# Every day counts: School success starts with attendance

Encouraging regular school attendance is one of the most powerful ways to prepare your child for success—both in school and in life. When you make school attendance a priority, you help your child get better grades, develop healthy life habits, avoid dangerous behavior, and have a better chance of graduating from high school.

When students are absent for fewer days, their grades and reading skills often improve—even among those students who are struggling in school. Students who attend school regularly also feel more connected to their community, develop important social skills and friend-ships, and are significantly more likely to graduate from high school, setting them up for a strong future.

When students are absent for an average of just two days of school per month-even when the absences are excused, it can have a negative impact.

Whether students are learning to read to reading to learn, they are three to four times more likely to graduate high school and attend college, post-graduate, or professional development classes than their peers who struggle with reading.

As a parent, you can prepare your child for a lifetime of success by making regular school attendance a priority. By figuring out the reasons for your child's absences—whether they're physical or emotional—and taking advantage of support services—such as free tutoring, student mentoring, and afterschool activities—you can help set your child on the path to success.

Why is attendance and punctuality important in school?

Why are good attendance and punctuality important? A good education gives a child the best possible start in

life. We must ensure that all our students have an equal chance to make good use of the education that the school offers by providing a positive and encouraging atmosphere.

#### Why is attendance important in high school?

The attendance rate is important because students are more likely to succeed in academics when they attend school consistently. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a large number of students are frequently absent.

#### Benefits of daily attendance

By attending class regularly, your child is more likely to keep up with the daily lessons and assignments and take quizzes and tests on time.

### **School Attendance**

The importance of good attendance: Parents' commitment to school attendance will also send a message to their child that education is a priority for their family. Attending school every day is a critical part of educational success.

It is very important for students to develop habits of arriving on time at an early age, beginning from the time they start school. It helps students to learn about routines and commitment. Gives your child time to greet their friends before class and this can reduce the possibility of disruptions in the classroom.

#### Parents: Set goals for your child

Arriving On Time for School and Class:

- Makes sure that your child doesn't miss out on the important learning activities that happen early in the day when they are most alert.
- Early morning learning activity is often reading or writing your child can lose so many opportunities to learn these critical life skills.
- Helps your child to learn about routines and commitment.
- Gives your child time to greet their friends before class and this can reduce the possibility of disruptions in the classroom.
- Class disruption can make your child feel uncomfortable and can upset other children.
- Arriving on time every day makes children feel good about themselves.

Are these some reasons why students do not get to school on time?

- They won't go to bed at night or get out of bed in the morning.
- They can't find their clothes, books, homework, school bag.
- Their homework is not complete.
- They were watching TV late at night when they should be getting ready for school.

Here are some suggestions based on setting regular routines:

- Have a set time to go to bed Have a set time to be out of bed.
- Set a time each day for homework.
- Try straight after school with the TV off so your child can relax for the rest of the night and have a reward when finished.
- Turn the TV on for set times and only if appropriate.
- Be firm that children must go to school.
- Give your child lots of positive encouragement and acknowledge they are organized and get to school on time.
- Be firm; a birthday does not equal a holiday.

The school day at Northeast High School is from 7:20 AM to 2:20 PM. Timelines are extremely important.
