A Character Driven Education

For sixty years, we have placed a high importance on developing the character of our students. We incorporate character qualities into classroom discussions and projects beginning in kindergarten, and by the time our students graduate they possess a strong sense of morality, emotional intelligence, and character.





WHAT SETS PHS APART Our Park-Like Setting

Peninsula Heritage School's park-like setting provides an ideal natural environment for students to learn and grow.

Studies show that regular exposure to nature reduces student stress and increases attention span. Each PHS classroom in our ranch-style buildings opens directly to the outdoors, and students can be quickly immersed in a nature-rich environment. Our PHS faculty extends the classroom to the outdoors by studying the science and then growing plants in our gardens, of enjoying fruit ripening on our trees, and even noting the wintertime vistas of snow-capped mountains from our front school patio. Grassy playgrounds under towering trees surrounded by horse trails provide our students with recess activity and physical education classes in a natural environment that enriches their lives each day at Peninsula Heritage School.

WHAT SETS PHS APART From a PHS Family





PHS has been a wonderful gift to our two children. The individualized experiences and dynamic education provided at PHS have allowed them to flourish in ways that were unavailable in their previous school experiences.

On the outside, it seemed that our son was thriving in our excellent local public school system receiving great marks from teachers and parents alike. However at home, we could see an emotional exhaustion and frustration building inside him, and we feared he was losing his enthusiasm for learning. As we evaluated other options and discovered PHS, we quickly realized that it had a personalized environment more suited to him, with warmth, variety, excitement, and color. He fit in immediately and has never looked back.

A few years later, his elder sister was struggling to find advanced instruction to satisfy her educational needs. Despite the fact that she loved our local community and had a thriving social life in our public school, she was already recognizing the limitations of being an outlier with a deeply inquisitive and advanced intellect. We attended a PHS middle school orientation night and we were overcome by their philosophy and evidence-based approach to educating the middle school student. During her three years at PHS, we have seen her organizational skills blossom, and she now faces high school with focus and enthusiasm, performing well beyond grade level.

Thanks to the PHS community, our children have grown into confident young teens, with the ability to navigate their own educational and social-emotional experiences. The faculty's unwavering commitment to engaging and stimulating the students cannot be replicated elsewhere in our larger South Bay community.

We are so thankful to have given our children the PHS experience.



WHAT SETS PHS APART OUR MUSIC Program

The sound of music is often heard in the classrooms and corridors of Peninsula Heritage School, under the direction of Mr. Charley Miller, our music teacher.

Our music classes improve self-confidence, enhance brain development, and provide opportunities for creativity and emotional expression. Our students acquire self-control and enjoy the opportunity to work together as a team. We offer children the opportunity to learn music naturally by providing many types of instruments at age-appropriate levels. For instance, Kindergarteners naturally enjoy singing, which is augmented by learning handbells and "Boomwhackers" - lengths of plastic pipe that produce different notes.

As PHS students advance through the grades, the type and number of musical instruments increase, as well as the depth of the musical instruction and theory. In 1st and 2nd Grades, keyboards, xylophones, and "bucket drumming" are offered. Recorders and ukuleles are introduced in 2nd Grade, and the study of these instruments continues throughout the grades. With the 5th Graders' social studies' focus on the American colonial period, these students learn the musical instruments of that era as well as the many songs featured in their theatrical production of "History Comes Alive!" Our 4th through 8th Graders enjoy a study of the artists and music of the 1960s, '70s, and '80s. Along with ukuleles, our Middle School students also study guitar.

The pleasure of studying and creating music is evident throughout our music program, creating a foundation for life-long enjoyment of this creative expression.



WHAT SETS PHS APART Reading Workshop

Peninsula Heritage School's language arts curriculum includes the Reading Workshop program developed by literacy specialist Lucy Calkins at the Teachers College, Columbia University. Mrs. Eileen Mahoney, 6th and 7th Grade Language Arts teacher, shares how the reading program revolves around books centered on students' interests.

"At the start of the academic year," Mrs. Mahoney explains, "I determine the pulse of what interests our 6th and 7th Graders through 'Speed Dating' with books. Each student spends four minutes 'dating' a book, and within one class period, they are introduced to all types of literary genres. From several sessions of this experience, I can choose our mentor (or core) books for the year.

In addition to their mentor books, which they read and discuss as a class and use in creating their literary essays, each student is reading a book they have selected for their Book Club, which meets every Tuesday and Friday during class. There may be two Books Clubs meeting simultaneously, or as many as five Clubs during a class. Each student has a "job" in the Club, which directs their preparation, such as Discussion Director, Connector (connecting the book with the outside world), Illustrator (drawing and coloring a scene from the book), Literary Luminary (locating passages they found moving or that support the book's themes), Summarizer, and others.

"Their literary experiences here at PHS offer them both mirrors of their own lives as well as windows into so many other worlds. By offering our students opportunities to choose books that personally interest them," concludes Mrs. Mahoney, **"we are developing individuals who have all the literary skills to be lifelong readers!**"



WHAT SETS PHS APART Performing Arts

"Every student at Peninsula Heritage School is a star!" declares Ms. Deb Wilcox, PHS Performing Arts teacher. "Just like the stars in the sky – each one is unique and beautiful. The same sentiment applies to our PHS students. In my seventeen years at PHS, I have seen each individual child shine as a performer and discover their unique strengths, skills, and facets of their individuality along the way."

"During the school year," continues Ms. Deb, "each grade level has an opportunity to explore one of our six Character Qualities: Caring, Attitude, Respect, Gratitude, Perseverance and Self-Control. During rehearsal, we really put the character qualities to work, by learning a song and choreography and memorizing dialogue. These qualities, combined with our musical themes, merge and make up a one-of-a-kind show for each grade level. On the day of the assembly, our amphitheater is full of friends and family, and our student performers are in their costumes backstage feeling 100% comfortable, confident, and ready to perform."

"This past year, our school's 60th Anniversary Celebration inspired the theme for our grade level assembly performances. We walked down memory lane starting with the decade of the 1960s and continued to the present day, sharing each decade through spoken word, song and dance. In other years, we have focused on a variety of musical genres. The diverse nature of our themes broadens the students' minds and introduces them to theatre, history, and a plethora of styles of music and movement."

"The Performing Arts Program at PHS," concludes Ms. Wilcox, "is an all-encompassing experience that gives our shining stars a chance to express themselves, share ideas, and celebrate their personality. **These experiences enrich and nurture our student's personal growth and instill the values that will be their tickets for success in their future.**
