September saw the implementation of our SIPPs reading program in our “Walk to Read” model, where our 6-9 students walk to their differentiated reading lessons in other classrooms with different teachers and TA’s! In our eight separate groups, we are already seeing amazing growth in both our students and the adults leading this new curriculum. Go team!

We are also thrilled to see our VAPA, Second Step lessons, and PE rotations in full swing since early September. We are so grateful for being able to create an enriching school environment where we get to prioritize the whole child through visual and performing arts, a social-emotional focus, and fun PE lessons; we are so lucky to have such an amazing staff to carry out these endeavors!

On Saturday, 10/1 we had such a productive Campus Work Day! Over 30 family and four staff members were on campus with me tending to our Peace Garden, organizing our Clothing Closet, organizing our art supplies for the Art Committee, decorating for fall, and labeling our books for our brand-new Book Exchange Program, starting this week. This is perfect timing for our Read-a-thon fundraiser, taking place this month between 10/10 and 10/21. It is a joy to see the Capitol community coming back so strong in the wake of the pandemic!
