A MESSAGE FROM THE MIDDLE SCHOOL PRINCIPALS

We have had a great start to the 22-23 school year thanks to the work of your students, Mead staff, and parent/guardian support. In an effort to do our best partnering with our community, the middle school admin teams would like to remind families the most efficient way to solve any problems that may arise during the school year.

As part of a district-wide administrative group, we collectively work to make sure our students get the highest quality education we can provide. It's not uncommon for families to have questions or want to gain a deeper understanding of the curriculum and instructional materials their child's teachers are using. Additionally, it is imperative that our teachers and administrators are able to work together with our families through processes defined by Board policies to be able to review materials and address any concerns that arise.

As shared by district administration at the September 12th school board meeting, when concerns arise in the classroom, the first step for parents/guardians is to contact the child's teacher to work through resolving an issue. If communication or meetings between the teacher and parent/guardian do not resolve the concern, the next step is to contact the school's grade level administrator or the principal. From there, if the concern remains unresolved after contact with the principal, the District's Director of Secondary Education Darren Nelson should be contacted to bring all parties together to discuss a plan for resolution. Working through this process will ensure that parents/guardians have the tools and opportunity to be heard.
