

Leadership

Leadership skills are at the foundation of Prep's curricular initiatives. Students of all grades are encouraged to collaborate, articulate their perspectives, and explore core leadership values including passion, commitment, and problem solving. Our goal is to develop students who are globally aware, independent, and compassionate leaders—people driven to make a difference in the world.

STEAM

The STEAM program engages students in iterative design, student-driven discovery, and cross-curricular innovation by providing the tools to tinker and explore, empowering students to forge creative solutions to realworld problems through an integration of science, technology, engineering, art, and math.

Global Studies

Through interdisciplinary curriculum, local community outreach, and national and international projects, the Global Studies program enables students to explore and connect to the greater global society, develop sensitivity to commonalities and differences among and within cultures, and understand how global forces influence our daily lives.

Independent Research

Students participate in a variety of capstone research activities, including independent study projects. In Biology, experimentation with live animals begins in 9th grade through the school's Jelly Lab. Interested students continue with independent research, through which they seek answers to more complex questions and practice advanced analytical techniques.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Founded on the principle that curriculum should be both meaningful and challenging, our high school program prepares students for an exciting college experience and for the joys of an engaged, well-lived life of impact. In addition to offering opportunities to make connections across curricula, do hands-on work, and approach essential questions as global citizens, our academic program nurtures independent thinking, leadership, and problem solving.

Among other capstone opportunities in the senior year, in the second semester of senior year, students take Identity, a required project-based English course that emphasizes creativity, collaboration, and innovation. Students design their capstone projects after identifying, researching and refining what they see as problems in need of compassionate advocacy, impact, and reform, aiming to address real-world problems with meaningful and realistic solutions.

AP & Honors Curriculum

Prep offers 16 AP courses and 24 honors courses. Typically, all students in AP courses are required to take the AP exam. Students may take no more than 5 honors and AP academic courses in 11th and 12th grade.

Grading

Flintridge Prep encourages students to take full advantage of the curriculum to thoughtfully challenge themselves.

- We have a semester system, with four grading periods per year.
- A single grade is recorded at the end of each course.
- GPAs are based on all courses taken only at Prep.
- Flintridge Prep students are not ranked.
- Honors courses receive +0.5, while AP courses and Great Books Honors each receive +1.0.
- Dean's List (3.90 and above) and Honor Roll (3.60-3.89) are evaluated and noted at the end of each year.

Graduation Requirements

A yearlong course is one credit and students must be enrolled in five credits each year. Students must complete the following prerequisites to graduate, and most exceed the minimum requirements.

- English: 4 years
- History: 3 years, including 2 unit credits of World History and 1 unit credit of U.S. History
- Mathematics: Successful completion through Algebra 2
- Science: 3 years, including Biology & Chemistry through 11th grade
- World Languages: Successful completion through Level 3 of a single language
- Visual and Performing Arts: 2 years
- Physical Education: Satisfactory completion required through 10th grade, or a member of a Prep athletics team.
- Identity: Required 0.5 credit course taken during senior year
