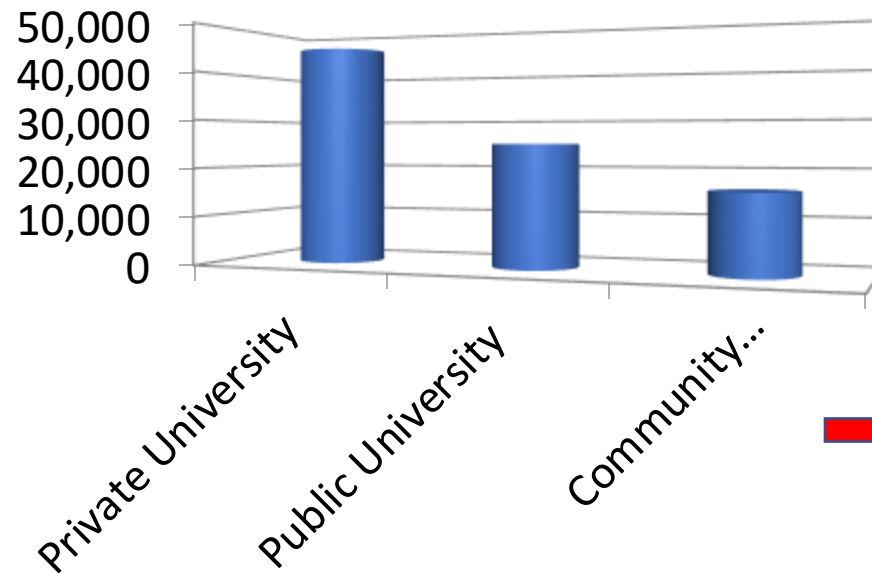

Tuition at CBC
= \$5,200/year

Types of Financial Aid

- Scholarships
 - Money you don't have to repay
 - Apply online or locally
- Grants
 - Money you don't have to repay
 - Awarded by State or Federal Government
- Work Study
 - Money you earn through work
- Loans
 - Money you can **BORROW** and must repay
- Parent Loans
 - Money your parents can **BORROW** and must repay.



Applying for Financial Aid

FAFSA

- Federal financial aid
- US Citizens or eligible non-citizens
- Valid SS# (not ITIN)
- www.studentaid.gov



WASFA

- Washington State financial aid
- For students not eligible for federal aid due to immigration status (including DACA students)
- Must graduate from a WA high school
- www.wasac.wa.gov/wasfa
 - Updated link last year!

How do I get financial aid?

- Apply for financial aid.
 - Either the FAFSA or the WASFA (only 1- not both).
 - Lists schools you are thinking about attending.
- Apply for admission
 - *This is how the school will know to connect with your financial aid application.*
- Watch for scholarship deadlines.
 - ***Columbia Basin College deadline is February 28th!***
- Check your email regularly for updates and information!
 - *This is how you will receive financial aid notifications.*
- Discuss college planning with your family.

Preparing to File for FA

Gather materials for both Parent and Student (as appropriate).

Use the **2021** Federal Tax information for 2023-2024 school year.

2023 Senior = Freshman in college 23-24

Gather:

Social Security Number (required for student, not for parent)

Federal Tax information including tax returns, IRS W-2's

Records of untaxed income

Child support, interest income,
veterans noneducation benefits

Approximate amount of:

Cash, savings & checking account
balances

Investments (including stock, bonds,
real estate- excluding your home)

Business and Farm assets



FA Pop Quiz!

- “My parents make too much money, so I won’t qualify for financial aid.”

Answer:

There is NO income cut-off to qualify for federal student aid. Many factors- such as size of your family and your year in school- are considered in calculating your aid eligibility.

Don’t make assumptions about what you will get-fill out the FAFSA or WASFA form to find out.

Create an Account-FAFSA

- Both Student and Parent (*with a SS#*) will create an FSA ID
 - Federal Student Aid ID
 - Creates an account for you to:
 - File your FAFSA
 - Complete documents for loans
 - Repay student loans and request Public Service Loan Forgiveness assistance.
 - Items needed to create an account:
 - Social Security Number
 - Individual Mobile phone number and/or email address
 - *Parent and Student will **EACH** have to create an account with separate information!*

WASFA QUESTIONNAIRE

The Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA) is for people who don't file a federal FAFSA application. People who complete a WASFA are applying for state aid. There are various reasons to complete a WASFA instead of a FAFSA:

- A person may not be eligible for federal aid due to:
 - Citizenship or immigration status, including being undocumented.
 - Defaulted federal student loans.
 - Repayments owed on federal grants.
- A person may choose not to apply for federal aid due to:
 - Family members who do not want to file the FAFSA.
 - Other personal reasons.

After you complete the WASFA, the college(s) or program(s) you choose will determine whether you meet [state residency requirements](#) and [state financial aid eligibility](#). State financial aid could include Washington College Grant, the College Bound Scholarship, Passport to Careers, National Guard Grant, or State Work Study.

Who is an “independent” student?

- Department of Education (FAFSA) considers students to be dependent on their parent financial information until they meet one of the following criteria:
 - Age 24 (born before January 1, 2000)
 - Married
 - Children or dependents (that you support >50%)
 - Veteran
 - Working on an advanced degree (Graduate level- beyond Bachelors)



Other factors for “dependency status”

- Foster youth any time after the age of 13
- Dependent or ward of the court
- Someone other than parent have legal guardianship of you
- Homeless or self-supporting and at risk of being homeless

FA Pop Quiz!

- “I support myself, so I don’t have to include parent information on my financial aid form.”

Answer:

This is not necessarily true. Even if you support yourself and file taxes on your own, you may still be considered a “dependent student” for federal student aid purposes.

If considered a dependent student, you must provide your parent’s financial information (unless you have extenuating circumstances).

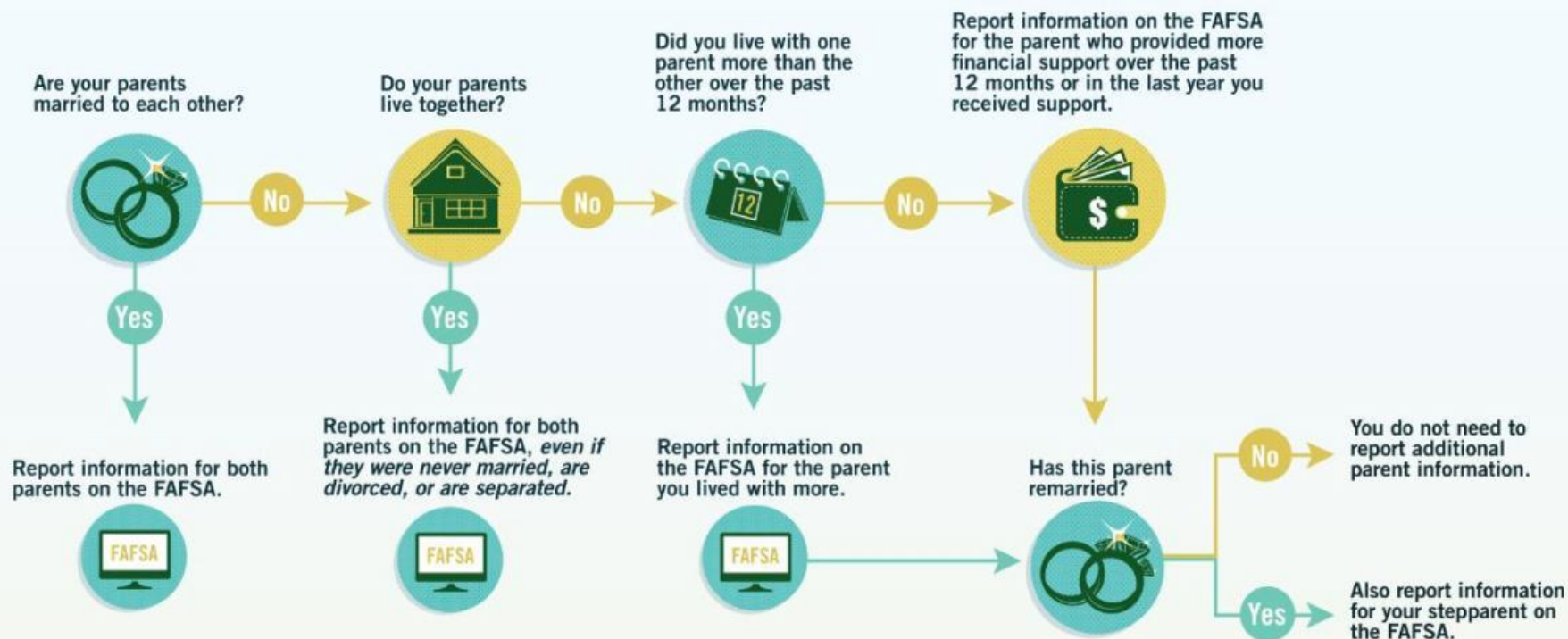

FA Pop Quiz!

- “My parents aren’t US Citizens, so there is no way I will get aid.”

Answer:

Your parents’ citizenship status is NOT a factor, and the FAFSA form won’t even ask you about it. If your parents do not have a Social Security number, they must enter **000-00-0000** when the FAFSA form asks for their Social Security number.

You will then need to print a signature page to mail in versus using an online parent signature (as the parent will not be able to create and FSA ID).

- Provide minimum of 2 weeks
