# Our Program

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**Accelerated Programs** - The name of our entire department. This includes all of the programs and services from grades K-12 including Quest and Advanced Placement (AP).

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**Highly Capable (HiCap)** - Washington state's official term for any student receiving services for gifted education.

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**Quest** - Specific category of programs within Accelerated Programs in which students receive services. Quest programs are: Full Time Quest (FTQ), Pull Out Quest (POQ), Middle School Quest (MSQ), and K-5 HiCap (K5HC).



# Who is Highly Capable?

Highly Capable is the Washington term for students receiving gifted education.

- Terms that may be used in other states/countries: gifted, gifted & talented, talent pathway, GATE
- A highly capable learner is a student whose needs cannot be met in the general education classroom.

To meet the needs of the highly capable learner, we offer programs that:

- Enrich and extend academic and intellectual skill;
- Stimulate intellectual curiosity, independence and responsibility;
- Accelerate and enrich content to meet student learning needs; and
- Develop advanced critical thinking, communication and collaboration skills through the lens of local and global citizenship

– Grades 2-5  
(5 elementaries)
- Full-time Quest (FTQ)

#### Welcome to Accelerated Program!

Our highly talented Gifted program offers accelerated and enriched educational opportunities to students who have been identified as highly talented. Our programs are designed to meet the needs of our highly talented learners by providing services and instruction beyond the scope of the general education population.

A highly talented learner is defined by the state of Washington as a "student who has been assessed to have superior intellectual ability as demonstrated by one or more, multiple criteria." Our Program uses both cognitive and academic performance data to determine if a student is highly talented/eligible.

We are proud to offer programs and services which are designed to meet the needs of our highly talented learners through:

- Enrichment and extension of academic and intellectual skills
- Broadening of intellectual curiosity, independence and responsibility
- Acceleration and enrichment of content to meet student learning needs and
- Development of student social skills through communication and collaboration skills through the use of host and guest classrooms.

As you explore our website, you will encounter three terms:

- **Accelerated Programs:** The term of this website department. The collection of the programs and services from Grades K-12 including Gifted and Advanced Placement (AP).
- **Highly Qualified (HQT):** The term of state official term for any student meeting criteria for gifted education.
- **Gifted:** Student's eligibility of gifted and/or accelerated programs or other students to receive an accelerated program.

Gifted programs are Full Time (Gifted FTG), Full Day (Gifted PDG), Halfday (Gifted GHD), and Half Day (Gifted).

- To determine eligibility, we use multiple objective criteria
- The evidence we collect includes:
  - Cognitive assessments (CogAT & NNAT)
  - Academic assessments (Fastbridge & Iowa)
  - Additional data may include – State Assessments (SBA, WIDA, WAKids)
- Report cards are not used as a determining factor in consideration of highly capable services
- Eligibility thresholds are published on the Accelerated Programs Website.
