English | 4 credits

All English courses are taught at the most rigorous level with junior and senior coursework taught at the college level.

History | 3 credits

All History courses are taught at the most rigorous level with junior and senior coursework taught at the college level.

Math | 3 credits

The comprehensive math program offers rigorous coursework which emphasizes the writing of mathematics and incorporates statistics and data analysis. Students are challenged to defend their work, to work carefully and deliberately, and to justify their reasoning. An ability to discuss mathematics in a logical and coherent way is a necessary skill that students develop in every math course. The curriculum in Math I and II are highly demanding and the content and level of problem solving required in Math III, IV, Linear Algebra, Calculus I, and Calculus II is comparable with college-level math coursework.

Science | 2 credits

The Biology-First Curriculum (Biology 9th – Chemistry 10th) allows students to choose among discipline-specific and interdisciplinary advanced or topic courses in their junior and senior years. Accelerated introductory courses are offered in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.

Advanced Science courses (year-long) include Bio II (AP): Chem II (AP), Physics II (AP-C); Environmental Science (AP). Junior and Senior topic courses include Forensic Science; Astrophysics; Molecular Techniques; Organic Biochemistry.

Modern and Classical Language | 2 credits

The Department of Modern and Classical Languages offers a rich and multifaceted sequence of beginning, intermediate, and advanced coursework in Chinese, French, Latin, and Spanish.

Arts | 2 credits

The Arts program emphasizes hands-on experience in the Performing (Instrumental Music, Choral Music, Theatre) and Visual Arts (Painting, Drawing, Photography, Ceramics, Digital Art). Additionally, many students choose to participate in curricular arts during their Sidwell career through Theatre productions and Technical Theatre (Crew). Arts Faculty are active professionals in their respective disciplines.

Computer Science and Engineering | N/A

The Computer Science & Engineering program offers semester-long courses with a CS 1,2,3 track. CS 2 and 3 are taught at the college-level. Demanding elective coursework includes Engineering, Dynamic Web Design, AI & Game Development, and Advanced CS Topics.
