

From the Principal

It is hard to believe we're already a month into the school year and Session 1 ended last Friday.

Overwhelmingly, students seem engaged and excited about classes and what they're learning which is a wonderful way to start the year.

As the new session begins and weather cools down, however, it is apparent that some students are having a harder time getting to school. It adds up – averaging just 2 absences per month (excused or unexcused) is defined as *chronic absenteeism* and makes it less likely that a student will graduate from high school. Sporadic – not just consecutive – absences matter. Before you know it, one or two missed days a month adds up to 10% of the school year.

Students who are chronically absent also can negatively impact the instruction for other students who must wait while teachers "catch-up" students returning from absences.

How you can help:

- · Avoid unnecessary absences.
- Try to schedule appointments outside of the school day.
- If your student is too sick to come to school, keep them home (from everything, including jobs & extra-curricular sports/activities) and resting so they can return to school quickly.

Checks, written to EMHS, are due by October 11 to Mary in the main office.


WORLD COMPETENCY TESTING

RESOURCES FOR FINANCIAL HARDSHIPS

We know that the economy continues to create financial hardships for many of our families and we want you to be aware of some resources available to your student (s).

Weekend Food Program

Pantry Packs: Students receive a bag of food every week to support them over the weekend. Pantry Packs powered by the Lake Washington Schools Foundation provides weekend food packs for food insecure LWSD students each week.

Other Needs

InvestEd: Help for secondary students to improve their attendance, engagement, and graduation rate. The basic purpose of the InvestEd Fund is to provide timely assistance to individual students who have needs to help them realize their full potential in school. Some of the needs that InvestEd can help with are classroom needs including workbooks, field trips, class fees, school supplies; health needs including school accident insurance, dental, hearing, and eye services; personal needs including clothing, breakfast/lunch programs, and transportation; special program fees including tutoring, college testing fees, summer school, driver's ed; and other school activities like graduation expenses, yearbooks for graduating seniors, and school special events.

REGISTRATION PACKETS

ATTENDANCE LINE

Remember, students <u>and</u> parents/guardians are responsible for school attendance. The parent or legal guardian of any student living with them, even if over 18 years old, who is absent from class is requested to leave a phone message on the **Emerson Attendance Line at 425-936-2306** *within 48 hours of* the absence to explain the circumstances of an absence.

Please call or email (Sally at sjenkins@lwsd.org) to notify the school <u>in advance</u> of preplanned absences. For vacation or extended absences, the student must pick up a form in the office for teachers and parent to sign <u>prior to the absence</u>.

If your student was absent from any classes during a particular day, you will receive an automated attendance call after 6:45 PM on that day. If that absence needs to be excused, please call and leave a message on the EMHS attendance line, via email to the Attendance Secretary at sjenkins@lwsd.org, or supply a parent or physician note.



EMERSON CAMPUS SAFETY COMMITTEE

The Emerson Campus Safety Committee is made up of staff from all three schools on campus – EMHS, Emerson K-12, and Northstar Middle School. We meet regularly to discuss school safety and security issues on campus.

We follow district protocols to set up emergency instructions for lockdowns, fires, earth-quakes, and emergency situations which require Parent/Student Reunification. We are required to have the following drills each school year: 4 fire, 1 modified lockdown, 1 shelter-in-place, 1 Emergency Supply, and 1 regional hazard/earthquake. We had our first fire drill the beginning of September and the next drill is the Great Washington ShakeOut Earthquake Drill for 2022. Millions of people worldwide will practice how to drop, cover, and hold at 10:20 am on 10/20.

The campus safety committee also helps the campus prepare for a potential disaster by gathering and maintaining the campus emergency supplies. Most staff members hold a position in the campus Incident Command System to assist your child if an emergency occurs during school hours.

In the event of a campus emergency or area-wide disaster, the school district's automated phone system will deliver a recorded message letting parents know what to do, including instructions on early closing.

Dear Families,

As you may already be aware, growing our students' social-emotional ("SEL") skills is an important goal for our school. As part of these activities, we survey students (grades 3-12) and ask them to reflect on their own mindsets and approaches to learning. The data we get back helps us continue to identify opportunities for growth and development with our students.

We partner with a leader in the SEL space, Panorama Education. Panorama develops tools to empower schools and districts to learn about students' self-perceptions, better understand student experiences in their learning environment, and identify opportunities to enhance support of teachers and counselors as they implement SEL programs. Panorama's SEL survey is grouped into three categories:

- Student competencies
- Student supports and environment
- Teacher skills and perspectives

These surveys will help shape the districts' approach to supporting teachers' work in service of the whole student.

ORCA CARDS - New process for 2022-23!

The LWSD is no longer involved with issuing Orca Cards. Metro will be implementing Free Youth Transit cards in a phased approach, beginning the 2022-23 school year.

Youth, ages 18 and younger can ride transit for free starting September 1st throughout King, Snohomish, Pierce, and Kitsap counties. Participating transit agencies are Community Transit, Everett Transit, King Country Metro, Kitsap Transit, Pierce Transit, Sound Transit, City of Seattle, Seattle Streetcar, and Washington State Ferries (starting October 1st).

Students with existing LWSD Orca cards will keep them and will need to get a sticker from the office as part of the registration process. This sticker can be affixed to the back of the card. The sticker will instruct students to register their card with Free-YouthTransitPass.com. Students will have until June 30, 2023 to complete registrations.

Students who need/want a new Orca card will be able to pick up a new black Orca card in the main office and will need to register their card as well with Free-

YouthTransitPass.com. Students will have until June 30, 2023 to complete registrations.

PARENT ACCESS

The LWSD provides access to student information including student records, lunch accounts, and more via the Internet. This information is secure so that only you can see information about your student (s). The system through which you can view this information is called **Parent Access**.

When you are registered at school, you have secure access to the following types of student information:

- E-mail links to your student's teachers
- Volunteer Application
- Ability to make online credit card payments for fees/fines
- Family Access: the system that provides official student information on your student (s), including emergency contacts, attendance, end of term report card grades, immunization records, parent/guardian information, fees, etc.

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Students are NOT allowed to have medication at school, this includes non-prescription medication like Advil, Tylenol, etc. All medication must be cleared through the Emerson Office, contact Sally Jenkins, our Health Room Office Professional.

Parents/guardians are responsible for:

- Supplying all medications/transporting medication to and from school.
- ◆ Completing required medication authorization forms. An authorization to administer medication form must be turned in for each medication whether prescription or non-prescription. The form must be signed by the health care provider and parent and/or guardian. Medication cannot be given without the completed form.
- All prescribed medication must be in the original, labeled prescription bottle, container or package.
- ♦ All non-prescription medication must be in original container and labeled by the parent, <u>including</u>: Student Name, Medication Name, Dosage, Date Issued, Name of Health Care Provider, and Time medication is to be given.

Scheduled medications are given between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM only.
