

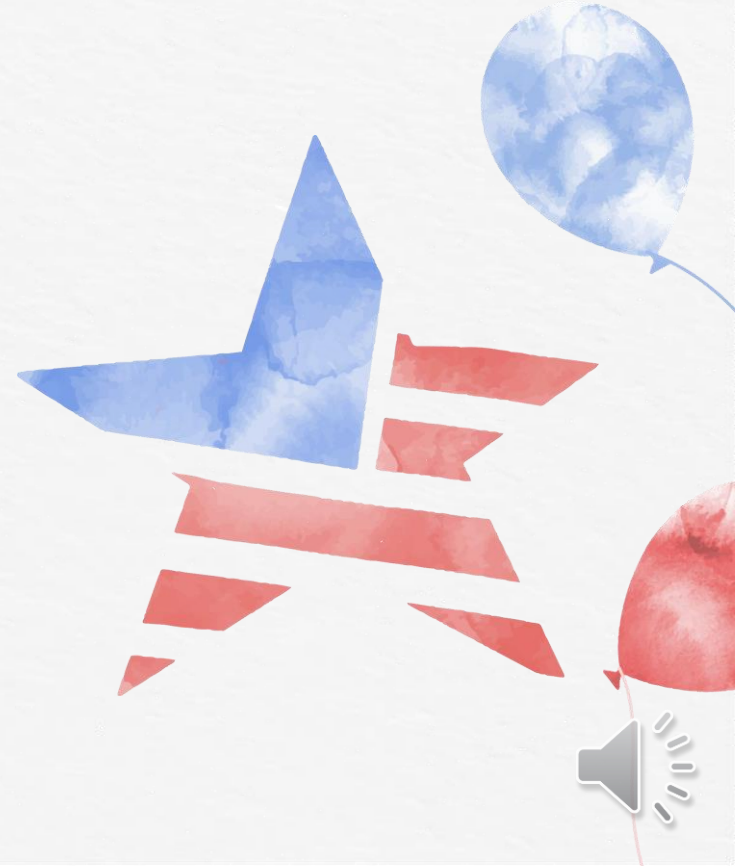

# SAT/ACT FAQ

Over 1,400 colleges in the U.S., including the CSU and UC college systems, have made the decision to be test optional or test blind in response and will NOT need test scores to make admissions decisions.

Most colleges that accept test scores will accept scores taken through December of the student's senior year!

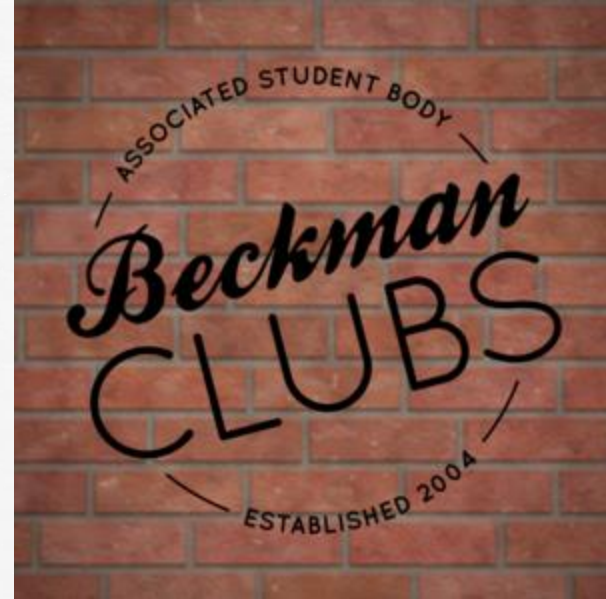
