THE UPPER SCHOOL EXPERIENCE

STUDENTS AND TEACHERS

15:1 student-teacher ratio; 320 students 9–12 grade.

CURRICULUM

Over 150 classes (many honors level) in English, history, math, science, modern language (Spanish, Mandarin, French), arts, PE, and computer science; additional classes through Global Online Academy.

ADVISORY AND ADDITIONAL SUPPORT

Small, mixed-grade groups (C&Cs) meet regularly with faculty advisors; 2 dedicated librarians, 2 counselors, 2 college counselors, learning specialists, Equity and Inclusion staff.

CONFERENCES AND FEEDBACK

Conferences in November; written reports in January, April, and June.

LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Student government, Outdoor Ed, affinity groups, Diversity Summit, clubs, and more.

ATHLETICS

Cross-country, soccer, volleyball, basketball, skiing, swimming, track and field, baseball, golf, tennis.

CLUBS

Over 40 student-run clubs, including Science Bowl, Model UN, Mock Trial, D.A.N.C.E., Engineering and Robotics, Yoga.

SENIOR PROJECT

A month-long project or internship in May of senior year.

IMMERSIVES

2-week focused activity in Spring. Examples: Taiko and Asian American History, Comic Book Creation, Interactive Website Programming, Applied Leadership in the Outdoors.

FUN

Dances, Take Away Day, Homecoming, C&C Basketball Tourney, annual, multi-day class trips, and much more.
