Inside Our Classrooms

The Hive This week has been very exciting for The Hive. Most importantly, we welcomed our new pupil, Hugo. On Wednesday we joined Warriors Class for a trip to Haywards Heath train station and we travelled on the train to Burgess Hill and back. We have been learning about different plants and trees, as well as starting fractions in Maths.

Thinkers This week started with the circus coming to town! The children dressed as different circus performers and have been practising their circus skills. Later in the week, the children were able to use 'sparkly' descriptive words to make their own version of our text "You see a..., I see a...!" They also made a clown's body with their year 6 buddies by cutting out each others colourful hand prints.

Inventors This week Inventors welcomed our new focus, 'Stories in Secret Places'. Our focus links to English, Geography, Science and Art and they are so excited to look at our new book 'The Secret Garden' next week. In English, Inventors started the week by listening to five different sounds. When listening to the sounds, they thought about powerful adjectives to describe the noun and a suitable verb. Once they had these words, they turned them into short poems. Inventors thought of some brilliant poems such as "The relaxing sun was shining". They then performed their poem to a friend. Inventors attended their first swimming session this week and achieved a whole class 'Golden Certificate' for being respectful, determined and independent swimmers. They are looking forward to next week!

Explorers have been writing diaries from the perspective of Captain Cook or a crew member whilst on the 'Voyage of Discovery' on board the Endeavour in 1770. We used tea staining to create authentic looking scrolls to publish our diary entries. We have been focusing on fractions in Maths and finding half of a shape, object and amount. In Science we have started observing plants, naming the parts of plants and trees and describing the job of each part. Warriors Year 3 have come back to arrive ready in the Warriors Train Station waiting room to start our topic about the railways. We had a trip to see Haywards Heath Station in action—counting the trains, seeing what was on the platform and learning how to stay safe before getting on the train to Burgess Hill and back. Away from trains, we have started looking at fractions, understanding that a fraction is part of a whole and which part is the denominator and the numerator; located key coastal areas of the UK and understood what a coast is; looked at the importance of text and images in signs and finally, we finished our tennis unit with a mini doubles tournament!

Ground-breakers have made a great start to the summer term, bringing in some fabulous Maya mask creations from home which are now watching over the Key Stage 2 area! Creative poetry has been the order of the day, with a Write Inspired project focused mainly around the theme of Sun. In art, we have been weaving some intricate 'Gods' eyes' with different coloured wool.

Innovators have started summer term focus on Crime and Punishment by using art to create ideas for our 'Trapped' Write Inspired project. We have discussed what crimes and punishments we know of today, along with the importance of rules and whether we would like to come to a school without any! In maths, we have started apply our fractions knowledge to decimals. It's great to be outside for our PE lessons and we are very excited to be learning a new sport - lacrosse!

Trailblazers are preparing for their up and coming end of primary school assessments. Mrs. Jago is so proud of their hard work and positive attitudes. We are beginning a new science area of study: Living things and their habitats. They are choosing the living creature that they are about to do an in-depth project on. In art, they have started their self portraits and in PE they have been getting into the swing of summer with a bit of cricket practice! We are also pleased to welcome back Mrs. Thomas and to have Mrs. Allen joining us on a Wednesday!

FOCUS on

<u>Readina</u>

At Blackthorns, we value reading as a journey to explore infinite possibilities. This begins in when our children join us in reception, where we aim to promote curiosity and prompt the desire to become an accomplished reader. Through phonics, we introduce the signs and symbols of the written language and books linked to each child's stage of learning help them to develop their confidence.

Tailoring book choices to individual needs continues as they move through the school, as children learn their ZPD (Zone of Proximal Development) score from Year 2 onwards. This gives them a number range and they can select from all the books that have been organised by these scores. However, we do not restrict their choice to books in their zone, because we want the children to be engaged and excited whatever they might choose to read. Once they have read the books, children can take an Accelerated Reader guiz which gives them and us an indication of their understanding.

Quizzes also record the number of words they have read in the book and their scores. In school we celebrate children scoring 100% on a quiz with our 100% Heroes posters and children reading over 1 million words are also given certificates to celebrate such a fantastic achievement.
