PBIS

All District 191 schools use Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) as a way to teach schoolwide expectations and to let students know when they have met those expectations.

Through our ROAR (Respectful, On Task, Achieving, Responsible) program, we are ensuring students understand the high expectations we have for them both in their studies and in their social interactions. Focus on social emotional growth

Second Step is a researchbased program that helps children learn socialemotional skills such as responsible decision making, working together to solve problems, managing strong emotions, and getting along with others. MoveMindfully utilizes mindfulness, movement, and social emotional learning techniques to promote student self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and decision making.





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
