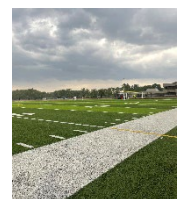
day. Likewise, later in the week, they participated in a "Green Out" spirit day, while the PTO held an epic Mums sale.
