

Correct Way to Cross the Street

- Children should always stop at the curb or the edge of the road and look left, then right, and then left again before crossing.
- They should continue looking in this manner until they are safely across.
- If students' vision is blocked by a parked car or other obstacle, they should move out to where drivers can see them and they can see other vehicles -- then stop, and look left-right-left again.

Dress Code and Valuables

Children will be very active throughout the day. They will be going outside, sitting on the floor, painting, and learning through play, which means playdough and glue; therefore, make sure your child has dressed appropriately. This includes:

Comfortable clothing, which is easy to put on and take off (for easier toileting).



Comfortable shoes, preferably sneakers. Heels, open-toed, flip-flops, jelly, or platform shoes are not recommended.

Please send your child to school with clothing appropriate for the weather/season (i.e., coat, hat, gloves, and socks during the winter months). Parents are required to provide the child's teacher with at least one complete change of clothing (labeled with the child's name or initials). Clothing should be switched based on the season.

Please do not send toys of any kind to school. Teachers will notify parents when children can bring in toys, books, etc., from home. Toy guns or any toy weapons (i.e., swords, knives, etc.) are NOT permitted at any time.
