The other highlight was when they ran a trick play on homecoming night against Parker and scored a touchdown. There were two players named all conference : J. Guenthner and T. Curran. T. VanRoekel, J. Truhe and E.J. Mollet were named honorable mention. J. Guenthner received honorable mention in the Argus Leader Elite 45. Offensively, the Huskies did very well. The Huskies gained 1166 yards rushing. J. Guenthner gained 531 yards, E.J. Mollet gained 221 yards and T. Curran gained 183. Defensively, the Huskies were led by David Trudeau with 99 tackles, and J. Guenthner with 97 tackles. The Huskies are losing 10 seniors this year. The future for the Huskies is going to be bright. Coach Bertram said, "Even though the record didn't show it, the Huskies made some great improvements throughout the season."












