Montana Code Annotated 2019 TITLE 45. CRIMES CHAPTER 8. OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER Part 1. Conduct Disruptive of Public Order

Disorderly Conduct

45-8-101. Disorderly conduct. (1) A person commits the offense of disorderly conduct if:

- (a) the person knowingly disturbs the peace by:
 - (i) quarreling, challenging to fight, or fighting;
 - (ii) making loud or unusual noises;
 - (iii) using threatening, profane, or abusive language;
 - (iv) rendering vehicular or pedestrian traffic impassable;
 - (v) rendering the free ingress or egress to public or private places impassable;
 - (vi) disturbing or disrupting any lawful assembly or public meeting;
 - (vii) transmitting a false report or warning of a fire or other catastrophe in a place where its occurrence would endanger human life:
 - (viii) creating a hazardous or physically offensive condition by any act that serves no legitimate purpose; or
 - (ix) transmitting a false report or warning of an impending explosion in a place where its occurrence would endanger human life; or
- (b) in the course of engaging in any of the conduct prohibited by subsections (1)(a)(i) through (1)(a)(vi), a peace officer recognizes the person's conduct creates an articulable public safety risk.
- (2) (a) Except as provided in subsections (2)(b), (3), and (4), a person convicted of the offense of disorderly conduct shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$100.
 - (b) A person convicted of a second or subsequent violation of subsections (1)(a)(i) through (1)(a)(vi) within 1 year shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$100 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed 10 days, or both.
- (3) A person convicted of a violation of subsections (1)(a)(vii) through (1)(a)(ix) shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$1,000 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed 1 year, or both.
- (4) A person convicted of a violation of subsection (1)(b) shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$500 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed 1 day, or both.

Consider Revision of the 2022-23 High School Building Reserve Budget.

Background:

- 1. The Board reviewed and adopted the 2022-23 budget at its August 15, 2022 Board meeting.
- 2. The Building Reserve budget is the sum of its funding sources: Fund Balance Reappropriated (money carried forward from the previous year) and new revenue, including taxes.
- 3. A late bill was received after 2022-23 budgets were adopted in August. The bill was for construction services performed at Bozeman High School in June 2022 and is payable from the High School Building Reserve Fund.
- 4. Because the work was completed in 2021-22, this bill had to be paid from prior year funds. Doing so caused the 2021-22 ending fund balance of the High School Building Reserve fund to decrease. Because the 2021-22 ending fund balance is a funding source for the ensuing year budget, 2022-23 funding sources are less than they were when budgets were adopted. As a result, the 2022-23 High School Building Reserve budget must decrease and a revision is needed.
- 5. The budget change will <u>not</u> impact anticipated revenue, including levied property taxes. All property tax levies will remain at the levels set by the Board in August.

Discussion:

This change is a simple timing issue: the bill was correct and anticipated; however, the District expected to pay it out of 2022-23 funds rather than 2021-22 funds, as was ultimately required. There is no change in the District's overall financial position.

Fiscal Impact:

The 2022-23 High School Building Reserve Fund budget will decrease from \$11,521,829 to \$11,333,116, a decrease of \$188,713.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustee revise the 2022-23 High School Building Reserve Fund budget to \$11,333,116.

- SB 99 was legislation enacted in 2021 that outlines how parents and guardians can review instructional materials
 related to human sexuality and opt out of instruction or events on human sexuality. The law defines human
 sexuality instruction and specifies requirements for school districts in satisfying the obligations to parents and
 guardians.
- 2. The changes to District Policy #2335 clarify the requirements of the new law to honor parents' rights on the issue of human sexuality instruction and assist with full compliance of the new law. Revisions include specific language as to annual notice requirements and 48 hour notice requirements.
- 3. The changes are required by law so the adoption of the revisions can be completed with one reading.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the Superintendent's recommendation for required changes to policy 2335.

INSTRUCTION

Policy 2335

Health Enhancement

Health, family life, and sex education, including information about parts of the body, reproduction, and related topics, will be included in the instructional program as appropriate to grade level and course of study. An instructional approach will be developed after consultation with parents and other community representatives. Parents and guardians may ask to review materials to be used and may request that their child be excluded from human sexuality education or instruction class sessions without prejudice in accordance with Policy 3120. The District will notify parents and guardians 48 hours prior to any event, assembly, or introduction of materials for instructional use on the topic of human sexuality. Notification of parent or guardian rights under this policy will be issued on an annual basis.

For purposes of this Policy, "human sexuality education or instruction" means teaching or otherwise providing information about human sexuality, including intimate relationships, human sexual anatomy, sexual reproduction, sexually transmitted infections, sexual acts, sexual orientation, gender identity, abstinence, contraception, or reproductive rights and responsibilities.

AIDS Education and Prevention

The Board believes HIV/AIDS and other STD/STI instruction is most effective when integrated into a comprehensive health education program. Instruction must be appropriate to grade level and development of students and must occur in a systematic manner. The Board particularly desires that students receive proper education about HIV and other STD/STI's, before they reach the age when they may adopt behaviors which put them at risk of contracting the disease.

In order for education about HIV and other STD/STI's to be most effective, the Superintendent will require that faculty members who present this instruction receive continuing in-service training which includes appropriate teaching strategies and techniques. Other staff members not involved in direct instruction, but who have contact with students, will receive basic information about HIV/AIDS and other STD/STI's and instruction in use of universal precautions when dealing with body fluids.

In accordance with Board policy, parents will have an opportunity to review the HIV/STD/STI education program, before it is presented to students.

- The initial BSD7 Emergency Operations Plan (School EOP) was approved by the board in 2020. Annually, the EOP is updated by schools and central office to reflect personnel changes and any changes in emergency protocols. There have been no substantive changes to this version. The plan is available for review in the Deputy Superintendents' office.
- The purpose of the EOP is to identify and respond to incidents by outlining the responsibilities and duties of BSD7 and its employees, students, and families.
- The developed guidelines and procedures for dealing with existing and potential student and school incidents are defined in the plan. The basic plan and the functional and threat/hazard-specific annexes outline an organized, systematic method to address threats, hazards, and vulnerabilities before, during, and after an incident.
- Faculty and staff have been trained to assess the seriousness of incidents and respond according to these established procedures and guidelines. BSD7 regularly schedules in-service training for faculty and staff and provides training for students and parents/guardians throughout the school year.
- The BSD7 Emergency Operations Plan outlines the expectations of staff/faculty; roles and responsibilities; direction and control systems; internal and external communications plans; training and sustainability plans; authority and references as defined by local, tribal, State, and Federal government mandates; common and specialized procedures; and specific threat/hazard vulnerabilities and responses/recovery.
- The following regulations are the State authorizations and mandates upon which this School EOP is based. These authorities and references provide a legal basis for incident management operations and activities.
 - Montana Code Annotated (MCA) 20-1-401: "Disaster drills to be conducted regularly -- districts to identify disaster risks and adopt school safety plan with subsequent amendments"
 - District Policy #8301.
