Personal Counseling

The school counselor is available to assist students with a wide range of personal concerns, including but not limited to areas such as social and emotional needs, mental health issues, family or peer concerns, or substance abuse. A student who wishes to meet with the school counselor should request to visit the school counselor's office. As a parent, if you are concerned about your student's mental or emotional health, please speak with the school counselor. The school counselor can provide a you with a list of community resources that may be available to provide additional support for your student.

Student Support Groups

In order to meet the personal needs of students, school counselors may offer support groups on a recurring basis. The support groups meet during the school day for approximately 20-45 minutes once a week. The school counselor will review the student's schedule to determine a weekly meeting time that will have the least amount of interruption to classroom instruction. Support groups are intended to provide a safe, confidential, and supportive setting for the students to discuss some of their concerns and practice behaviors that will support growth and development. Notification of student's participation in a support

group will be provided to the parent; however, as a parent, if you do not want your student to participate in a support group, written documentation of denial of services will need to be provided to the school counselor.
