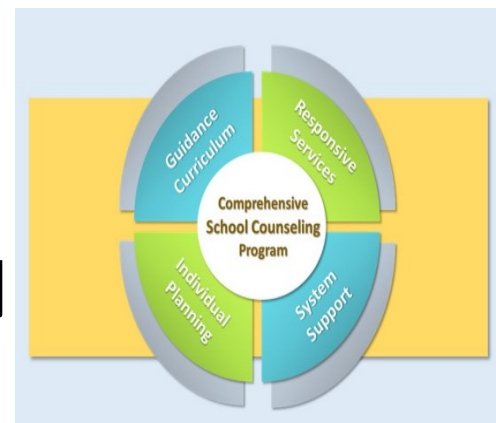
Intervene on behalf of any student whose immediate personal concerns or problems put the student's continued educational, career, personal, or social development at risk

Developmental Guidance Program cont.

School Counselors are available to assist students with a wide range of personal concerns, including such areas as social, family, emotional, mental health, or substance abuse. In order to meet the personal needs of students, school counselors may also offer support groups on a recurring basis. If a parent/guardian does not want their student to participate in a support group, written documentation of denial of services will need to be provided to the school counselor.
