

TUSTIN UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Annual Report of Financial Activity for Fiscal Year 2021/22

(Prepared Pursuant to Section 66006 of the California Government Code)



INTRODUCTION

Section 66006 of the Government Code requires that the Tustin Unified School District (“School District”) provide to the public information on impact fees received from new residential and commercial/industrial development to mitigate the impact of that new development on the school facilities of the School District (“Reportable Fees”). The School District currently collects statutory school facility fees (“Statutory School Fees”) pursuant to Sections 17620 *et seq.* of the Education Code and Sections 65995 *et seq.* of the Government Code, and alternative school facility fees (“Alternative School Fees”) collected pursuant to Sections 65995.5, and 65995.7 of the Government Code (collectively, “Reportable Fees”).

The School District is required to provide under the Government Code the following information on Reportable Fees for the prior fiscal year:

- Amounts collected
- Amount of interest earned
- Amounts spent of projects to accommodate additional enrollment from new residential and commercial/industrial development

The Reportable Fees do not include special tax proceeds, proceeds of bonds, or letters of credit to secure payment of Reportable Fees at a future date. Further, the School District is required to confirm that Reportable Fees have not been levied, collected, or imposed for general revenue purposes.

Additionally, the School District is required to identify the following:

- The proposed purposes to which unexpended Reportable Fees may be spent
- The Reasonable Relationship between the unexpended Reportable Fees and the purpose to which they are to be spent
- The funding sources and expected funding availability date for school facilities projects for which unexpended Reportable Fees are required

The following Annual Report (“Report”) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 includes the information and proposed findings the School District intends to review and adopt in accordance with Section 66006 of the Government Code.

ANNUAL REPORT

Government Code Section 66006(b)(1) and (2) requires that an annual report of certain fees (“Reportable Fees”) be made available to the public not more than 180 days after the end of each fiscal year.

In accordance with Government Code Section 66006(b)(1) and (2), the School District hereby presents the following information for Fiscal Year 2021/2022 (i.e., July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022) regarding the Annual Reportable Fees:

DESCRIPTION OF THE TYPE OF REPORTABLE FEES

*For each separate account or fund established for the purpose of avoiding commingling of Reportable Fees Government Code Section 66006(b)(1)(A) requires that the Report contain **a brief description of the type of fee in the account or fund.***

The Reportable Fees of the School District for Fiscal Year 2021/2022 consists of Statutory School Fees and, if applicable, Alternative School Fees. Statutory School Fees are collected by the School District for residential and commercial/industrial development, and Alternative School Fees, if applicable, are collected by the School District for new residential development.

Since the amount of the Statutory School Fees that the District is allowed to impose are determined on a state-wide basis and may not take into account many local variables such as land acquisition costs, District design capacities or classroom loading policies, it is generally acknowledged that the statutory school fees do not fully mitigate the facilities impacts from new development. As a result, since 1989 the District has entered into mitigation agreements with various developers to better ensure that new development more fully mitigates its school impacts. Within some of these mitigation agreements, an amount equal to the statutory school fee and payable at issuance of certificate of compliance, is collected by the District and represents one component of school mitigation with additional components having been or expected to be received from special taxes or bond proceeds associated with the formation Community Facilities Districts (“CFDs”) as well as possible state funding.

While these amounts are collected by the District and are included in subaccounts of the Developer Fee Account (Fund 25), their use is governed by provisions within the various mitigation agreements and may be broader, different or more restrictive than those authorized in the school fee legislation. These mitigation payments are not Reportable Fees. Thus, while included in this Report as well as the attached Exhibit “A”, they may be excluded from the District’s Five-Year Report.

AMOUNT OF THE REPORTABLE FEES

*For each separate account or fund established for the purpose of avoiding commingling of Reportable Fees Government Code Section 66006(b)(1)(B) requires that the Report set forth **the amount of the of the fee.***

The amount of Reportable Fees is based on the effective Statutory School Fee and the Alternative School Fee as described below.

STATUTORY SCHOOL FEES

The Statutory School Fees for the period between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022 were established by the Board of Education (“Board”) of the School District on April 13, 2020 by Resolution No. 04-06-20. This resolution adopted the Statutory School Fees for new residential and commercial/industrial development based on the report entitled “Fee Justification Report for Residential and “Commercial/Industrial Development” dated March 2020.

ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL FEES

Based on the District’s most recent analysis regarding its eligibility to adopt and impose Alternative Fees, for the period between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022, such Alternative School Fees were not justified or adopted.

Table 1 below lists the fee amounts and effective dates for the applicable Statutory and Alternative School Fees for fiscal year 2021/2022.

IDENTIFICATION OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS

For each separate account or fund established for the purpose of avoiding commingling of Reportable Fees Government Code Section 66006(b)(1)(E) requires that the Report provide **an identification of each public improvement on which fees were expended and the amount of the expenditures on each improvement, including the total percentage of the cost of the public improvement that was funded with fees.**

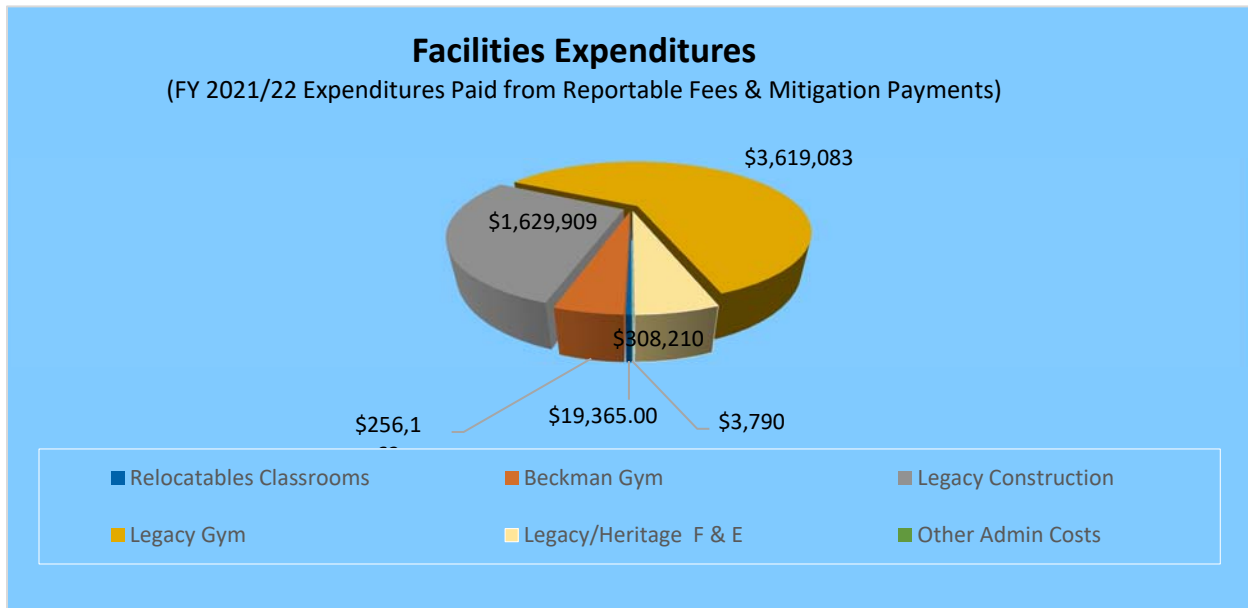

DATE BY WHICH CONSTRUCTION WILL COMMENCE

*For each separate account or fund established for the purpose of avoiding commingling of Reportable Fees Government Code Section 66006(b)(1) (F) requires that the Report **identify an approximate date by which the construction of the public improvement will commence if the local agency determines that sufficient funds have been collected to complete financing on an incomplete public improvement.***

The School District has determined that at the close of fiscal year 2021/2022, Reportable Fees and other sources of funding were not sufficient to complete the financing of additional school facilities of the School District. Please see the Five-Year Report prepared pursuant to Government Code 66001 for information on planned construction projects and the estimated date funding will be available to complete the construction projects.
