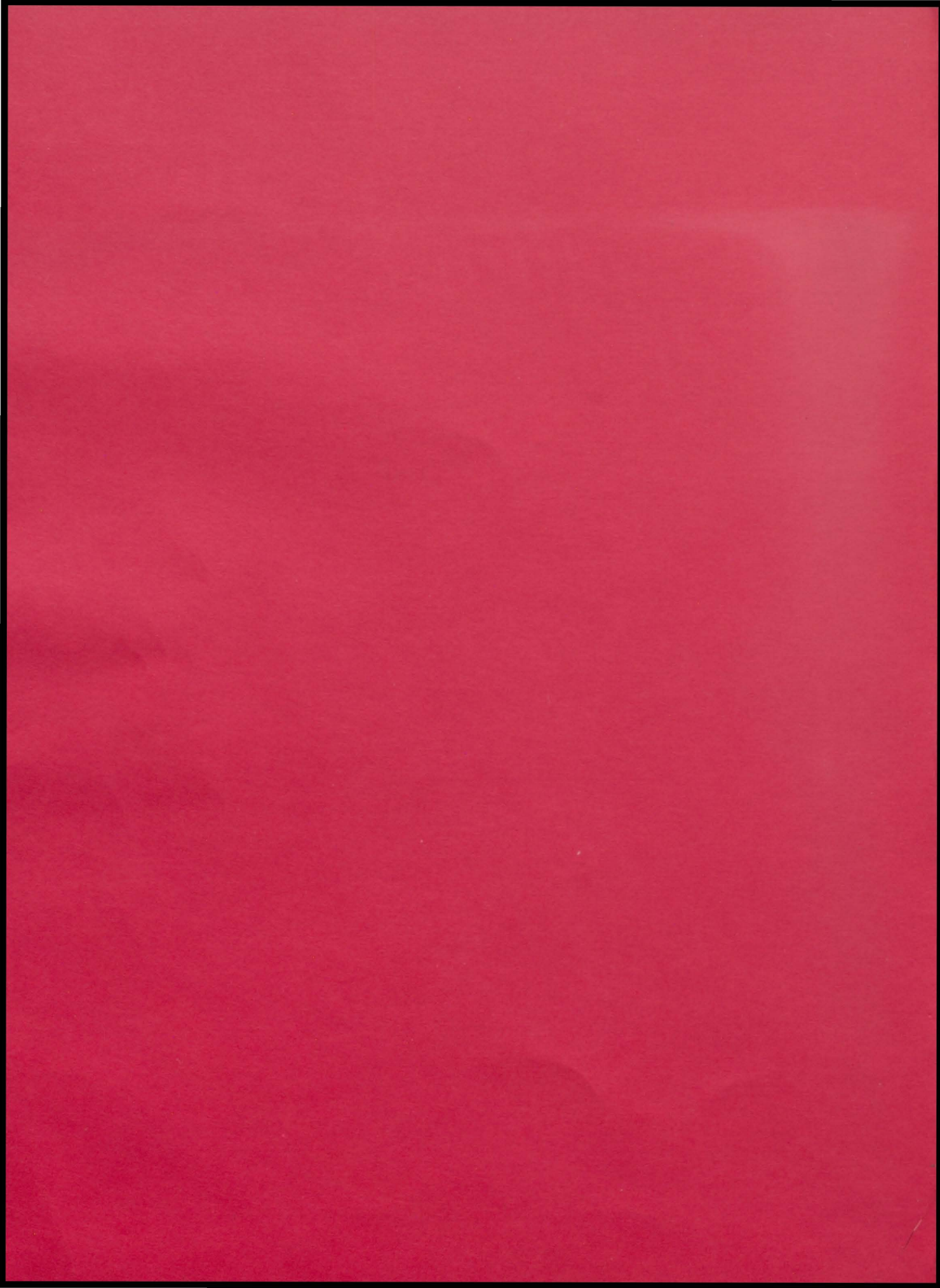

Elk Point High on the outside is a simple rural community school. Once inside you feel enthusiasm, warmth, and intensity. In short the students are what make EPHS fabulous.

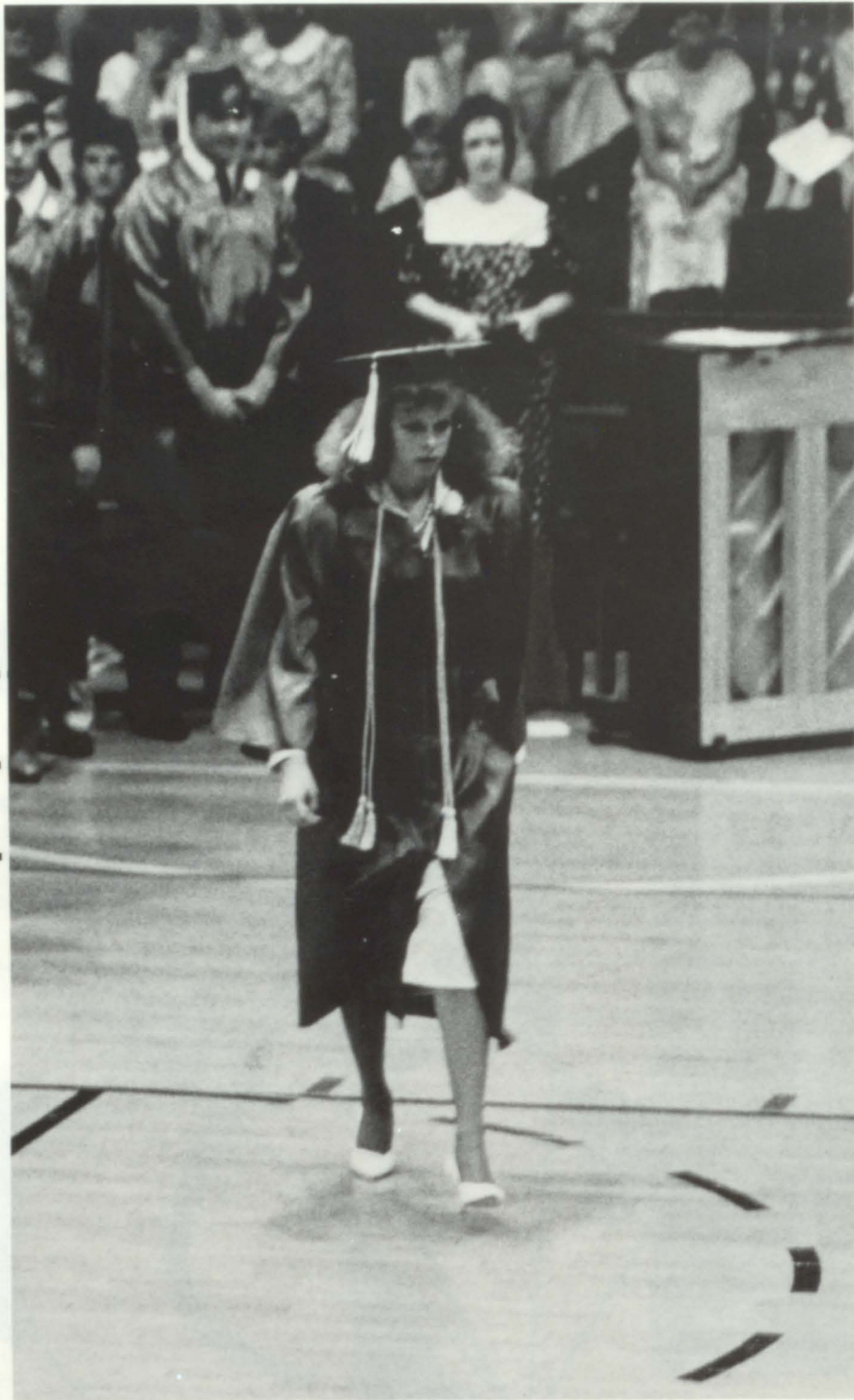

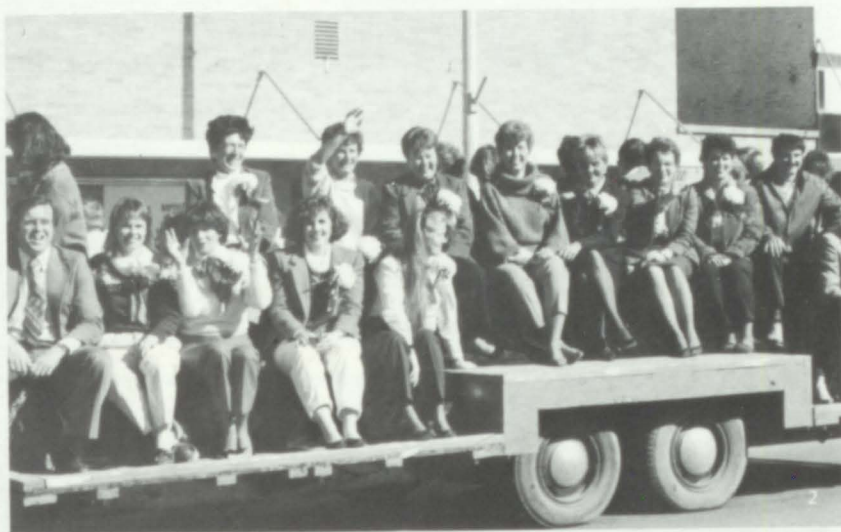

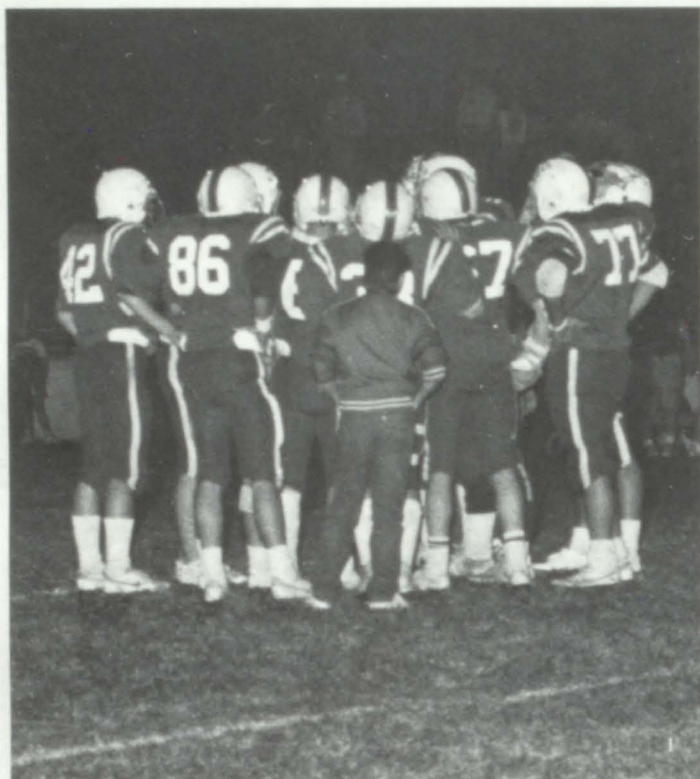

No. 1 Goal is Playoffs

The 1985 football team had a goal, that goal was to make the playoffs. With a victory over the Jefferson Blackhawks in late October, the Pointers reached that goal. The victory over Jefferson was a great team effort and one of the high points of the '85 season. Individually, the Pointers were led by the "Big Eight" leading passer, Steve Curry, who threw for over 1000 yards. On the receiving end was another conference leader, Allen LaBrune, who had 571 total yards in 37 catches. The ground attack was led by Sean George who finish-

ed the year with 416 total yards. The defense was anchored by Bill Klunder with 74 tackles, Charles Rosenbaum with 68 tackles, and Jason Quam with 64 tackles. The secondary was led by Thad Burnight who had 2 interceptions and 37 tackles. We say good-bye to 15 seniors who will be hard to replace, but we do have a lot of players that gained valuable experience. If we stay away from the injuries and set our goals a little higher during 1986, good things will be in our future.

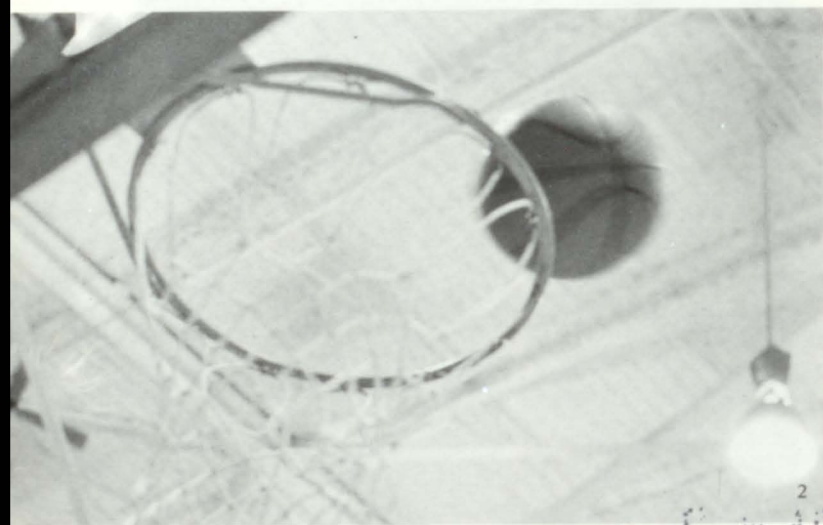
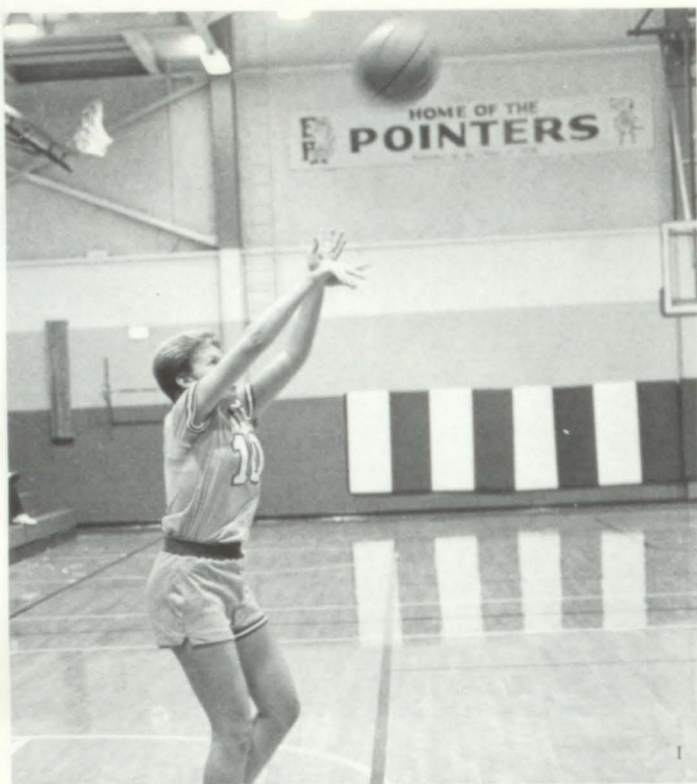

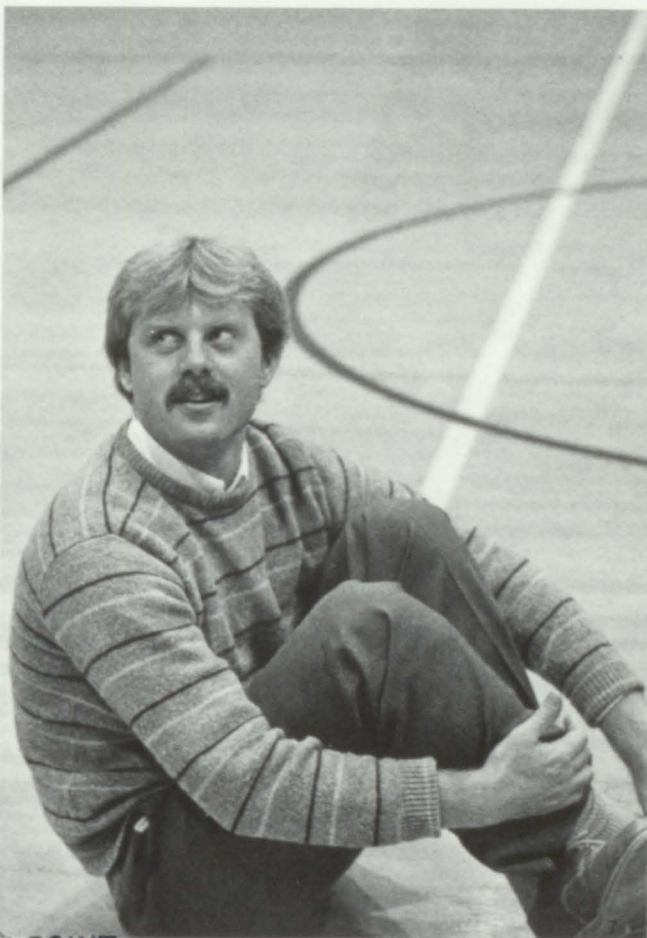
Nelson, and Kristie Rosenbaum, sophomores — Michelle Cody and freshman — Amy Fullenkamp.

At the Big Sioux Tournament Larry S. captured 3rd place and Sean G. finished in 4th place.

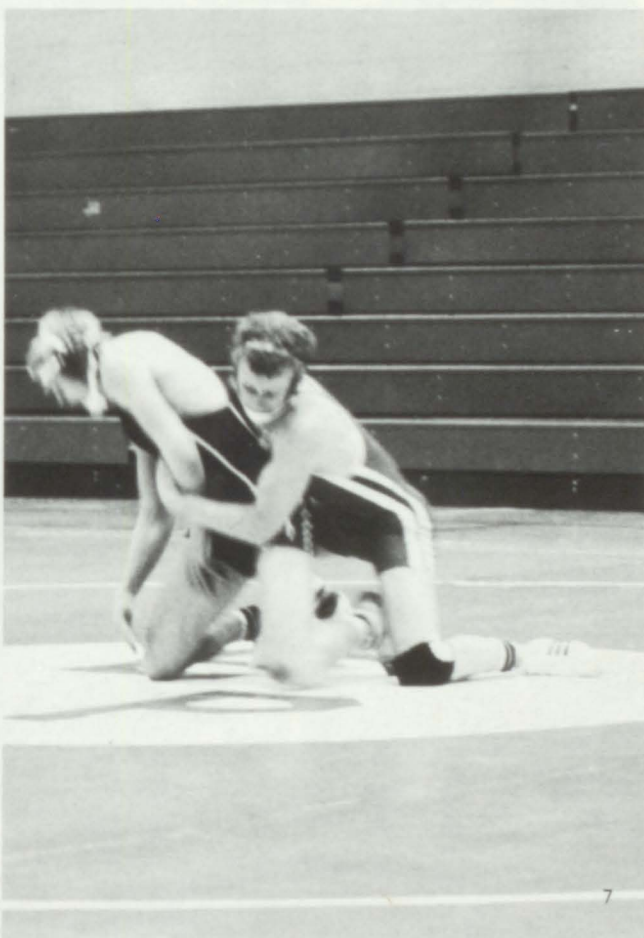
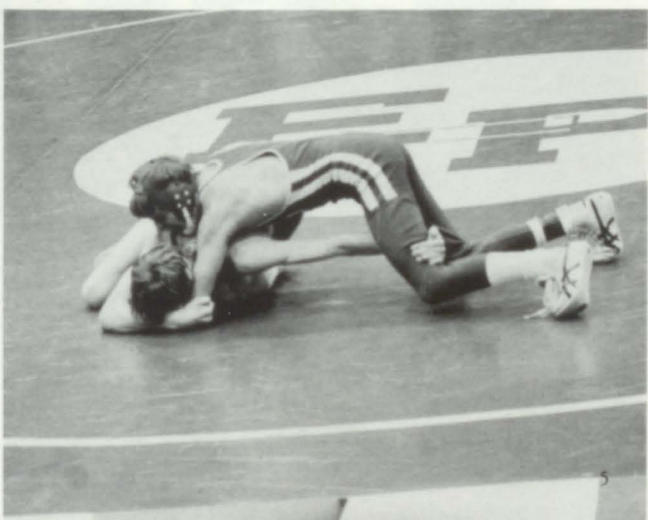
Sean G. wrestled his way to 2nd place and Larry S. was a 4th place winner at the Big "8" Tournament.

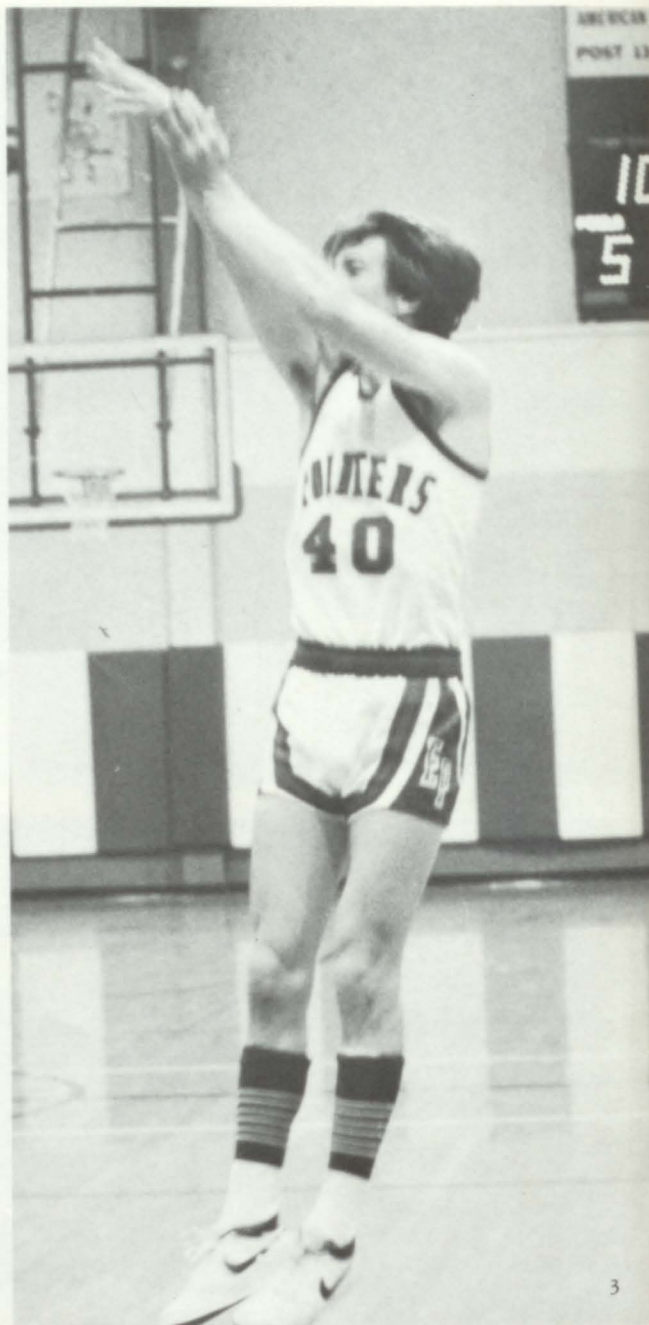
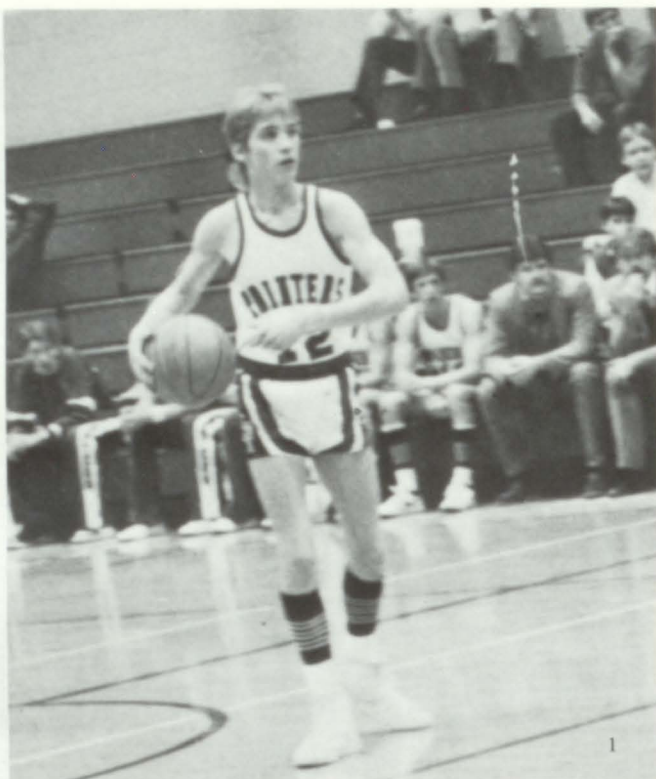
Boys' Basketball

In District play this year, the Pointers were edged out by

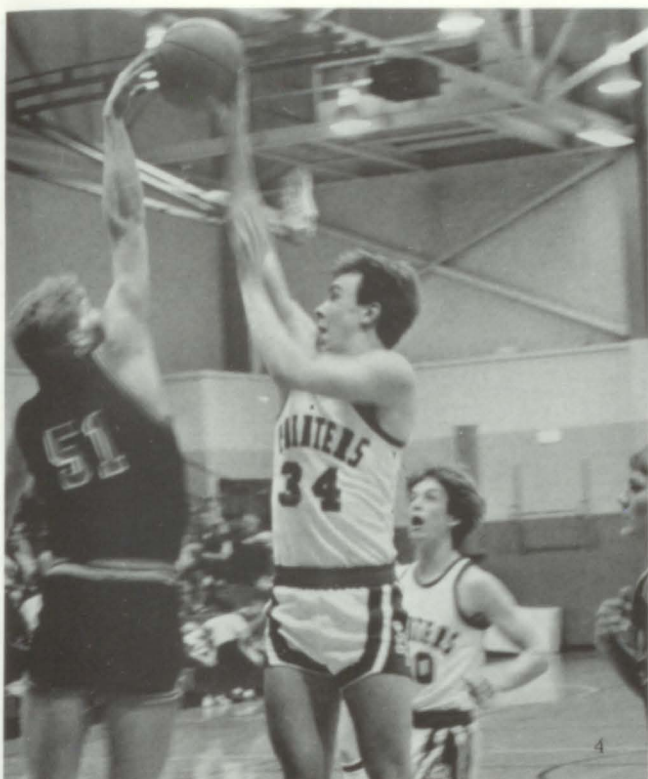

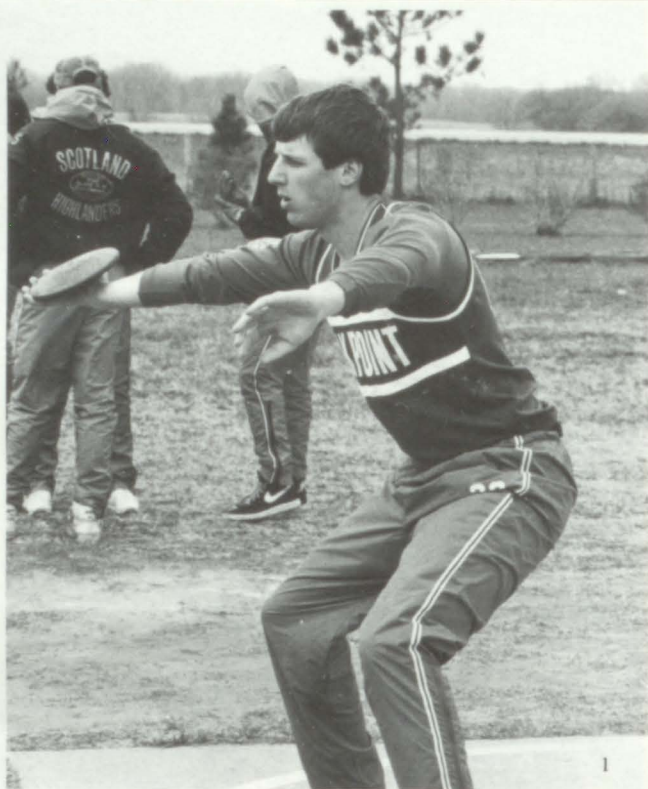


Track

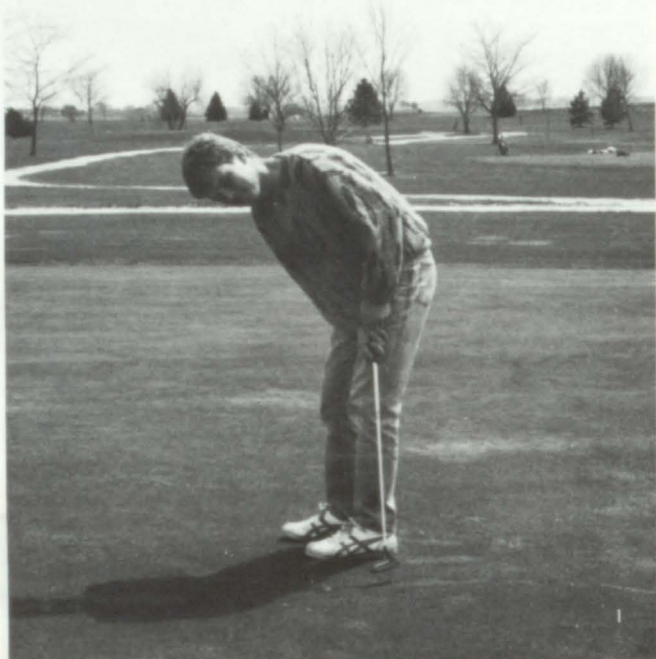
Golf
