We want your child to be at school, but also know kids get sick, appointments are scheduled and vacations happen.

Please let us know if your child will not be at school. There is a way to input your child's absence! There is a link on Westview's website and all you have to do is click on that link and an email goes straight to the office. It will ask you questions about your child's absence, and that includes days you may be gone for vacation, or early pick-ups, etc. You can still call 952-431-8380 or email wv.attendance@district196.org.

Be sure to include your child's name, teacher and reason for the absence. If we do not hear from you, the absence is considered Unexcused. Your child is considered Tardy if they arrive after 9:40 a.m.

Excused Absences:

- Illness
- Quarantine/waiting for test results
- Dr. and dentist appointments
- Religious holidays
- Family emergency
- Funeral
- Extreme cold temperatures

Unexcused Absences:

- Oversleeping
- Don't feel like going to school
- Child isn't up-to-date on immunizations
- Babysitting a sibling or relative
- Don't have transportation to school
- Car trouble
- No one called to report absence

PARENT/GUARDIAN DROP-OFF + PICK-UP

The designated drop-off/pick-up area is located in Westview's main parking lot, along the curb. The parking lot has a one-way entrance and exit to facilitate the flow of traffic. Students should only exit/enter vehicles from the curb-side and should never cross the parking lot without an adult escort. Please do not pull up to or park on Garden View Drive along the school grounds or into the back parking lot, as those areas are reserved for school buses and daycare vans/buses. Parent drop-off/pick-up runs very smoothly and efficiently if we all work together. Please remain patient and drive with care.

Morning Drop-Off

Students are expected to be in their seats and ready to learn at 9:30am. If your child eats breakfast at school, they should arrive at 9:15am. If your child does not eat breakfast at school, please time their arrival for 9:20am so there is sufficient time to unpack their belongings and complete their morning jobs prior to the start of the school day. When you pull up along the curb for drop-off, there is no need to wait until your vehicle is directly in front of the entrance. Parents should not be parking or idling elsewhere in the lot and allowing students to cross without an adult escort.

Afternoon Pick-Up

Families that plan to do pick-up will be issued a household pickup-sheet with an alphanumeric code. This sheet should be visible on the driver's dashboard or held up when the designated school staff member walks down the line of vehicles entering codes to check-in rides for students. Parent-pickup students remain in their classrooms until their rides check-in and will dismissed as early as 3:40pm. Walkers are also dismissed at 3:40pm and bussers are dismissed at 3:45pm. Just as with morning drop-off, please pull up along the curb in the main parking lot, where students can safely enter vehicles. Please continue to move forward through the loop as other vehicles begin to exit, so Westview staff can continue to check rides in and clear traffic. Do not jump the line if you see an opening. There will be a school staff member located near the building entrance with a large sign indicating that vehicles should move forward, in line, and eventually following the arrows to exit the lot. Again, it is important in the afternoon as well, that you do not park in the lot and wave for your students to cross the lot toward your vehicle. Any students that have not been picked up by 4:00pm will be waiting in the office and parents will be contacted.

Note: Just as Westview's playground area is reserved for student use during the day for recess, the playground is reserved for use by the Westview's YMCA SAC program after school, from 4:00pm - 6:00pm. Students should not be left to play on-site after school dismissal for their own safety and so Westview staff can ensure that all students have connected with their designated transportation home. Students and families are absolutely welcome to use the playground after 6:00pm on school days and on non-school days.



Outdoor Learning Project Update

In the spring of 2021, the PTO launched an outdoor learning project with the goal of enhancing Westview's outdoor areas and providing students with additional options for outdoor learning. The projects are nearly complete, and classrooms are already enjoying these new areas!
