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Title I

Title I is a federal education program under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965, which was renamed as No Child Left Behind (NCLB) in 2001 and reauthorized as Every Student Success Act (ESSA) in 2015. Title I, Part A provides Utah with Federal funds each year to help low-income schools provide supplemental educational services to meet the needs of disadvantaged students. Title I is a funding source, not a program.

Title I Goals

1. Help students to achieve academic success in Reading/Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science.
2. Provide a well-rounded education for all students to increase their student performance through school-wide reform.
3. Build teacher capacity through high-quality, ongoing, job embedded professional learning opportunities.
4. Support parents' in helping their children succeed through quality parent, family, community engagement activities.

Identification of Title I Schools and Use of Funds

1. Schools are identified by free/reduced-price lunch applications. Any school with a percentage greater than 40% in Davis District receives funding.
2. All Title I schools in Davis District are "school wide" schools which means all students, regardless of income are served with Title I funds.
3. Title I funds are supplemental and used for supplemental personnel, supplemental books and supplies, professional learning opportunities for teachers, accelerated curriculum, extended learning opportunities, and parent and family engagement activities.
