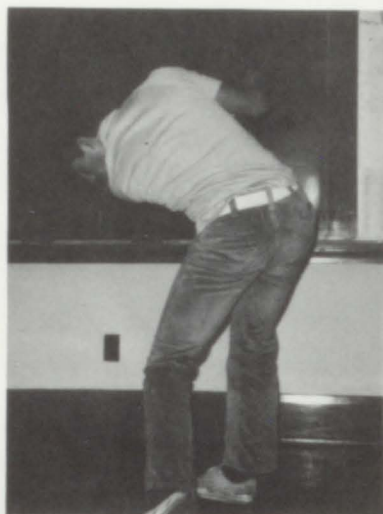
The Travels of Learning

Of these courses offered, Contemporary Biology is a new course offered, aimed to satisfy the need of non-scientific, non-college bound students. It deals with the common experiences of biology: Those aspects which are of daily importance.

During the year Mr. Jacobsen took his students on field trips and had outside speakers. New texts used were MODERN BIOLOGY, BIOLOGICAL SCIENCE: PATTERNS & PROCESS.

Biology students, G. Talbott, D. Hoffman, D. Geary, and C. Haines are experimenting with chickens in Contemporary Biology.



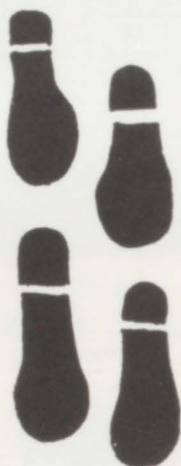
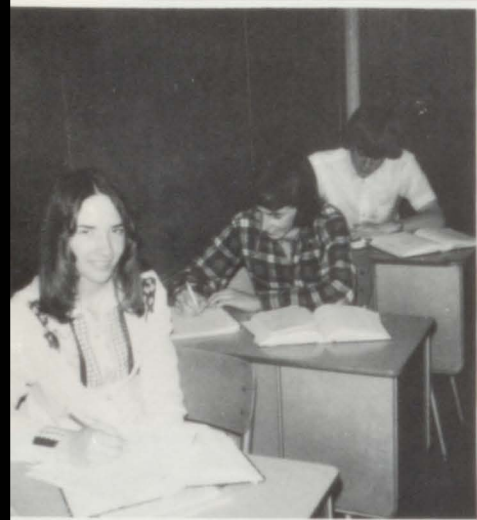


OOPS! WE MADE A BOO-BOO

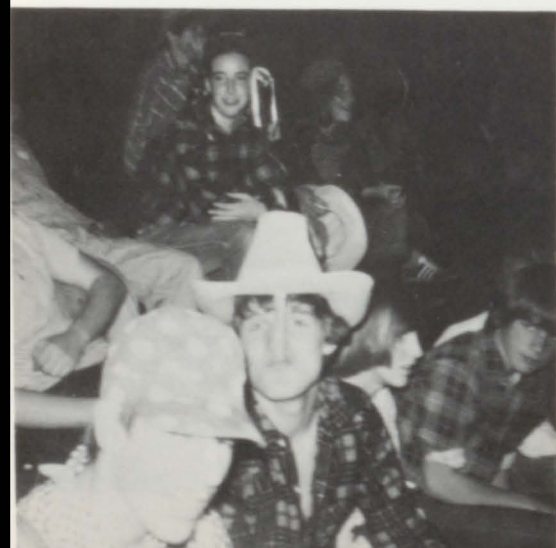

Art and Home Ec Collaborate for Show

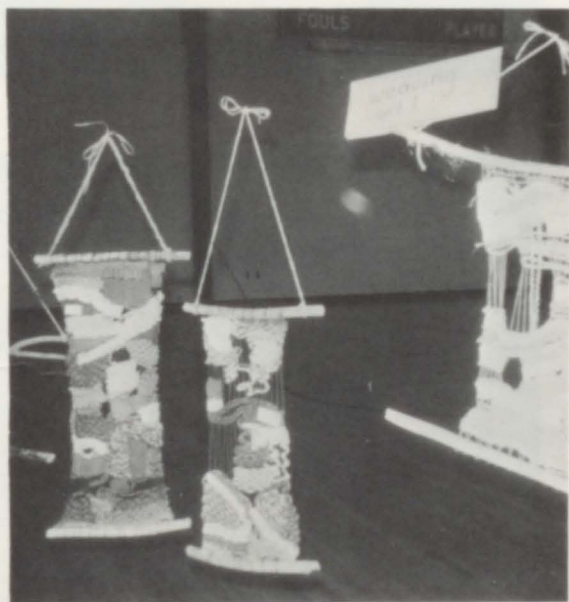

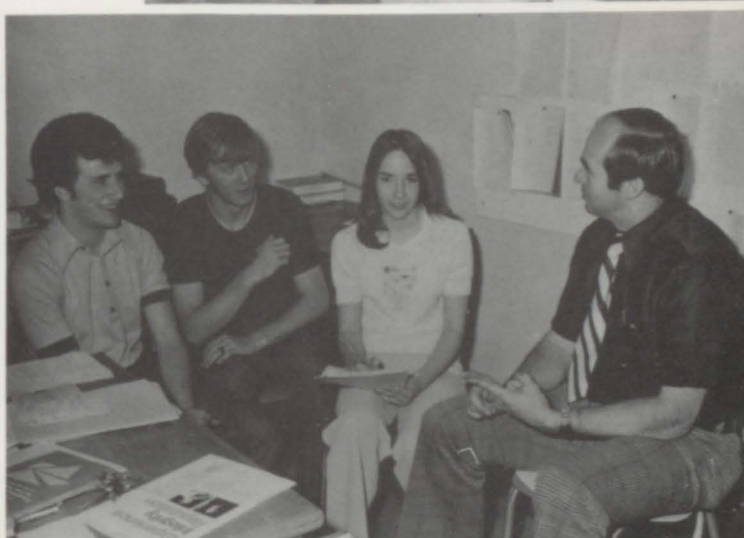

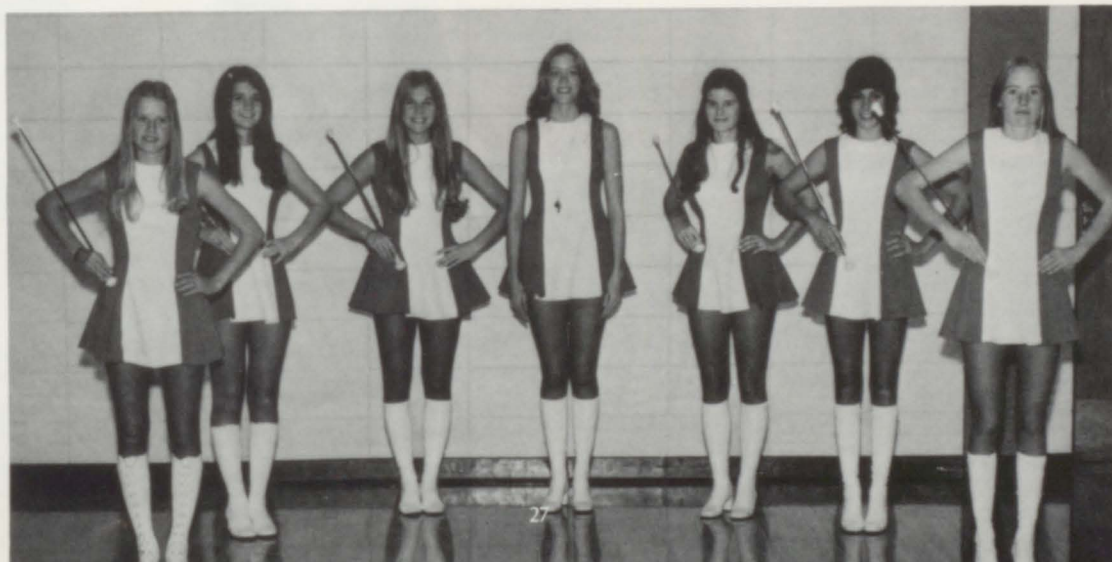

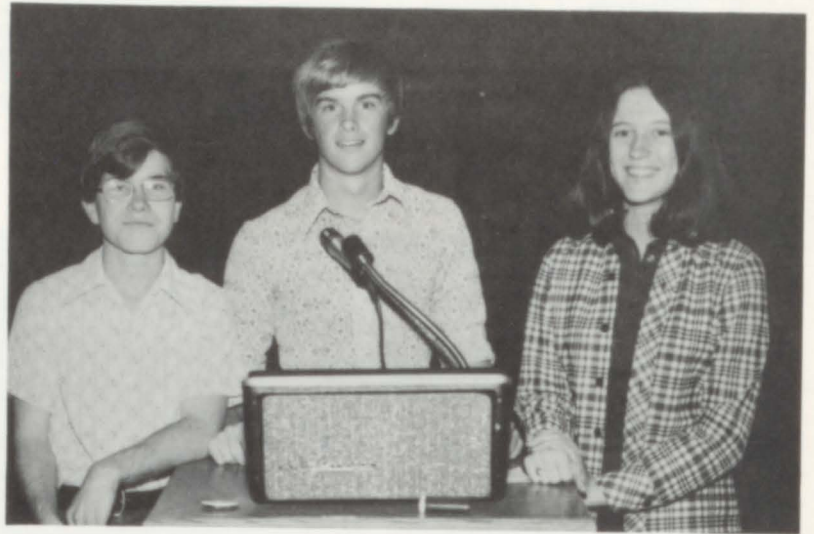

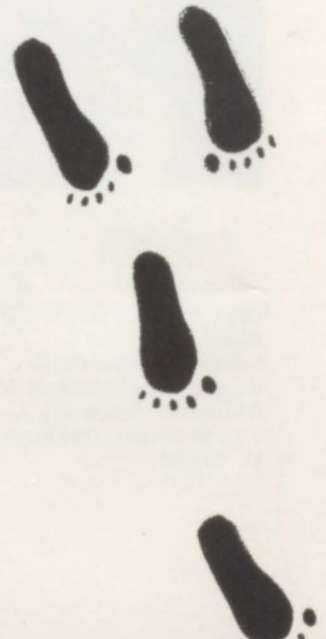
Special events were held during the year also. SDSU held a one day clinic for journalists, and a bake sale was held to finance the assistant editors' fee to camp.

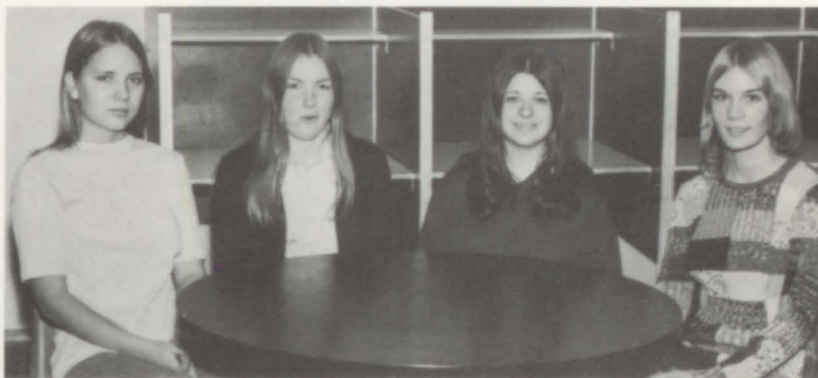

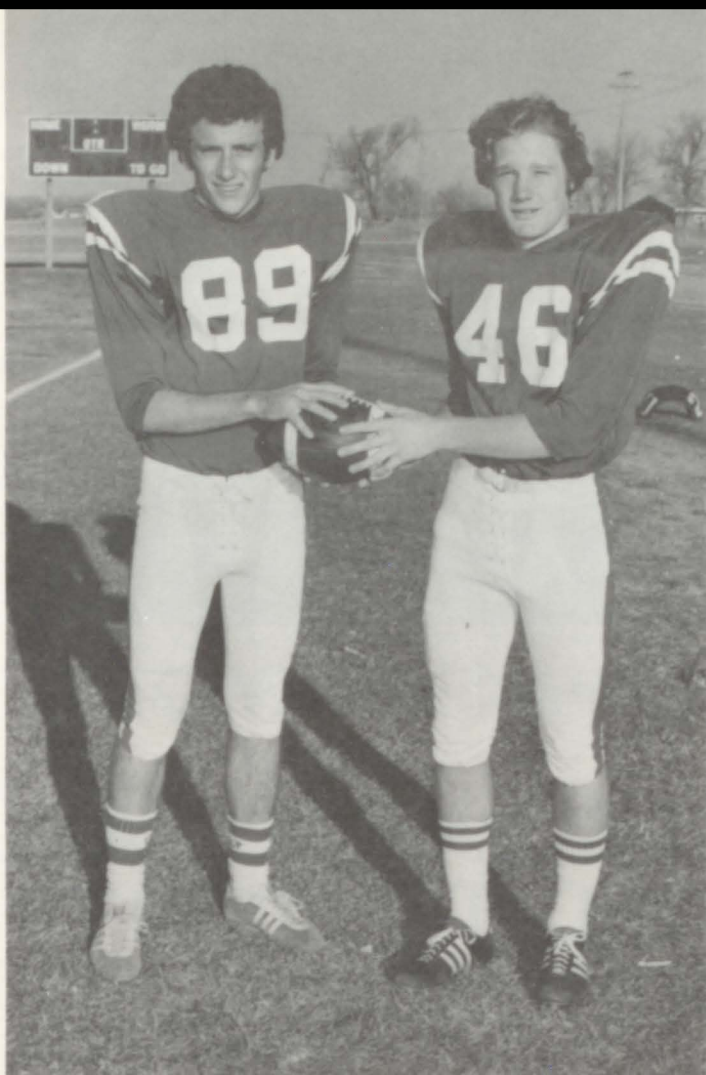

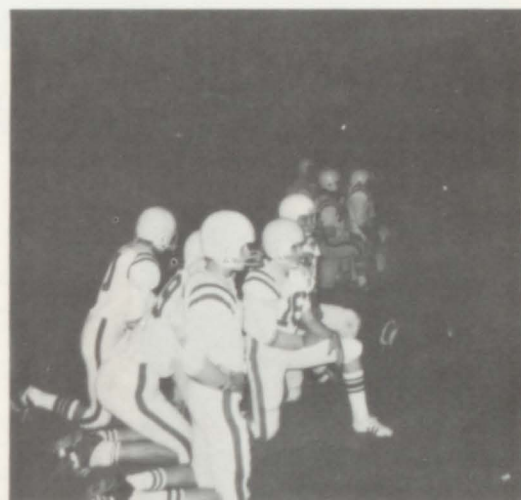

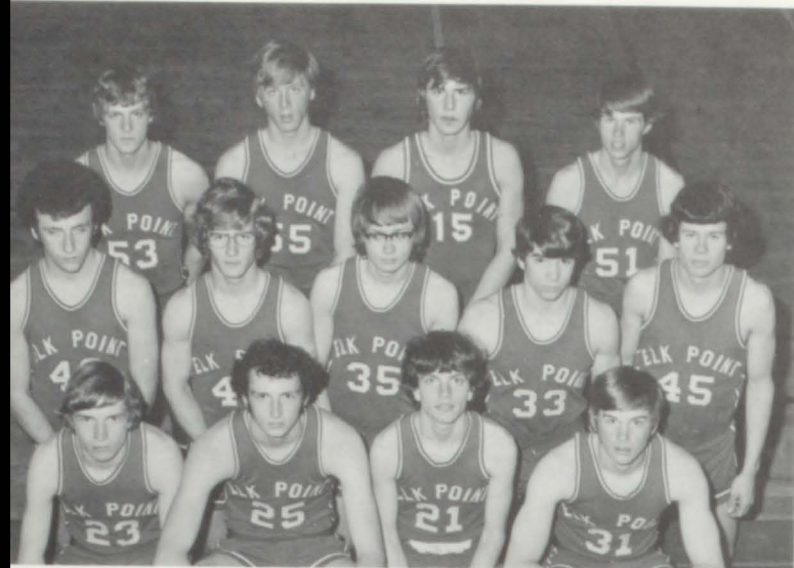

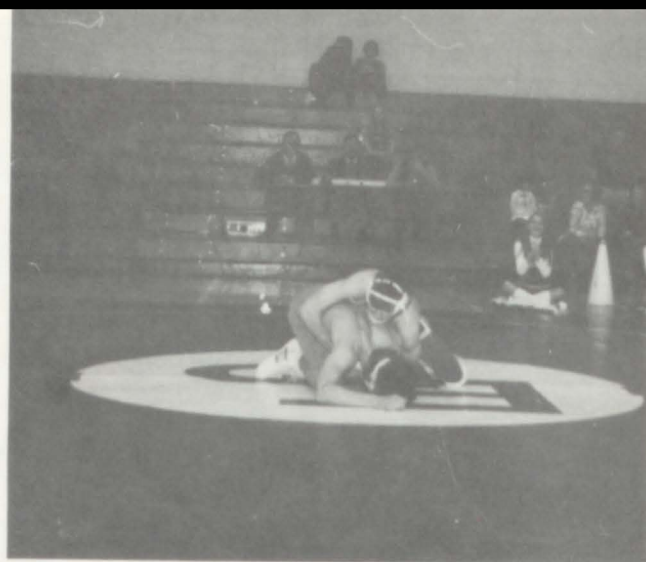

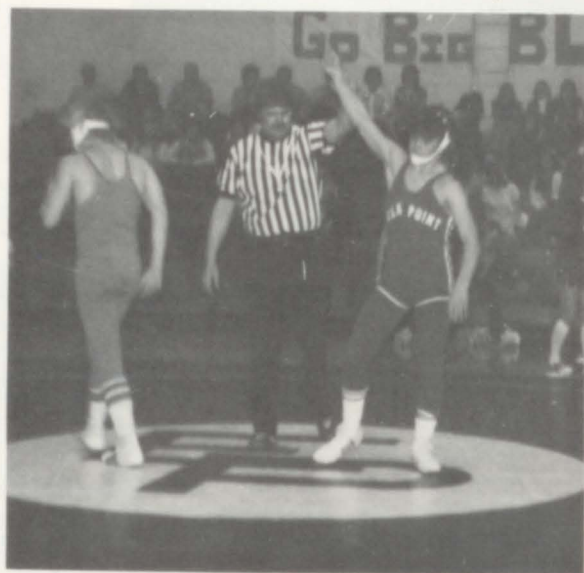

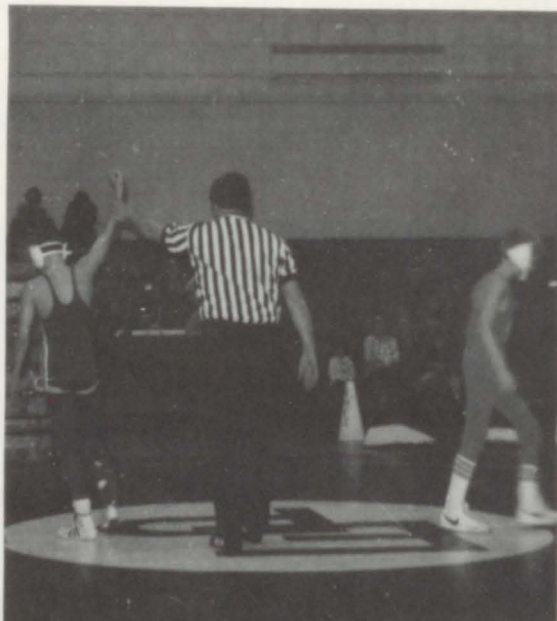

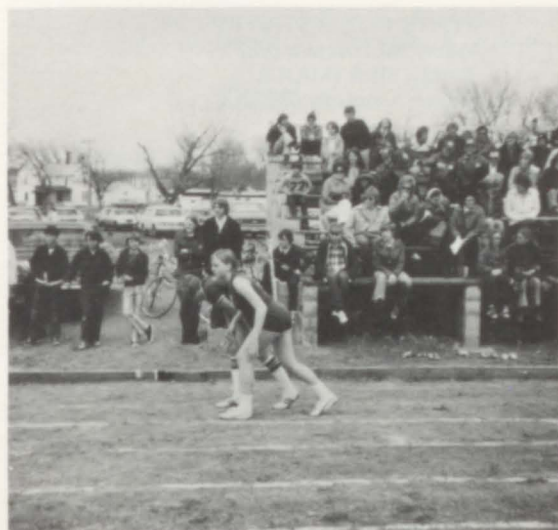

Chosen were Varsity football squad, Varsity Basketball, and Wrestling, Junior Varsity Basketball.

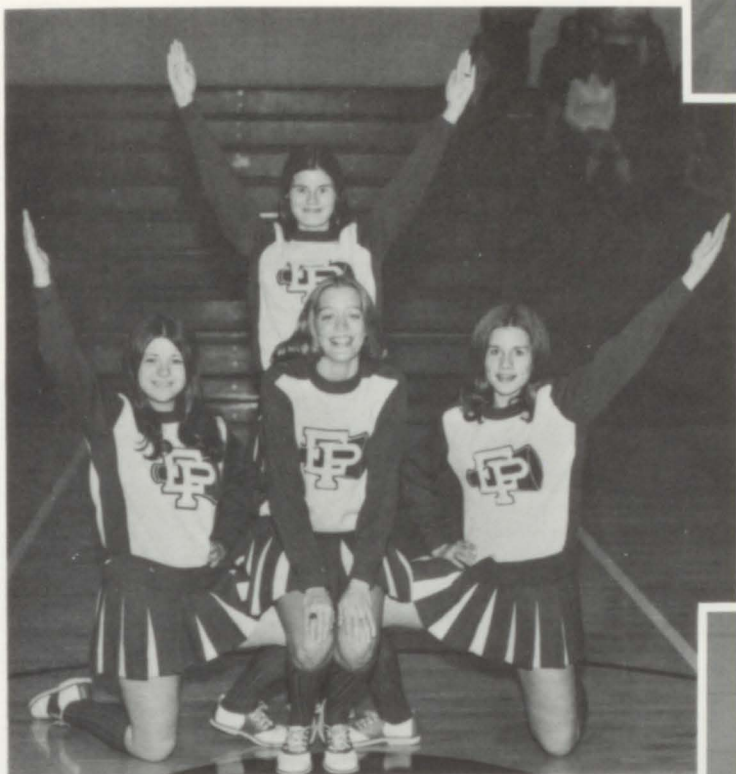
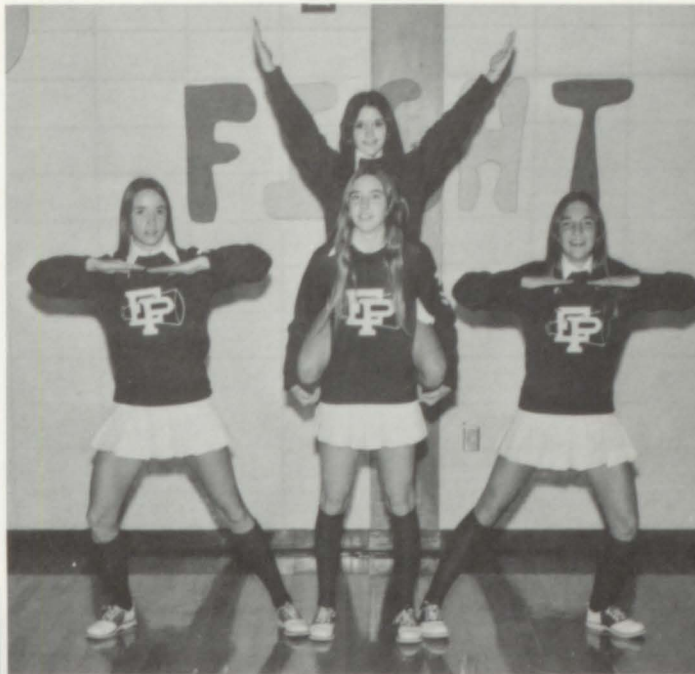
Their purpose is to promote and uphold school spirit, to develop a sense of good sportsmanship among the stu-

dents, and to better relationships between schools during all athletic events. To raise money for new uniforms, the cheerleaders held bake sales, car washes and dances.

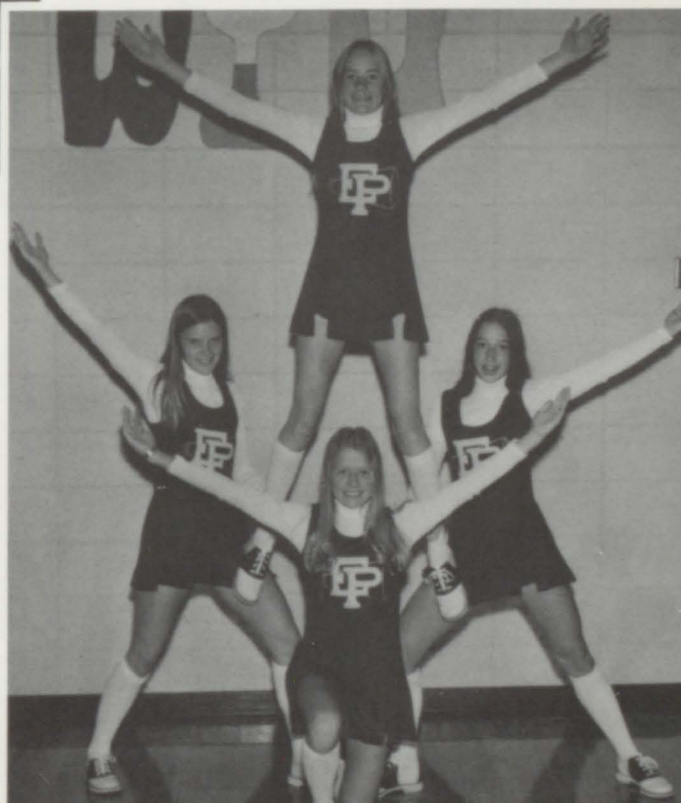
