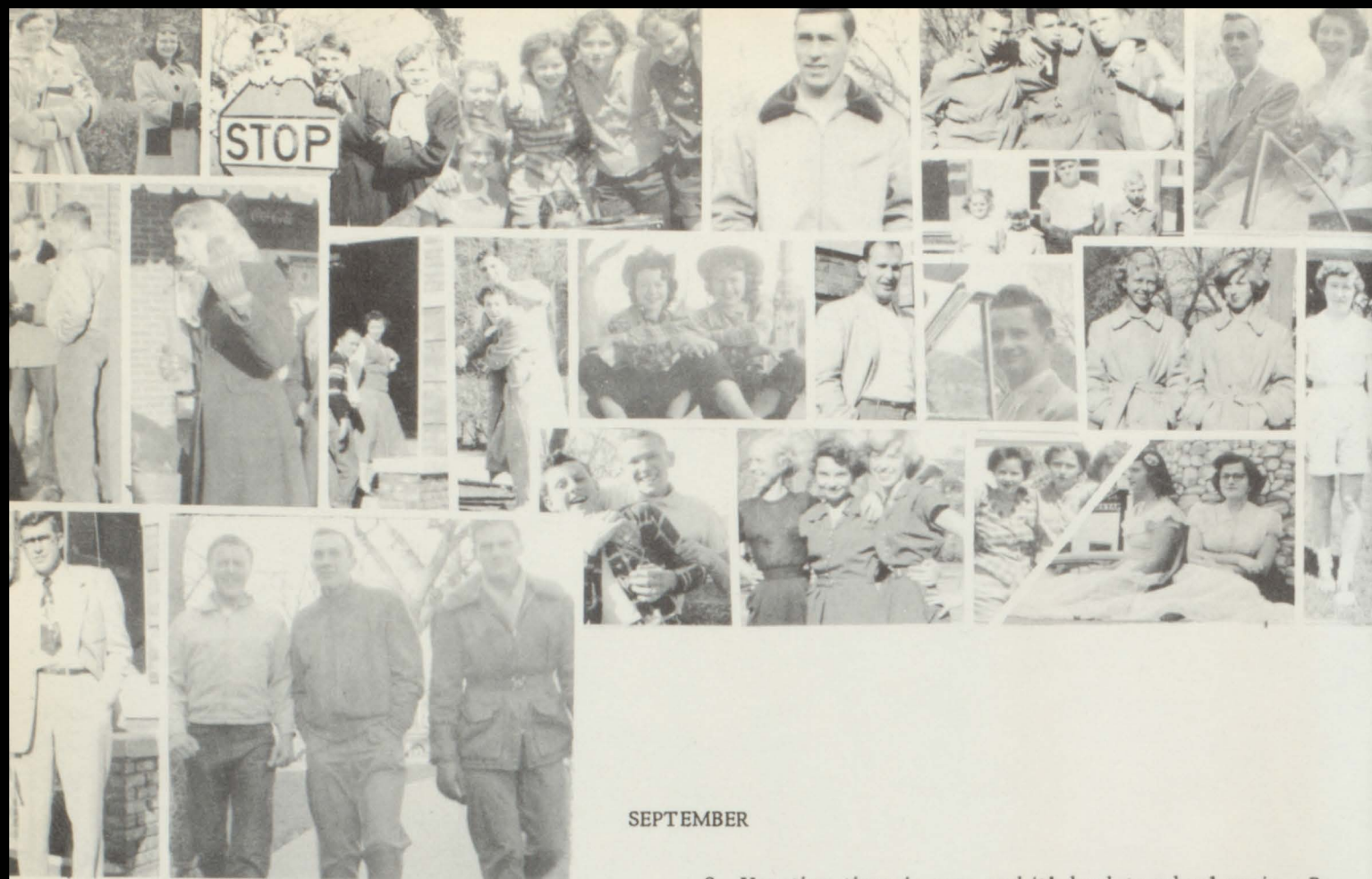
FIRST PRIZE FLOAT: The senior class float, a huge gilded crown with the theme "Pointers Will Reign" won first prize.
