E. DISCUSSION, REPORTS, INFORMATION ITEMS

1. Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Association of School Business Officials-International: Spring Lake Park District 16 is a multiple year recipient of this award, most recently for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for Fiscal year ended June 30, 2021. Ms. Amy Schultz, Director of Business Services, shared that this is the 16th year receiving this award and thanked Chris McGee for the leadership and beyond work necessary for the district to be eligible for this award. Chairperson Hennen thanked and congratulated the Business Services Team.

F. DISCUSSION, REPORTS, INFORMATION ITEMS

1. 2022-23 District Operational Plan (DOP): Dr. Ronneberg, Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Hope Rahn, Director of Learning and Innovation, and Erika Taibl, Director of Marketing and communications, provided a brief overview of the 2021-2022 district results and an overview of the three key projects: Innovative and personalized learning, continue to strengthen student supports and interventions, and enhance partnerships with families. Under the Innovative and Personalized Learning project, Dr. Rahn shared that our commitment is to ensure we know each student by name, strength, interest and need leading to personalized work and learning experiences leading to each student’s success in learning. Under the Continue to Strengthen Supports and Interventions project, Dr. Rahn shared that this project continues the work of strengthening the continuum of student supports and interventions matched to student academic, social, emotional, and/or behavioral needs through the creative, flexible and differentiated application of human, material and time resources. Under the project of Enhance Partnerships with Families, Ms. Taibl shared the importance of our staff, students and families being partners in student engagement and success. SLP wants to strengthen our partnerships between school and home. Ms. Rahn shared that the DOP *meets the Minnesota Department of Education’s World’s Best Workforce plan requirements*. Director Kreun thanked everyone that spoke this evening for the hard work everyone has done in supporting all our students.

2. Superintendent’s Report – Dr. Ronneberg shared some highlights of the beginning of the school year as he visited all the schools during the first few days of school. He shared some of the highlights from the “Start your Engines” community event, that activities and athletics are underway, homecoming week is from September 26-30, and the Industry Rountable is on October 13 from 3:30pm-5pm.
