Graduation Requirements: Foundations with Distinguished Achievement

Student must complete:

- ▶ 4 credits in English
- 4 credits in Math (includes Algebra II)
- 4 credits in Science
- 4 credits in Social Studies
- 2 credits in languages other than English (LOTE)
- 1 credit in Fine Arts
- 1 credit in PE
- At least 1 Endorsement (form)
- Electives required by STISD
- 28 credits-STISD
- ▶ Pass all 5 STAAR EOC exams: English I, English II, Algebra I, Biology, US History
- Complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)/TASFA



75 community service hours (cumulative) due March of Senior Year


ENDORSEMENTS

- STEM-Science, Technology, Engineering and Math-Students who want to earn the STEM endorsement must take Algebra II, Chemistry, and Physics as well as four courses in the STEM area.
- ► MULTIDISCIPLINARY-Students who want to earn a Multidisciplinary Endorsement must complete four credits in each of the four foundation subject areas to include English IV and chemistry and/or physics
- ► ARTS AND HUMANITIES-Students wishing to earn an arts and humanities endorsement must complete five social studies credits; four levels of the same language; four Art credits; or four English credits to include: AP English 3, AP English 4, Research/Technical Writing and Communication Applications and Independent Studies
- ▶ BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY- Courses required: 2 in same career cluster and one advanced CTE course. Small Engine Technology, Small Engine Technology II, Automotive Technology I, Practicum in Transportation Systems/Ext. Practicum in Transportation or Principles of Manufacturing, Welding I, Welding II and Practicum in Manufacturing.

PERFORMANCE ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

- ► A student may earn a performance acknowledgment for outstanding performance:
 - ▶ in dual credit courses (at least 12 credit hours with a "B" or better);
 - ▶ In bilingualism and biliteracy (3 credits in the same LOTE and ELA average of "80" or higher)
 - on an AP test (score of 3 or above on an AP exam);
 - on the PSAT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, National Hispanic Scholarship Corporation)
 - ▶ on the SAT (1310 total score); or
 - ▶ on the ACT (composite score of 28—excluding writing subscore)

Community service is defined as when a student decides to help or give of his/her time in their community. Community service hours must be done between grades 9th through 12th. Seventy-five (75) hours are required to be completed by senior year in order to be recognized at his/her graduating ceremony. The hours completed per month are due at the end of each month. Community service hours completed in the summer must be submitted by the first week of the following school year. Hours must be submitted to your counselor via email. Letters and log hours are required.

Community service is NOT defined as any type of internship or clerical/secretarial work. If this is the case, those hours may not be honored. Service hours should involve helping in his/her community in some form or fashion, in at least three different areas (example: a hospital, a library, and a food bank).






