# Main issues affecting Junior School pupils

• Settling issues – making new friends

• Lack of sleep

- Too much screen time
- Need for parental controls on devices and monitoring of social media





#### Junior Drop In – Thursday lunch time

Global Village – Monday, Wednesday and Friday

6<sup>th</sup> Form buddies – break time and lunch time throughout the week

#### Recommended sleep

- NHS recommends 12 years olds should get 9 -12 hours of sleep per night
- Good sleep hygiene devices emit light which suppress natural sleep hormones
- Lack of sleep associated with
  - Poor concentration
  - Fatigue
  - Irritability
  - Feeling overwhelmed



#### Screen time



- As children start post primary school and take advantage of their independence, it is likely that they will be spending more time on their devices.
- This is a crucial time to talk to them about how to manage their screen time and give them strategies to find a healthy balance between their life on and offline.

#### Use of Social Media and phones

- Age restrictions on platforms usually 13 years and over
- Phones can be a great way to stay connected
- In our experience, some pupils are not mature enough to handle social media and messaging services such as Whatsapp

- Be aware of content on their phone / device
