Third debate, resolved that the electoral college be abolished.

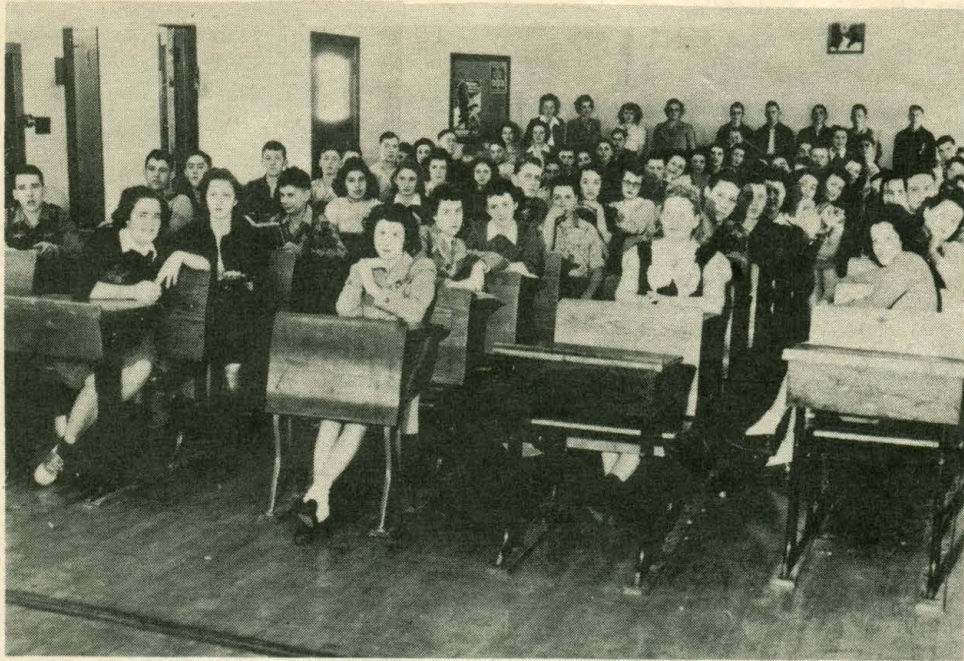
Fourth debate, resolved that any high school should have a student council.

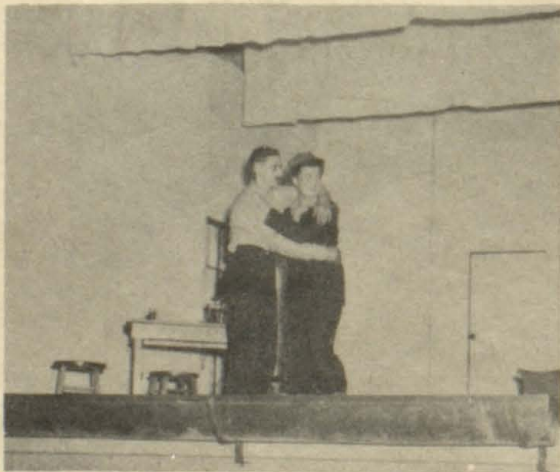

Homemaking I class has done several projects on different sources. They have spent most of their year sewing cotton garments.

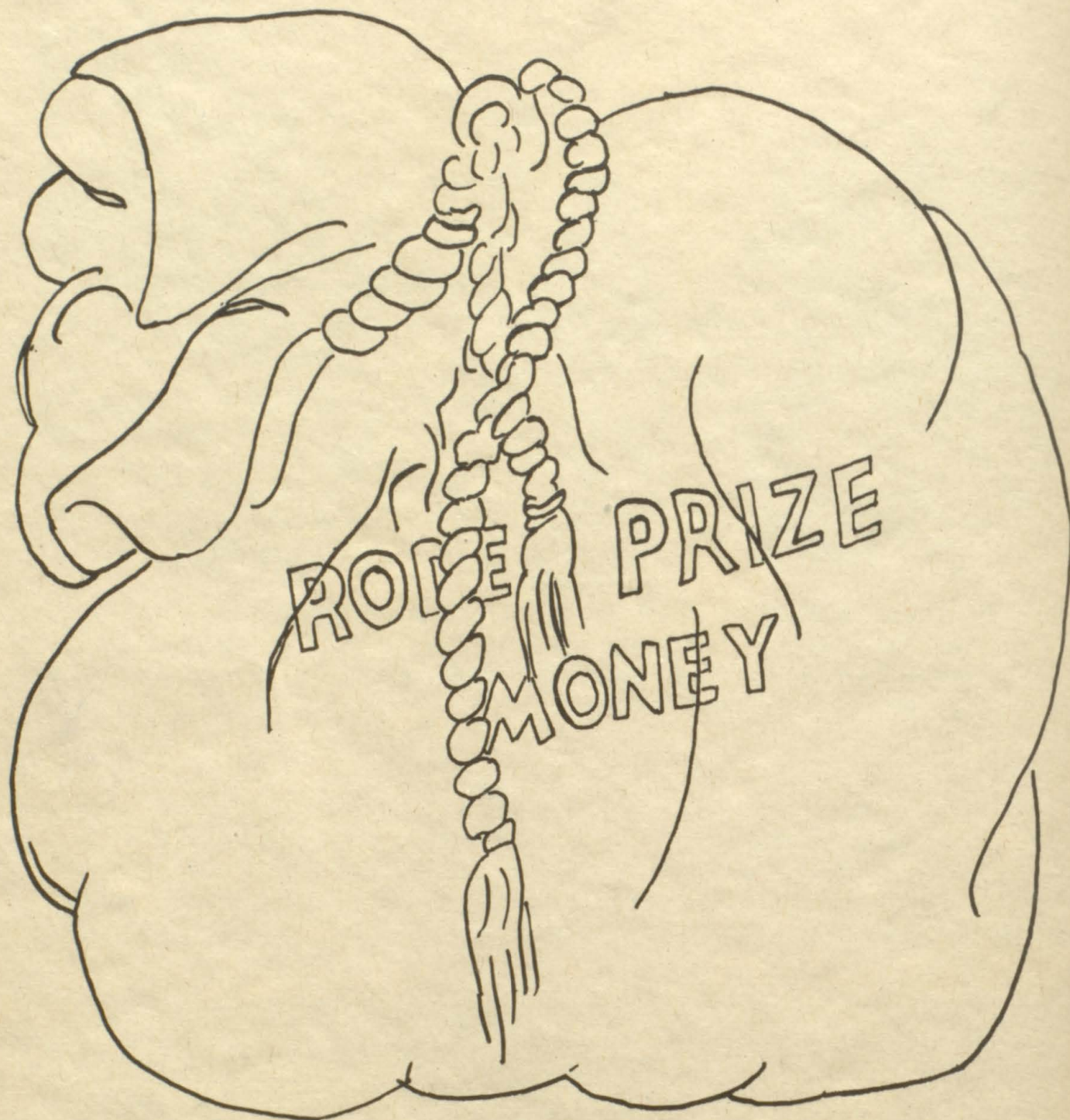
Homemaking II class had a unit on canning and food preservation. They had a luncheon unit judging on the results. During the second semester they made garments for themselves.

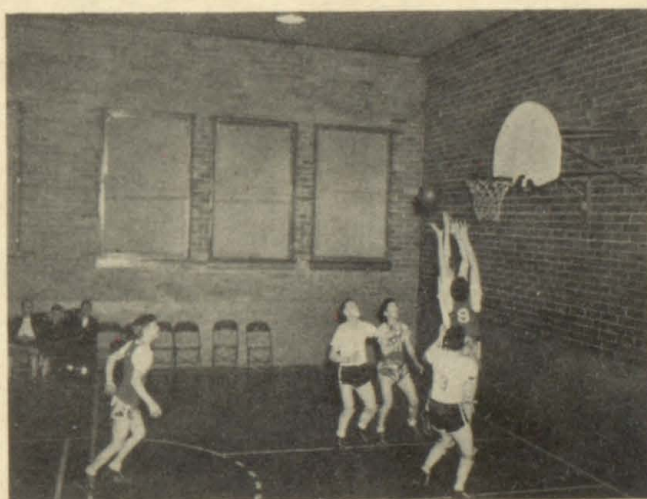

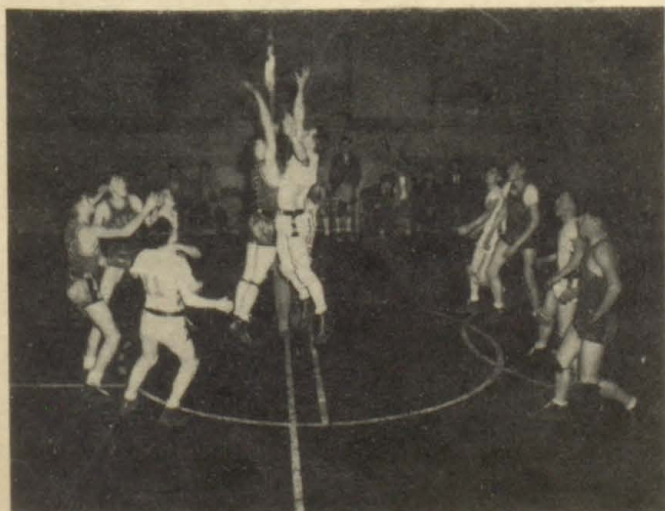

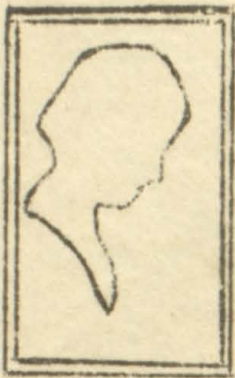
