Message from the Superintendent



FIRST STUDENT DAY TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2022

Dear Trinity Area Families,

I hope you are enjoying a wonderful, relaxing summer break. As the new school year approaches, I want to provide you with information so you know what your child(ren) can expect upon returning to campus, and why changes lay ahead as our community grows. I am excited to share this information with you!

Throughout the last five years, Trinity Area has expanded significantly and students' learning, social, and emotional needs have become increasingly more complex. Additionally, as in districts across the nation, our special education population has skyrocketed. Between 2018 and 2022, we have found space for three preschools, eight emotional support classrooms, four autistic support classrooms, three classrooms for English language learners, two additional guidance counselors, four licensed therapists, five social workers, 10 career programs, six police officers, and a myriad of other classrooms and personnel. Since Trinity Middle School (TMS) was built in the 70's, the outdated infrastructure does not always accommodate such additions. Thus, we have been forced to get creative. We've renovated storage closets and teachers' work areas to provide additional space for instruction. We've combined classrooms and required teachers to share space. Teachers have conducted classes on stages and in cafeterias, hallways, and even unrenovated storage rooms. While we are thrilled with the community's growth and incredibly grateful for the additional personnel, we recognize that, to do our best for students, we must address the issues of overcrowding and old infrastructure. Moreover, to keep all special education students in their home schools and provide them with the resource they need to be successful, we must expand.

You may have learned that our school directors recently approved a large construction project to address the issues noted above. By fall of 2024, renovations will be made to TMS and a new wing will be built to serve as an intermediate school for students in grades 4 and 5. For our current Hillers, as well as for those who moved into the district, we will continue to provide outstanding educational programming in a safe, healthy environment that invites 21st Century teaching and learning. We sincerely thank our school directors for securing a promising future for our students.



As work is scheduled to begin at the TMS campus, we have made provisions to ensure that our students and staff will remain safe and secure during construction. For example, we have identified new routes for driving and walking to campus, and we will arrange for shuttle buses to transport fans to and from sporting events held at the stadium. As a result, new traffic patterns will emerge and routines will undoubtedly be disturbed. Please keep in mind, that, throughout the next two years, changes to drop-off procedures, limited parking, the relocation of events, and other necessary inconveniences will become the norm. This is because we will need to make room for construction vehicles and to store building materials safely.

Parents/guardians of middle school students are strongly encouraged to send children to school by way of busses whenever possible. Busses will be given priority access during the busy drop-off and pickup times, and there will be delays if numerous other vehicles are located on campus for the arrival and dismissal of students. We will send more detailed information about parking once the school year begins. For now, we ask for your support and cooperation because we believe that these inconveniences will prove worthy once the project is completed.


Trinity West will also see safety renovations to the drop-off and pick-up areas. Stay tuned for more information.





Parent Right to Know Information as Required by The Elementary and Secondary Education Assistance (ESEA) [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)] and the Every Student Succeeds Act [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)]

Trinity Area School District receives Federal Title I funds to assist students in meeting state achievement standards. Throughout the school year, we will be providing you with important information about this law and your child's education. This letter lets you know about your right to request information about the qualifications of the classroom staff working with your child.

We are very proud of our teachers and feel they are prepared to give your child a high-quality education. Our Title I schools must meet federal regulations related to teacher qualifications as defined in ESEA. These regulations allow you to learn more about your child's teachers' training and credentials. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additional right to know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include
 - subject matter tested,
 - purpose of the test,
 - o source of the requirement (if applicable),
 - o amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and
 - time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.

If you have any questions about your child's assignment to a teacher or paraprofessional, please contact your child's building principal.
