ACADEMIC OPTIONS

Eastlake High School strives to provide challenging and engaging instruction in every class, every day. Teachers challenge students to learn, while supporting them in this process through safe, personalized, and inspiring culture.

Students take advantage of Honors, Advanced Placement, University of Washington in the High School, and CTE Dual Credit where students earn community college credit while enrolled in classes at Eastlake High School classes. They can also access full or part-time Running Start, a dual enrollment program where college courses are taken at local community colleges, or Washington Network for Innovative Careers (WANIC) classes, which are offered on multiple campuses.

COVID DISCLAIMER

LWSD was closed to in-person learning from March 2020 through March 2021. Students were graded with A's or I's (Incompletes) for spring semester of 2020. For the 2020-21 school year, all students attended school via remote learning using a combination of synchronous and asynchronous learning with the option to return to campus April 2021 or continue remotely. For the 2021-22 school year, we returned to campus full-time for in-person learning. Since Fall 2020 to current date, we use a letter grading scale (A-D) with grades of under 60% earning "N"s for no credit earned, per district guidance.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Eastlake has school systems that personalize education and address the needs of all students. To provide students with the necessary time and support to learn, Eastlake offers student interventions during the school day in Math, Science, Literacy and World Language.

Eastlake also offers a flexible time (Wolf Time) in our schedule to meet the various needs of all our students. This allows students to access additional support from their teachers during the school day, as well as make up missed labs, assignments, or tests. Wolf Time can also mitigate stress and help students balance their busy lives by providing academic work time during the school day.
