

What are the SAT and ACT?

Both are standardized tests used by numerous colleges and universities as part of the application process.

Who should take it?

We recommend that every junior who thinks they may apply to college take one or both of these tests.

When is a good time to start?

The SAT and ACT are offered several times a year. Most students take the SAT for the first time during the spring of their junior year and a second time during the fall of their senior year. The ACT is also an option and while it covers similar material the layout is different.

This is all confusing...What if we aren't sure what is best?

Counselors will be meeting with juniors individually second semester and we will be hosting a Junior College Planning Night which cover this information in more depth.




