Inventors wrote in first person, as if they were Anastasia Armitage and thoroughly enjoyed thanking Uncle Cosmo for his kindness. They loved learning all about different animals and were also brave enough to gently hold Giant African Snails, a very tickly Millipede and even Daffodil, the American Corn Snake. An animal encounter experience 'ZooLab' brought some amazing animals for us to learn about and we had a chance to hold some of the creatures. We have also visited 'The Pond of Truth' in English, and created metaphorical poems linked to the Aboriginal Dreamtime creation stories.
