Annette's little feet she leaves to Russell and her love for school to Carolyn.

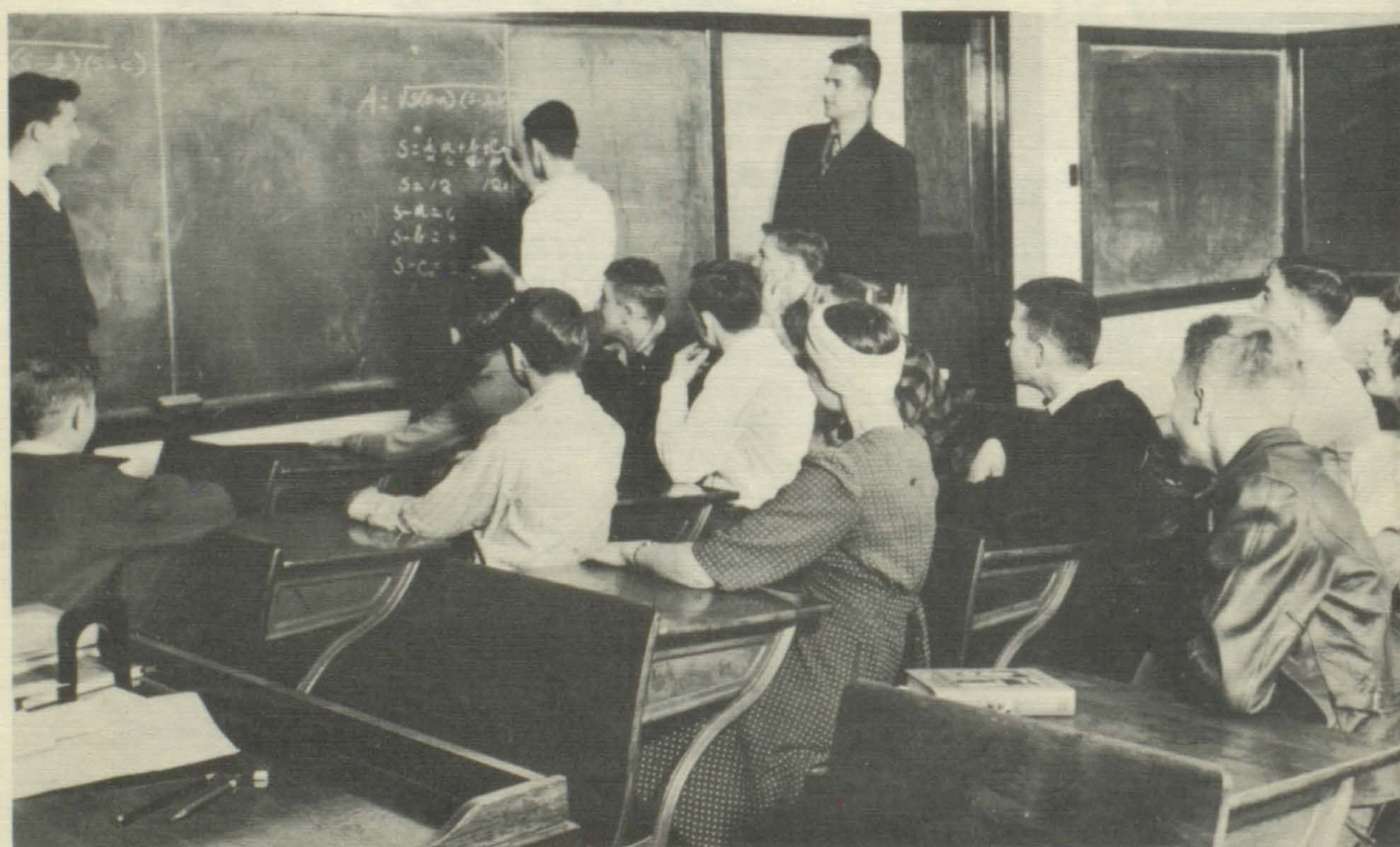

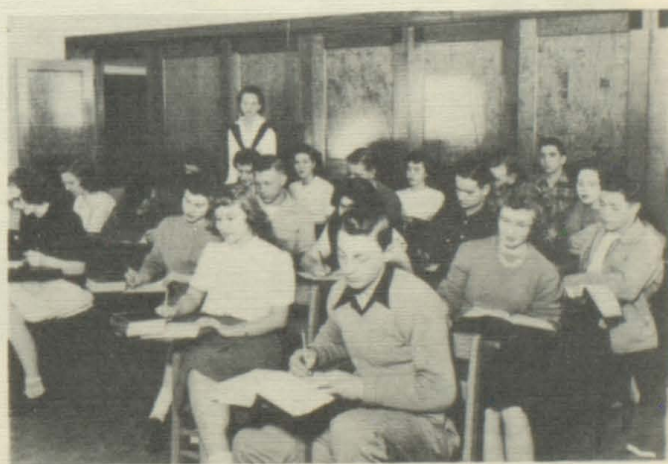
