Foreword

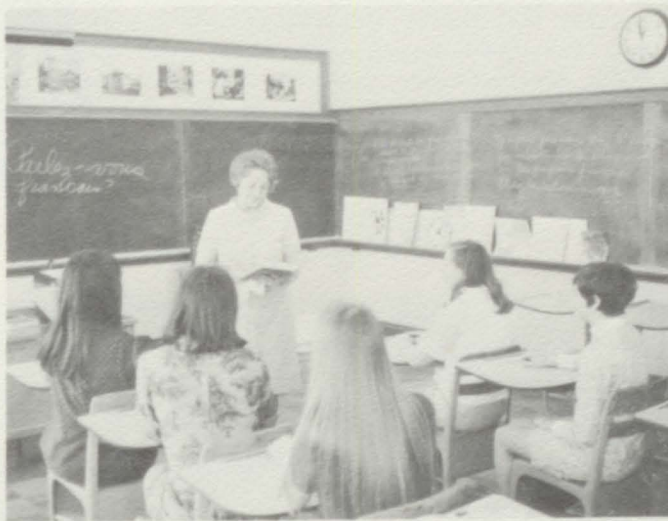

SENIORS PRESENT "CHEAPER BY THE DOZEN"



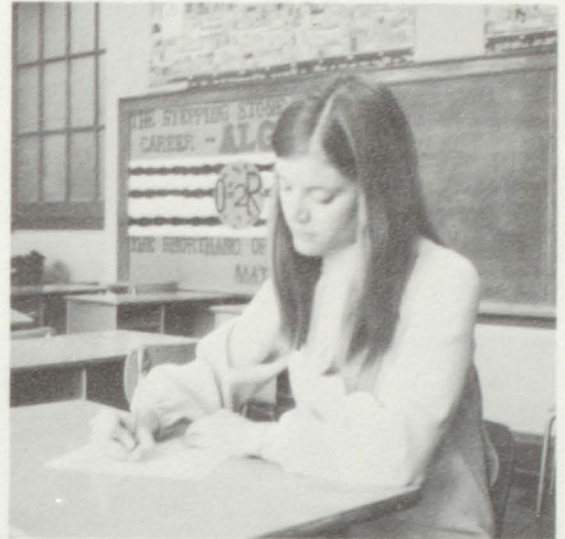
