



They started off the season with a 2-3 loss to Dakota Valley. Next, at the Star Invite they played three very good teams. At the Invite they lost to Orange City and Hull Western Christian, but beat Sioux City East in three games. The Husky's next win came when they beat Alcester-Hudson in a close home game. EP-J lost the next six matches, three in the SE Area Classic, then Tri-Valley, Parker, and Lennox. They then pulled off an exciting first round victory over Tri-Valley in the Big Sioux Conf. Tournament. After the tournnament the Huskies went on to lose to Harrisburg, Sioux Falls Christian, South Sioux City, and Omaha Ralston. Then came tournament time. EP-J was rated last and matched

up to play first rated Dakota Valley. After five long games the Huskies won. For the district championship game they played Vermillion. EP-J came out strong and won in three games. 

MULING TO WORK

The 2004 girls basketball season proved to be an exciting one, even though the record was 5-15. The girls had a hard time due to injuries throughout the year. The Huskies began the season with a loss to one of Iowa's top rated teams. The team's first win came when they played Alcester-Hudson. The most exciting game of the year was when the Huskies beat Scotland with a last second shot by Joellen Groethe. A week later, EPJ played Alcester-Hudson again in the BSC Tournament. This time the game was much closer, but the Huskies pulled off another win. Another close game was against Akron-Westfield. Katie Trometer put the Huskies in the lead after swooshing two free throws at the end of the game. EPJ's last victory was in a home game against Harrisburg.

Leading EPJ in scoring was J. Mead with 137 pts. Averaging the most points per game, 9.9 pts, was D. Harris. D. Harris scored the most in 3 pointers for EPJ and also lead in steals. L. Scott had the highest free throw percentage with 71.4%. E. Hasenbank lead in field goal percent-

age, making 44.7% of her shots. D. Harris had the most steals. E. Hasenbank was the leading rebounder grabbing 6.7 rebounds per game. She also had an impressive 64 offensive rebounds throughout the year. J. Mead had 93 defensive rebounds. E. Hasenbank also lead in assists. J. Mead made 3rd team All-Conference, E. Hasenbank received Honorable Mention and L. Scott received Academic All-State.








