Dear RMS-CES Families,

What an incredible week we have had with 7th and 8th grade students going on an all day field trip to Baker Park and our 6th graders getting ready to embark on a multi-day trip to Deep Portage starting Monday morning. It is out of these shared experiences that students foster authentic connection and belonging with peers and staff that build our positive school culture and also get a chance to connect content standards and our STEM focus in real world application. During these trips our students have conducted themselves as responsible citizens showing respect for themselves, others, and the locations that we attend.

Here at Rockford Middle School we believe that learning is active and student centered. This is not only our philosophical belief, but has been my observation as I've been in the hallways in classrooms since the start of the year. There's not a day that goes by that I don't walk by student centered learning, rich classroom discussion and students going outside for classes to learn. I asked a 7th grade student about how they were feeling about the trip and his summary speaks to the experience.... "I love this stuff, that's why I go here." When I asked how he was feeling about going on the field trip his response was" I love it, that's why I'm here!"


Last week I wrote to you about student leadership and I'm pleased to report to you that 49 students out of a building of approximately 500 kids applied to be on student council leadership. As I listened and watched every one of their videos I can say that our future is bright in their collective hands. The common themes I heard in listening to the videos were that of kindness, support, belonging, and visions of helping create a school where amazing things happen. I've made the promise that all students who applied for student council will have an opportunity to formally lead this year. The student body voted on the ten student council members who have already begun the process of selecting dress up days for homecoming and making decisions around processes in the building.

We appreciate that students come into their own space as unique individuals. Here at RMS-CES our primary focus is learning and we expect that students are comfortable, but appropriately dressed to learn. We understand that an outfit a student wears in a school setting might be different from another social setting they might choose. Appropriate clothing includes, but is not limited to clothing appropriate for the weather/learning activities and does not create a health or safety hazard. We ask that students think critically about the choices they make regarding the clothing they wear for school. Please reference our dress code if you have any additional questions.

I am so very grateful for your support as parents. Every time I have made a request of you I have found parents to be so incredibly supportive. As we continue to help teach responsibility relating to the chromebook I would ask that we maintain a constant message that students are responsible for bringing a charged chromebook to school each day and making sure it gets to each one of your classrooms. You should expect students to bring the chromebook home every day.

"This last week, Monday, 8th graders had the wonderful opportunity of going on a field trip with the Baker Park naturalists. It was a beautiful day with sunshine and




warm temperatures. Students were able to walk around in prairie lands cultivated by Crow Hassan Parks. This is not an area generally open to the public it was a real treat to walk around the prairie grasses, flowers and wildlife. While students were



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walking through the prairie they were practicing their stewardship of land and nature by gathering certain seeds to help replant prairieland. Students also did a mapping project with Baker naturalists that tied in nicely with Mr. Riley's mapping class projects. Students learned the components that make a map good. On the Baker Wilderness Park site students practiced outdoor cooking and archery. Students had the opportunity to make hash browns, pancakes and popcorn over open fires. Most students enjoyed their cooking. The popcorn was a bit tricky. Archery is always a hit and we










8TH GRADE SOCIAL STUDIES-MR. RILEY


