



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GRADING SYSTEM

Elementary School and Middle School descriptive grading criteria for learning outcomes

EXCEEDING	The learner independently demonstrates proficiency of the standard and creatively transfers and extends this knowledge and understanding to other contexts.
PROFICIENT	The learner independently and consistently demonstrates their understanding of the key concepts, processes, and skills involved with the standard.
APPROACHING	The learner is inconsistent when demonstrating their understanding of the concepts, processes, and skills involved in the standard and often needs additional support to achieve success.
DEVELOPING	Even with support, the learner experiences ongoing difficulty understanding the concepts, processes, and skills associated with the standard.

ES CURRICULUM – PRETORIA CAMPUS

The elementary years of school develop important skills and dispositions toward learning. Our teachers foster students' natural wonder about the world while ensuring that they develop a growth mindset toward learning. Our conceptually based curriculum is aimed to meet the varying needs of students from diverse backgrounds. We focus on the social, emotional, physical, artistic, and academic development of the child.

The elementary school uses a balanced literacy approach to teaching reading and writing. Readers and Writers Workshops are at the core of our literacy program. We dedicate large blocks of time to teaching literacy throughout our school day to develop students who are passionate readers and writers.

Our math program is designed to promote conceptual understanding, problem-solving and mathematical reasoning. Emphasis is placed on developing strong number sense in students while ensuring that students have a wide repertoire of strategies for solving problems and explaining their thinking and reasoning to others.

Our students visit specialist teachers in art, music, physical education, library, and Spanish. Classroom teachers focus on language arts, science, social studies, and mathematics. We have a strong learning support program where learning support teachers, along with our counselor, work collaboratively with classroom teachers to meet the needs of students who require academic, social, and/or English language support.

We recognize the essential role that parents play in the education of their children. Our caring and experienced teachers partner with parents to meet the needs of each child.
