Background and Mission

Established in 1937, St. Monica Catholic High School is a fouryear, coeducational, parish high school that serves young men and women, grades 9 - 12. Current enrollment is 384 students; 102 seniors. The graduating class of 2022 had 99% four-year college acceptances, with 100% of its members going on to post-secondary education.

In the spring of 2022, the Schools Board formally announced the combination of elementary and high schools under the new name Saint Monica Preparatory. We now function as a lower and upper school model. Saint Monica provides a college preparatory curriculum for students of diverse abilities, cultures, and faiths. Guided by gospel values, our school family affirms and respects the dignity of each member of our school community.

At Saint Monica Preparatory, guided by Catholic values, our school family's mission is to encourage and develop innovative thinkers who become value-led leaders who advocate for a socially just and inclusive society.

Accreditation and Membership

Saint Monica Preparatory has been awarded the maximum six-year accreditation (extended through June 30, 2028) by the Western Catholic Education Association and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Christian Service

One hundred hours of Christian Service is the minimum graduation requirement, with 2.5 credits being granted each semester. The majority of Saint Monica students exceed this requirement. Transfer students are responsible for 260 credits; however they are not required to make up Christian Service for the years they were not at Saint Monica.

Additional Note

Students in ASB Leadership and Campus Ministry are required to take that course as part of their academic schedule.

College Entrance Examinations 2022

SAT and ACT

Most graduates applied to universities utilizing the test optional method and less than half of the class sat for an SAT or ACT exam. As such, test scores for the Class of 2022 are not reported on the school profile.

COVID-19 Adjustments

March 2020 to April 2021 instruction was provided remotely with 60 minutes of synchronous instruction and 25 minutes of asynchronous work during which time teachers checked in with students individually. Students continued to earn letter grades; students were not permitted to take academic courses credit/no credit. Teachers adjusted their syllabi with a higher emphasis on the grade weight associated with participation.

Students were given the opportunity to opt out of final exams with no penalty to their grade; if a student elected to sit for a course final, the assessment result would not result in a lower grade than which they entered the exam.

Students were provided the opportunity to return to on campus learning in April 2021. 55% of the students chose this option with the remainder continuing with synchronous remote instruction.

Since the fall of 2021, the school has returned to its normal pre-pandemic instructional practices and rigorous school model, with no adjustments to instruction.
