ART ROOM NEWS

Hello Artist Families!

We have had so much fun these first few weeks of school! It is an absolute joy to teach your students and I feel like I have the best and most rewarding job in the world! Dilworth artists have really embraced the sketchbook "Doodle of the Day" that is a visual brainstorming exercise that we use to open every class. With a single-word prompt such as "school" or "food," a 3-minute timer is set and the

goal is to see how many quick sketches they can generate based on that idea. I love seeing what they come up with across all grade levels and it's amazing how well this quick and simple activity targets all of our goals simultaneously: creativity, collaboration, communication, and critical thinking. Give it a try at home sometime and see how delightfully they can surprise you!

Additionally, students have been learning about other big art principles and ideas that, as often as possible, compliment their core content studied in their home rooms. For example:

- Kinders are learning about symmetry and are creating monster faces that have the same features on right and left sides.
- 1st grade's project was all about defining shapes as a line that closes to create an outside and inside. They also learned about the difference between geometric and organic shapes.
- 2nd grade has worked on positive and negative shapes/spaces and are currently exploring some community-centered group work making crayon resist paintings.
- 3rd & 4th grades are creating self-portraits and learning about the correct proportions of facial features through observation.
- 5th grade has studied atmospheric perspective and are now learning more advanced watercolor techniques while painting Lake Mary in conjunction with their recent field trip.
- 6th grade has observed and discussed Op-Art and are using shading and curved lines to create 3-dimensional drawings.

As we begin to take deeper dives into new materials and methods, I am planning to introduce more 3D work, including sculpture and fiber arts. For certain upcoming projects, I am hoping to acquire some materials such as kid-friendly cardboard cutters, masking tape dispensers, non-fraying fabrics, etc. for the safety and ease of use for your kids. I posted a new Donors Choose in hopes that Dilworth can gain these supplies within the next month or so. If you are at all willing and able to contribute at the link below, the art room will be much better equipped for some fun projects ahead.
