





#### NORTH POINT HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT REQUEST FORM

If you are completing this form prior to the school year starting transcripts, supplemental forms and recommendation letters will be completed upon your counselor's return in August. It is the student's responsibility to pick up the requested transcripts from the main office or counseling suite. Students must give the counseling office a minimum of seven school days to complete their transcript requests (Request that require additional forms/paperwork may take more time). It is the student's responsibility to pick up the requested transcripts from the main office or Student Services Suite.

### TRANSCRIPT REQUEST

- Since our return from Covid, changes in admissions policies at universities and colleges resulted in several secondary institutions accepting/preferring electronic transcripts. As a result, CCPS revised the policy for electronic transcripts.
- Electronic transcripts will be sent without charge. Electronic transcript will be sent one time only.

# LETTER(S) OF RECOMMENDATION

- Indicate letter of recommendation request for each school to which you apply, if applicable
- The request must be submitted (7) business days before the deadline
- Provide a resume 'with your request; **Please Note**: If resume' is not submitted on time, your request will be delayed
- It is the student's responsibility to pick up letter(s) of recommendation from your school counselor (mailbox outside their doors)

Please submit ACT/SAT scores to your counselor via email



Mid year Transcript(s) available on or after 2/06/2024 via Synergy



FERPA is a law that regulates the privacy of student education records which include your application and recommendation(s); waiving the FERFA allows counselor access to provide a recommendation on your behalf



Early Application Deadline(s) for October 15<sup>th</sup> schools, request should be submitted to counselor(s) no later than 10/2/2023



Early Application Deadline(s) for November 1<sup>st</sup> schools, request should be submitted to counselor(s) no later than 10/11/2023

Early action is non-binding

- ✓ Apply early
- ✓ Early admission decision
- ✓ Consider acceptance; can wait to commit
- ✓ Apply to other colleges under regular admission
- ✓ Give college decision no later than May 1st

Early decision is binding

- ✓ Apply early to first choice school(s)
- ✓ Admission decision received in advance (**Usually December**)
- ✓ If accepted, agrees to attend and offered a financial aid package
- ✓ Apply to only one college early decision
- ✓ Apply to other colleges under regular admission
- ✓ Send non-refundable deposit well in advance of May 1<sup>st</sup>
- Early decision could affect financial aid at other schools
- Carefully research your school and consider ALL pros and cons
- Please check the schools' individual policies in which you are interested



## THE DANGERS OF FAILING

Semester and final grades are computed by averaging quarterly numerical grades. To graduate, you must earn passing *final* grades in courses needed to fulfill the state requirements

The SSL (Student Service Learning) requirement must be completed. Any senior who has not completed their SSL project by May 2, 2024, will not participate in graduation exercises. Any questions or concerns regarding the SSL requirement, please contact Ms. Wyman in Rm. 2312

You must take/pass all HSA/PARCC Assessment(s): Algebra I, English II, Biology & LSN- Government

If requirements are not met, eligible students can only repeat failed courses which are offered through summer school

If all graduation requirements are met by appropriate summer deadlines, students can participate in summer school graduation exercises and will receive their diploma on TBA.
