Homecoming



With the theme of the heavenly universe adorning the stage, the homecoming festivities of 1960 began. The sounding notes of the Fanfare by the ensemble announced the official reading of the scroll by the Herald, Valerie Hladky, proclaiming the King and Queen to be Gary Molzen and Lynne Chaussee. The first strains of the "Coronation March" were struck by Lynn Olson and Margaret Bailey, thus starting the Royal Procession. An enormous crowd stood to greet the new King and Queen, who were preceded by the Queen's flower girls, Jane Hammitt and Gloria Hanson, and the crown bearers, Craig Guillaume and Pat Chicoine. The Queen's train was carried by Sidney Milburn and Danny Sullivan.

With impressive splendor the royal pair marched slowly toward the stage, followed by their Senior attendants: Helen Bihlmeyer and James Walsh; Betty Tramp and Gary Eslick.
