This season, the girls' team set out to make a name for themselves and that's exactly what they did. The girls' team captured six championship titles this year. DeBuhr represented the Huskies well throughout the season as a complete boys' team was unable to be filled.

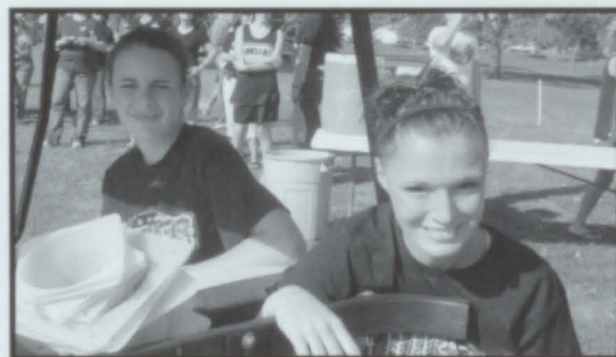
EPJ belongs to the tough and competitive Big Sioux Conference. Prior to the conference meet, the Huskies were the ones to beat. Since the conference meet was hosted by EPJ, the pressure to perform was on. Not only did the Huskies meet the challenge by an outstanding performance but the highlight came at the finish line of the girls' varsity race. J. Donnelly and B. McLaury had a photo finish tying for first place. This helped the lady Huskies win the conference meet.

Another highlight came during the region meet at Beresford. The girl's team achieved their goal of winning Regions and advancing to the state meet in Huron. The EPJ Huskies earned a first place finish, winning by only two points over West Central. B. McLaury led the Huskies with a second place, followed by J. Donnelly and Jordyn Hudelson placing fourth and eleventh, respectively. Others placing were M. Klinkhammer [25], T. Donnelly [28] and R. McLaury [29].

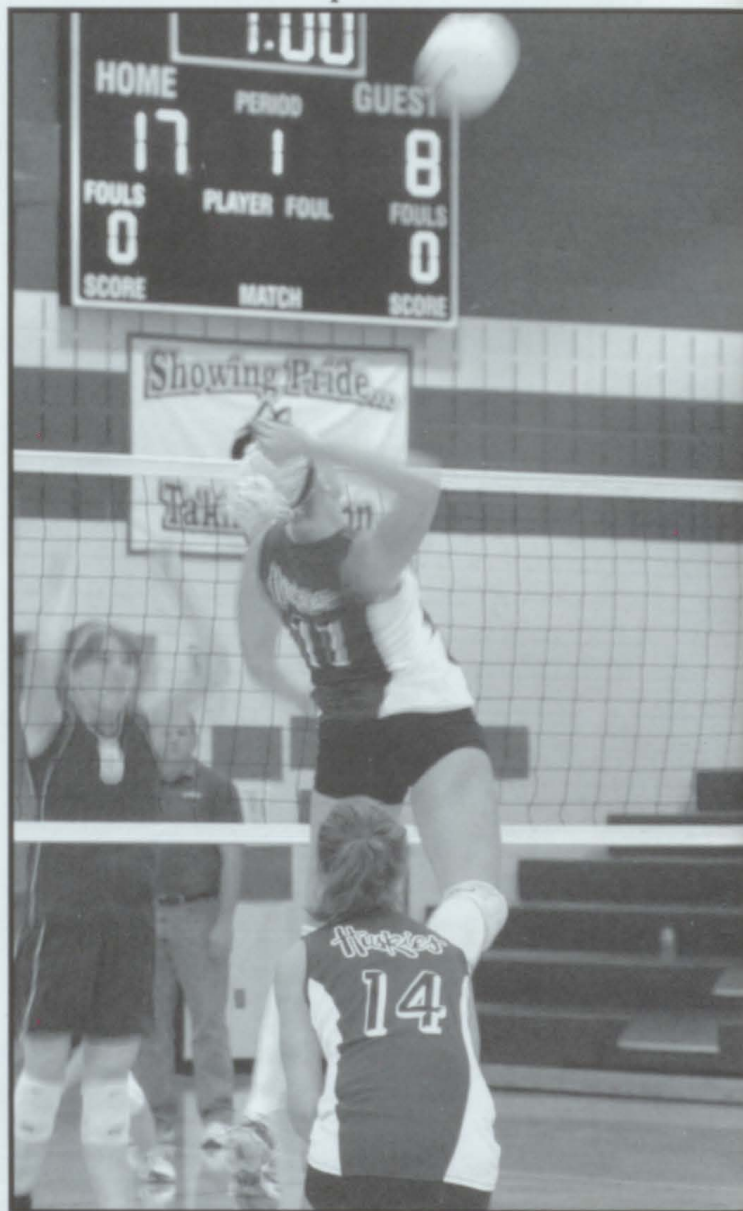

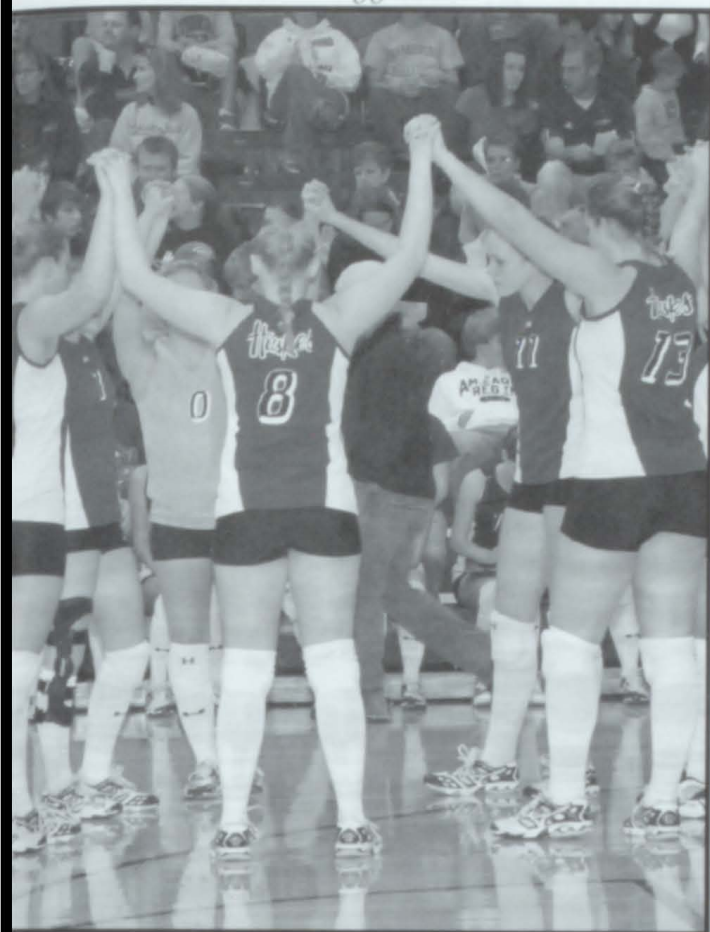

They were rewarded with their hard play when it came to post-season honors with 3 players making the all-conference list and 2 players making the all-state list, one of which was first team.



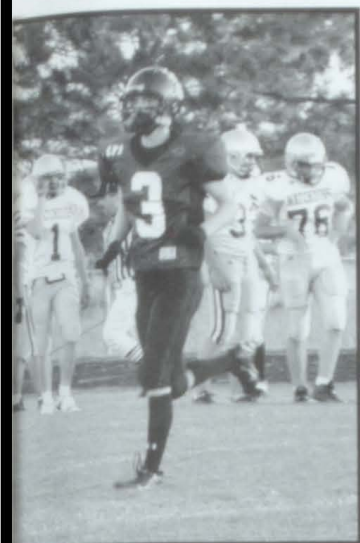

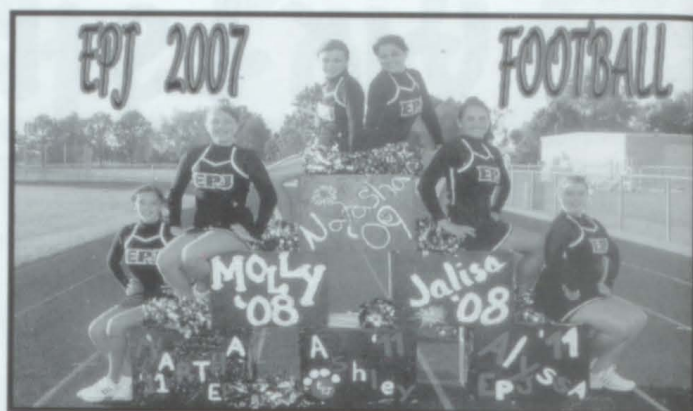

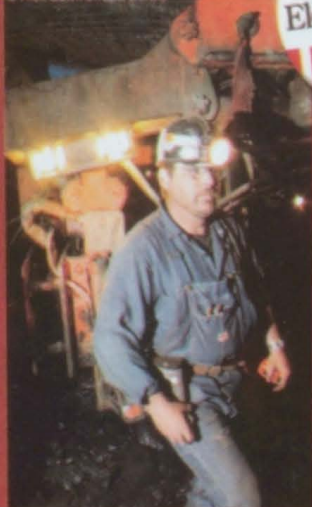

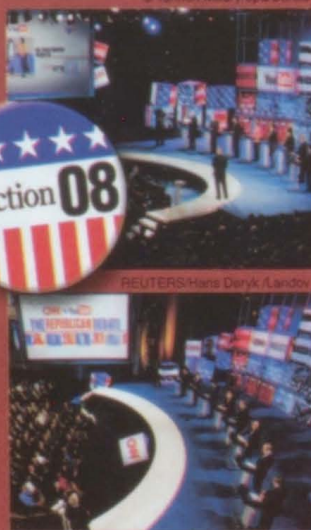

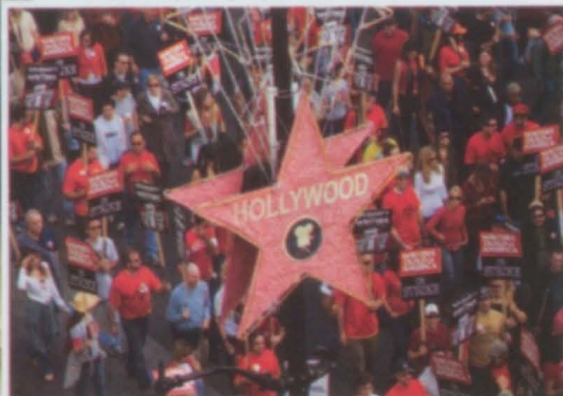

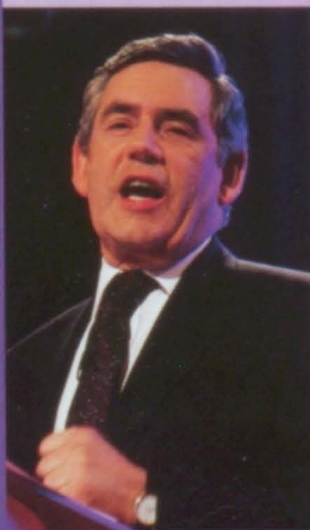

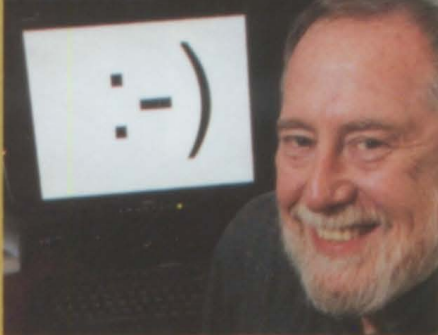

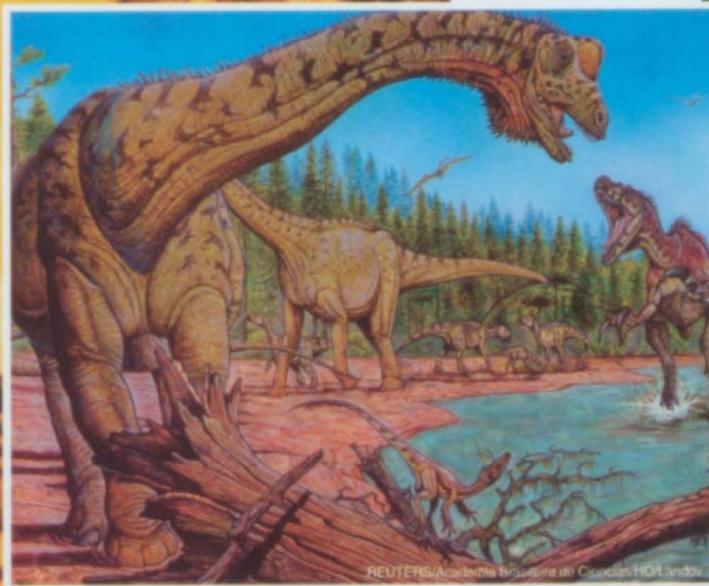

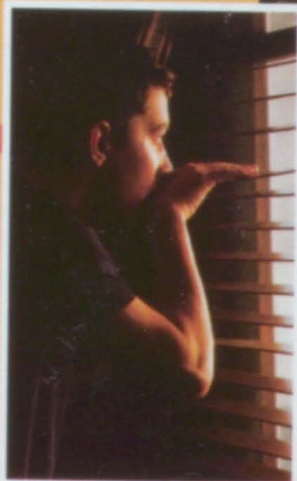

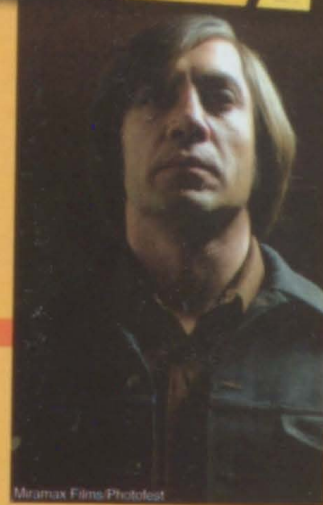

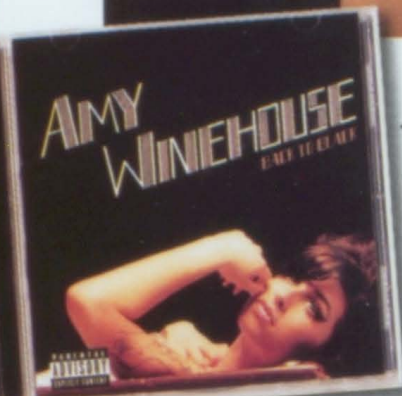

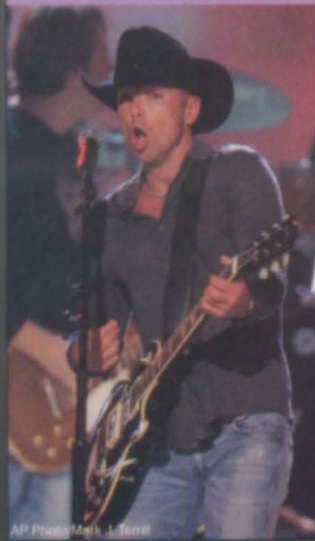

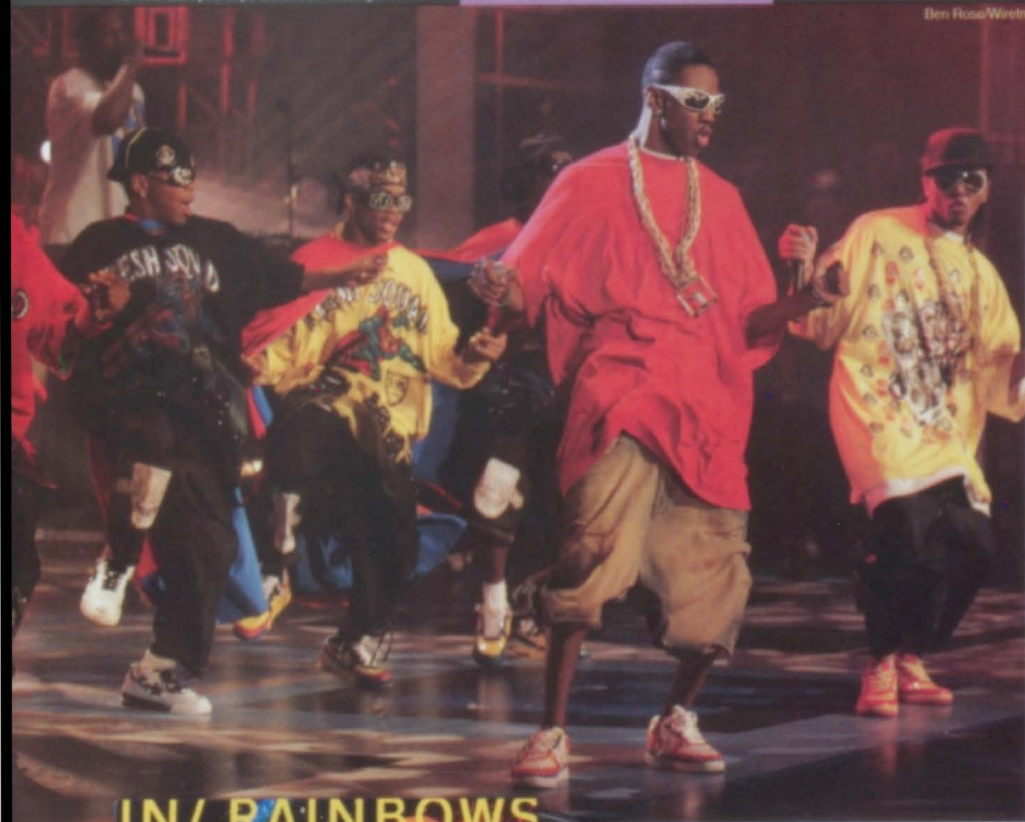

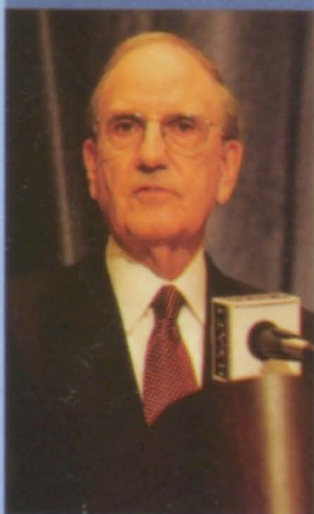

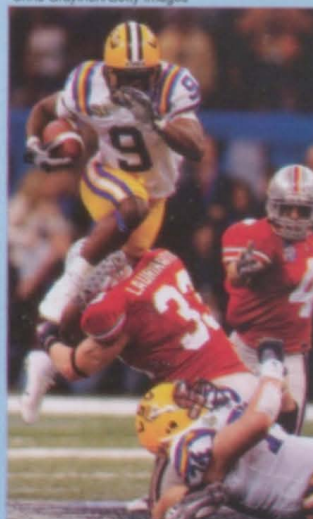

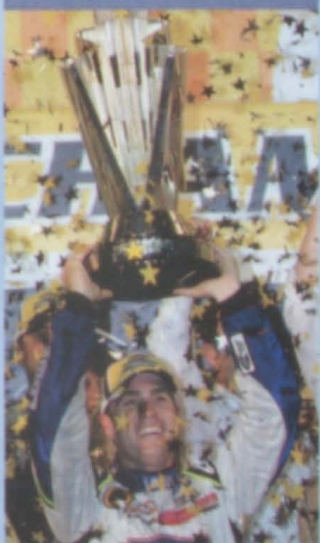

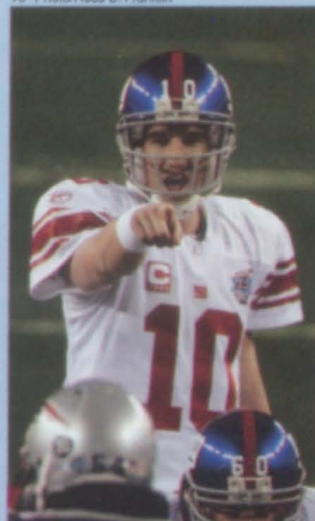

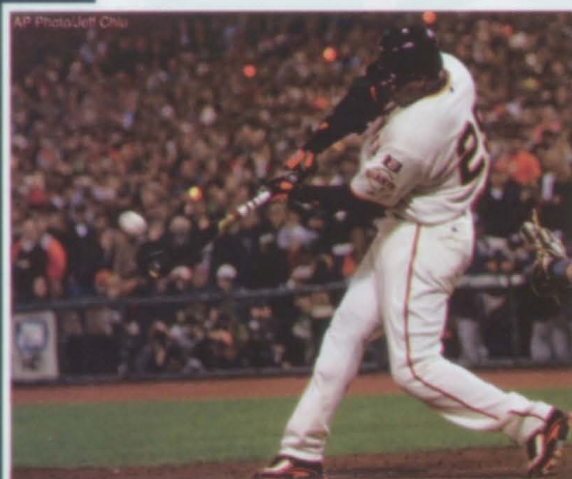

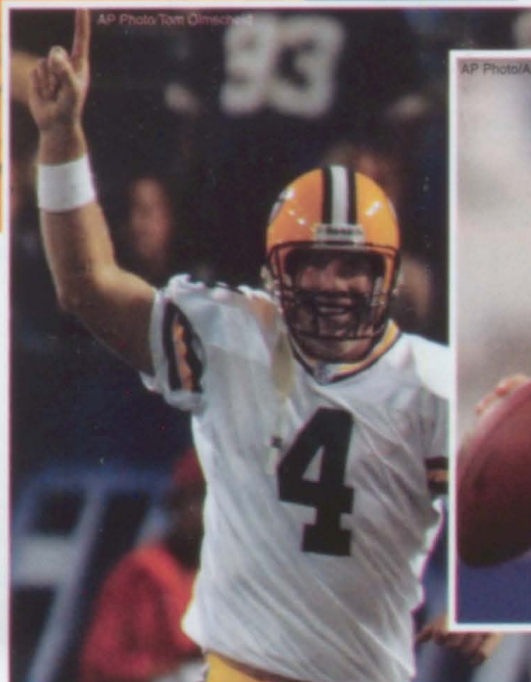

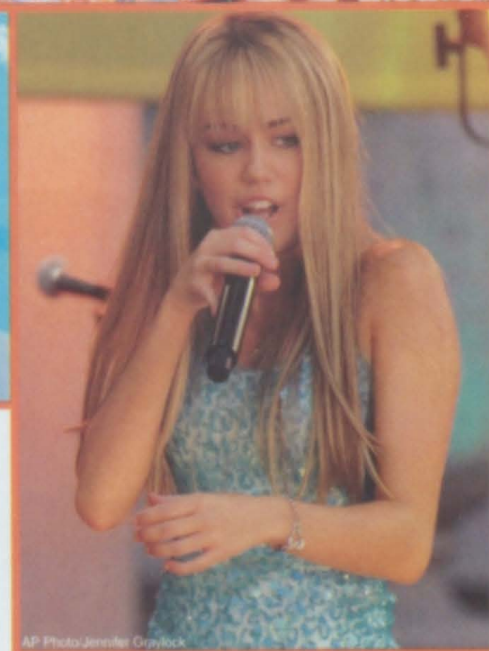
