TWO GOLFERS QUALIFY FOR MHSAA FINALS; VOLLEYBALL GETS HOME WIN OVER UTICA FORD

IRISH QUALIFY TWO FOR MHSAA GOLF FINALS

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Golf team placed fourth at the MHSAA Regional tournament at Flint Elks Golf Club with a score of 386. While the Irish did not qualify for the state finals as a team, as only the top three teams advance, two individual golfers did make the cut. Emily Szalach finished with an 87 to place ninth individually and Brooklyn Haddad shot a 91 to take 15th as both earned a spot at the MHSAA State Finals next weekend at Michigan State University's Forest Akers course. Ashley Larimer (104), Emma Roth (104) and Amanda Roth (105) also scored for Notre Dame in the Regional tournament.

NOTRE DAME GETS HOME WIN OVER UTICA FORD

The Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team improved to 32-7-2 with a 25-17, 25-11, 23-25, 25-14 win over Utica Ford. Grace Wenaas led all attackers with 22 kills and also added an ace. Mya Kattula had double-double with11 kills, 21 assists and an ace and Madison Pawlowski and Delaney Zielke each chipped in seven kills. Aly Berent scored 22 points, including five aces, collected 19 serve receptions, and added four assists and 10 digs. Margo Sudzina finished with 24 assists and 10 service points in the victory for the Irish.

BOYS, GIRLS XC TEAMS TAKE SECOND AT HANSONS INVITE

The Notre Dame Varsity Cross Country teams competed at the Hanson's Invitational at Freedom Hill County Park in a unique format that grouped runners by speed, allowing for athletes at all levels to "run in a pack". The race was chip-timed and the athletes were sorted by division for team scoring. A flat course and cooler temperatures contributed to a day where 30 athletes set season bests or personal records. Such improvement in times is usually rare, but this is the second week in a row that the team accomplished this task. The boys team was led by Ben Kinkade who ran a 17:33, breaking 18:00 for the first time in his career. Kinkade was second overall in a division that included all divisions two through four teams. Isaak Brook also broke 18:00 for the first time with a 17:58. Ryan Wojichowski 18:33, Chris Hunter 19:00, Nick Mardelli 19:44, John Milback 20:06, and Christian Estrellas 20:23 rounded out the varsity team, with Wojichowski, Hunter, Mardelli and Estrellas all setting personal records. The team won their first plaque of the year by finishing second overall. Kinkade, Brook and Wojichowski all earned medals by finishing in the top-20. The girls team also finished runnerup in the division with one of their strongest performances of the year. Maria Nunning 20:11, Skylar Vanhecke 21:07, Zoe Hoke 21:26, Mary Larocca 21:38, Sydney Schulte 22:37, Addison Mikel 22:40 and Addie Bellows 23:26 all set season bests or personal records.

Next up is the 63rd annual Oakland County Championship at Kensington where the boys will defend their 2021 division two title and the girls will attempt to win back their title from 2020.

SWIMMERS ENJOY STRONG OAKLAND COUNTY MEET; BOYS SOCCER GETS WIN OVER LAKE ORION

SWIMMERS HAVE STRONG OAKLAND COUNTY MEET

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Swim team competed at the Oakland County Championship meet held at Lake Orion High School. The Irish were represented by only five qualifying swimmers, but times were dropped, top sixteen places were had and state cuts were made. The meet started off with the 200 Medley Relay with Olivia Powell, Tori Devine, Emma Ciesla, and Rita Hajjar swimming to a fifteenth place with a 4.59 second drop and a new state cut. The time ranks Notre Dame eighth in the state for division three. Grace Linenfelser followed with a personal best in the 200 free with a 4.61 second drop, good for fifteenth place in the county. Linenfelser already had a state cut, however, this bumped her up to a current rank of sixth place in the sate. Hajjar also dropped another .25 seconds off her state cut time, placed fourteenth in the county and has a current rank of seventeenth place in the state. Ciesla continued to be consistent with a drop of 1.9 seconds in the 100 Butterfly, giving her a sixth place finish at the County meet and a second place rank in the state. Ciesla, Powell, Devine, and Hajjar went on to a 15th place finish in the 200 Free Relay with a new state cut and a 15th place ranking in the state. In the final event of the day, another state cut, this time in the 400 Free Relay, was earned by Powell, Hajjar, Linenfelser and Ciesla. The 7.25 second drop helped put the relay team in a fifth place ranking in the state.

IRISH, EAGLETS PLAY TO SCORELESS DRAW

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Soccer team battled Orchard Lake St. Marys to a 0-0 tie. While there was a lot of offense in the game and changes for both sides, defense prevailed as the teams finished in a scoreless draw after 80 minutes. Senior Owen Thieme led the Irish to another shutout, shutting down the Eaglets with double-digit saves on the night.

IRISH TAKE SEVENTH AT ORANGE/BLUE/BLACK INVITE

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Golf team placed seventh at the Orange/ Blue/Black Tournament at Huron Meadows Metropark with a score of 414. Alex Triantos (101), Emily Szalach (102), Brooklyn Haddad (104) and Morgan Bissett (107) all posted top scores for the Irish.

IRISH PICK UP WIN OVER HOLLY

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Swim team picked up a 116-67 win over Holly. The 200 Medley Relay earned points with a second place finish from Aria Kim, Lauren Chojnacki, Mariana Spada, and Edie Byrd. In the 200 Free, point earners were Emma Ciesla and Cat Zaleski in first and third place with Mia Carles also finishing in sixth place. Mia Skandalaris and Lexi Hunter finished first and third in the 200 IM, followed by first, second, sixth, and seventh place by Spada, Kim, Byrd, and Brooke Beaudoin. Divers Allison Voto and Kiersten Alexander took first and third place, with Voto

earning a season best total of 179.55 points. In the 100 Butterfly the Irish took first, second and fourth place by Spada, Alex Williams, and Rita Hajjar. Skandalaris and Zaleski took a first and second in the 100 Free with Carles taking sixth and Ellie Kim swimming exhibition. The 500 Free saw another one, two win from Linenfelser and Aria Kim, and a sixth place finish by first time 500 swimmer Byrd. Notre Dame took another first,-second place win the 200 Free Relay with Ciesla, Kim, Zaleski, and Williams in first, and Chojnacki, Hunter, Spada and Kim in second place. The last two individual events were also a point makers for Notre Dame. In the 100 Backstroke, Ciesla, Linenfelser and Chojnacki went one, two and four. The 100 Breaststroke saw Williams at first, Hunter in third and Beaudoin in sixth. The evening ended with the Irish going first and third in the 400 Free Relay. Coming in first were Byrd, Zaleski, Chojnacki, and Hajjar. Third place went to Ellie Kim, Beaudoin, Linenfelser and Ciesla.

IRISH RALLY TO TIE MAPLES

The Notre Dame JV Football team rallied from a 14-point deficit to tie Birmingham Seaholm 21-21. After trading possessions to start the game, Seaholm took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. The Maples then recovered the ensuing onside kickoff but their drive was stopped by a defensive stand by Lucas Kattula and Nick Creek, including a fourth down stop by Creek. Notre Dame then got on the scoreboard in dramatic fashion with an 80-yard strike from Drake Roa to Brodie Sink to even the score. Unfortunately, the Maples returned the Notre Dame kickoff 75 yards to go in front 14-7. After a slow second half start by the Irish, Seaholm mounted a touchdown drive to take a 21-7 lead. The Irish were down but not out. During the next series. Notre Dame moved down the field thanks to a hookup from Roa to Nick Kobylecki for a first down. After a pass interference call moved the ball into the redzone and a key run by Lucas Bigelow, Jake Rose broke a run into the end zone to cut the deficit to 21-14. Seaholm was forced to punt after a stop by Kattula, and Notre Dame then drove to tie the score. Key plays on the game-tying drive were a first down run by Roa, and a spectacular one-handed grab by Sink. Roa then tossed the touchdown pass to Colin Whalen just before crossing the line of scrimmage for the tying score. Owen Fulsher converted all of his PAT attempts, none bigger than his final kick to knot the score at 21. Notre Dame moves to 4-1-1 on the season and hosts Divine Child next week.

5TH/6TH VOLLEYBALL BATTLES ST. HUGO

The Notre Dame 5th/6th Volleyball team took on a strong St. Hugo team, characterized by great volleying by both teams. The Irish dropped the first two sets 23-25, and 24-26 but rallied to take the third set 15-9. Notre Dame was led by Paige Schepper's six aces, two assists, and three kills.
