Reopening Schools Incentive Grant

- **Special Education Regional Programs**: Students enrolled in COMPASS and SAIL programs
- Head Start: Students enrolled in our Head Start program
- **Grades Pre-K, K, 6, 9:** All enrolled students in these grade bands to be provided an orientation day in the last week of September before the second marking period begins
- **Grades 1 and 12:** All enrolled students in the previous group plus students in 1st grade and 12th grade.
- All Students Prek- 12: All enrolled students will be provided the opportunity to return to school two days a week in the hybrid model
