In the Town of Killingly, our program (named PIXI) follows the recommended model of The Primary Project to ensure access for all learners. The program objectives for the Killingly Public Schools PIXI program include:

1. Continued early identification and service to at-risk children and their families by implementing a proven K-1 non-special education, school-based program for the detection and prevention of emotional, behavioral, and school adjustment problems.
2. Provide approximately 130 elementary students in the school district with weekly sessions, tailored to their individual needs, which will increase their positive school adjustment, as measured by Primary Project scales.
3. Provide parents of all students in the program with training and support to become partners with teachers in helping their child adjust and to succeed in school.

A primary objective for PIXI in Killingly Public Schools in the 2022-2023 school year is to increase the resources available for identification and support of mental health for K-1 families.

Children receive weekly individual sessions with the PIXI Child Associates. PIXI services include self-directed expressive play techniques, reflective listening, games, and visual stimuli to explore emotions, hands-on projects using manipulative materials, story reading, and role playing with feedback. Each child's program will be individually tailored to meet his/her identified adjustment needs.

Parent involvement emphases: (a) consent, joint goal setting, and a minimum of two conferences/year, (b) mutually understood expectations about home-school communications, and (c) support and training in dealing with school adjustment and other potential problems. Parent participation in Second Step, Come Play with Me, and Parent/Pixi Associate meetings will supplement PIXI sessions.

Killingly Central School has one Pre-K class and the early start in the elementary school will allow for earlier identification of PIXI students for grade K and 1, will also help acclimate students to a school environment, as well as to PBIS goals at an earlier time. Our focus will include increasing parent participation, supporting our PBIS initiatives, and increasing our efforts to provide a welcoming positive atmosphere in our school.

Killingly will comply with all CSDE Primary Project requirements of data collection for state level evaluation. All Child Associates in the PIXI program will utilize the COMET data collection system.

Classroom teachers will provide initial identification of students, following the Primary Project guidelines. The school social worker on-site, under the direction of the school principal, will supervise all data collection and reporting pertaining to this program. Killingly will conduct its own longitudinal study of the programs' impact on special education referrals.

School progress will be monitored through parent-teacher conferences. The PBIS team will monitor discipline reports through the SWIS data collection program and will be responsible for maintaining the positive school expectations system within the school. School adjustment problems that may be evidenced through behaviors such as shyness, aggression, school phobia, peer relationships, and inattentiveness will be addressed using the identification/selection process and curriculum of the Primary Project program

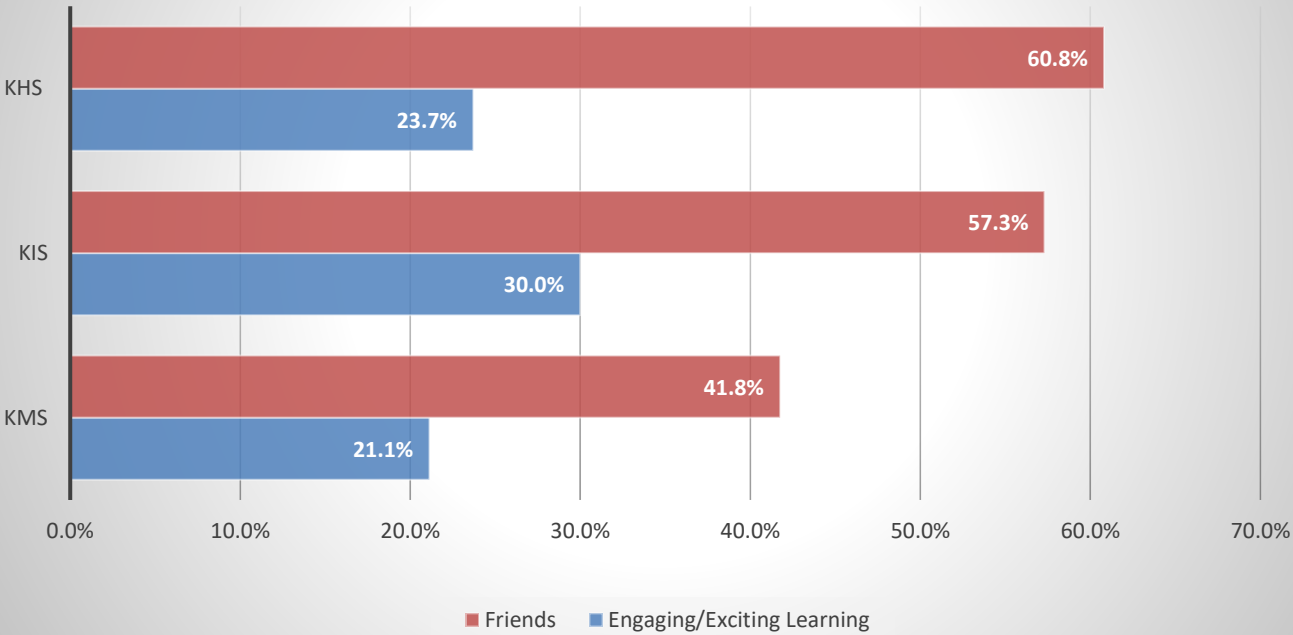

Also present were Superintendent Robert Angeli, Assistant Superintendent Susan Nash-Ditzel, Manager of Business Affairs Christine Clark, Student Board Members Connor Thompson and Melody Kettle, and Recording Secretary Elizabeth Buzalski.
3. **PUBLIC COMMENT:** Michelle Murphy, 325 Breakneck Hill Rd, offered the contact information for Quiet Corner Transport (860-576-2447). They will transport students in need to Putnam for treatment.
