## Program Cost

All costs for classes and books are covered by Pontiac School District, as long as students pass all courses with a C or above.

If for any reason students do not pass the course or drop their class, they will have to pay all costs back to Pontiac School District and are unable to continue in the program.



## After Completion of Courses

After completing each course, students will be able to transfer credits to any college or University in the United States. This opportunity will give students a head start on their college credits.

## Admission Requirements

Students from PHS/ITA are selected based on their academics and attendance achievements. Each student will have to maintain a 2.50 average gpa and minimum absences in both High School and College. Students are allowed to take one dual enrollment class per semester.
