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## **State Defined Seals**

Students must earn *at least* one State Defined Seal.

<b>Seal</b>	<b>Requirements</b>								
OhioMeansJobsReadiness Seal	Meet the requirements and criteria set by the readiness seal, including demonstration of work-readiness and professional competencies.								
Ohio Seal of Biliteracy	Meet the requirements and criteria, including proficiency on assessments in a world language and English. We offer the Avant STAMP 4s or Avant STAMP WS testing twice each year (fall and spring) and AP tests (late spring).								
Industry-Recognized Credential Seal	Earn a 12-point approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.								
College-Ready Seal	Earn remediation-free scores on the ACT or SAT. 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Military Enlistment Seal	Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces or participate in an approved JROTC program for at least two years.								
Citizenship Seal <i>(Students must meet one of the criteria for both US History and US Government to earn this seal. The exception is the AASCD social studies score meets the requirement for both US History and US Government.)</i>	A student can: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Earn a score of proficient or higher on US History and US Government OST;</li> </ol> or <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Earn a score of basic or higher AASCD social studies;</li> </ol> or <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>3. Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on the appropriate AP (US History and US Government and Politics) or IB exams;</li> </ol> or <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>4. Earn a “B” or higher in appropriate classes taken through College Credit Plus for both US History and US Government.</li> </ol> or <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>5. Earn a “B” or higher in US History and US Government course</li> </ol>								

<p>Science Seal</p>	<p>A student can:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Earn a score of proficient or higher on Biology OST;</li> </ol> <p>or</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Earn a score of basic or higher AASCD science;</li> </ol> <p>or</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>3. Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on an appropriate AP (Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: E&amp;M, Physics C: Mechanics) or IB exam;</li> </ol> <p>or</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>4. Earn a “B” or higher in any three-credit hour science course taken through College Credit Plus.</li> </ol> <p>or</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>5. Earn a “B” or higher in an advanced science course (grades in biology and honors biology do not meet this criteria)</li> </ol>
<p>Technology Seal</p>	<p>Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on an appropriate AP exam (Computer Science A or Computer Science Principles)</p>
<p>Honors Diploma Seal</p>	<p>Earn one of six Honors Diplomas:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Academic Honors Diploma</li> <li>2. International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma</li> <li>3. Career-Tech Honors Diploma</li> <li>4. STEM Honors Diploma</li> <li>5. Arts Honors Diploma</li> <li>6. Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma</li> </ol>

## Locally Defined Seals

<b>Fine and Performing Arts Seal</b>	<i>Demonstrate skills in the fine or performing arts according to an evaluation aligned with guidelines adopted by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.</i>
During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Earn at least two credits in fine arts courses</li></ul> OR <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Participate in two or more fine/performing arts programs/performances inside/outside of school (verification form completed by the student and signed by the teacher/director from the outside organization)</li></ul>	
<b>Student Engagement Seal</b>	<i>Participate in extracurricular activities such as athletics, clubs or student government to a meaningful extent, as determined by guidelines adopted by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.</i>
During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Participate in at least one year of two or two years of one of the following activities (<i>Note: Students earning the PE waiver will automatically earn this seal.</i>):<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Athletics*</li><li>○ JROTC</li><li>○ Marching Band</li><li>○ Show Choir</li><li>○ Theater*</li><li>○ School-sponsored/board approved club</li></ul></li><li>● Students will need club advisor/director to verify satisfactory participation</li></ul> <p>*If a student is using non-school sponsored athletics or theater, they will need to complete a verification form signed by the coach/director.</p>	

**Community Service Seal**

*Complete a community service project aligned with the guidelines by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.*

During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can:

- Complete 120 community service hours over 4 years

OR

- Complete 40 community service hours during senior year
  - Pro-rated to 20 hours for seniors who move in January of their senior year
- At least 50% of a student's hours need to be in one concentrated field
- Student will complete a form that logs hours, describes service and has verification signature(s)
