
Vision

At Holy Child School at Rosemont, we believe in the magic of childhood and living out the school's motto, "Actions, not words." Here, we elevate early learning by providing students in preschool-grade 8 with an uplifting education, joyful opportunities, and a boundless childhood experience that allows kids to be kids. Our challenging and creative program, based on the pioneering educational philosophy of Cornelia Connelly, centers on the idea that happy children learn better and focuses on teaching the whole child with love, respect, and patience. In this inclusive, independent Catholic school community where all faiths are welcome, students become academically prepared, kind, confident leaders who are ready to shine in the next phase of their education.

Overview

Upon entering the impressive campus of Holy Child School at Rosemont, one is struck with the positive spirit exhibited by students and teachers. This is a school that makes learning joyous and where all children can be their full selves.

Located in a suburban community just 10 miles west of Philadelphia, Holy Child School at Rosemont is an independent, co-educational, Catholic school welcoming students from every faith. Grounded in a belief that happy children learn better, the school provides an intellectually challenging and creative program of study for students beginning in Early Childhood through grade 8, delivered in a loving and affirming environment. Founded in 1949, Holy Child School at Rosemont is a member of the Network of Holy Child Schools: high-performing schools built around the progressive and enlightened educational philosophy of Cornelia Connelly, founder of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus. For more than 70 years of ever-evolving educational styles and innovations, Holy Child School at Rosemont students have continued to win academic honors, participate in athletics and the arts, and have been admitted to top college preparatory schools.



Building on the successful ten-year tenure of current Head of School Tom Lengel, the school is intent on maintaining its special position as a co-educational, Catholic elementary school. Holy Child recognizes that there is considerable value for a child to enter preschool and complete its program in 8th grade. Across those elementary years, students undergo transformational personal growth by building self-confidence, gaining outstanding academic skills, becoming accomplished public speakers and serving as leaders and role models. The school's strength is its hard working and dedicated faculty who put into action the beliefs and practices formulated by Cornelia Connelly — living out the motto, "Actions, not words." Holy Child is that rare school where teachers, parents and students know and fully embrace the mission of the school and keep it at the front of their efforts.

The school seeks its next Head of School to begin July 2023. The successful candidate will be an experienced leader devoted to the school's mission and programs. The Head of School will report to the Board of Trustees and provide leadership for the professional community of faculty and staff, overseeing all elements of the student experience. This is an exceptional opportunity to lead a school that is confidently ready to face the future with an unwavering commitment to its mission.

Philosophy

Holy Child School at Rosemont helps children grow into persons capable of making choices which enrich their own lives and contribute to the lives of others. The school combines sound religious training with a strong academic program. Children live, work, and play in a Christian community which encourages them to exercise their freedom and to accept responsibility for their choices. As children grow in wisdom, knowledge, and grace, they value themselves and others as children of God and endeavor to live out the principles learned in service.



School Community

Holy Child has three divisions within the school, Early Childhood, Lower School, and Middle School, each with its own unique focus on fostering personal growth, community, and a sense of achievement. The wonder-filled years of Preschool-Kindergarten at Holy Child provide a foundation of curiosity, social development, and experiential learning, celebrating each student's uniqueness while building confidence and individuality. Students in the Lower School, Grades 1-4, learn to explore, question, discover, and demonstrate as they immerse themselves in the arts, world languages, spiritual growth, and differentiated instruction, becoming independent learners and responsible community members. Admired role models and leaders in the Holy Child school community, Middle School students in Grades 5-8 experience tremendous intellectual and personal growth and achievement as they prepare for great success in high school, college, and beyond.

Foundress Cornella Connelly

Well ahead of her time, and inspired by her own life experience of having been first a mother and then a nun and teacher, <u>Cornelia Connelly, Foundress</u>, recognized that happy children learn better; that effective teaching can best occur in a home-like atmosphere of love, beauty, and respect for the needs of the whole child; and that instruction of children must proceed logically and be provided with patience guided by the pace of each child's maturation. Cornelia also fervently believed that the arts, physical play, and the practice of self-expression were central—not optional—elements of a holistic approach to the education of children.

Over the span of her life, Cornelia Connelly was steadfast in her commitment to a life of service and education, forming a teaching order in England: The Society of the Holy Child Jesus. Cornelia's religious philosophy stressed deed over doctrine, and her credo of "Actions, not words" guides the school every day. Cornelia sought to empower children through education. Reverence for the learner from any religious and socioeconomic background, collaborative learning, the love of art and beauty, and the importance of spiritual nourishment—these tenets are the bedrock of a Holy Child education.



Holy Child Network of Schools

One of the ways that Holy Child School at Rosemont stands apart from other Catholic schools on the Main Line is their membership in, and commitment to, the Holy Child Network of Schools. The network is comprised of nine U.S.-based Holy Child schools, and they are united by <u>seven common Goals</u> that guide their work and serve as the foundational principles for their approach to education. These goals define and help perpetuate their tradition and speak to the spirit and vision of their Foundress, Cornelia Connelly.

Opportunities and Challenges

In addition to providing engaged and creative academic and administrative leadership to Holy Child School at Rosemont, the next Head of School will embrace the following opportunities and challenges:

Communicate, connect, and relate to a wide range of audiences in a transparent way in order to create an even stronger sense of community and foster a lifelong attachment to the school. The Head of School will maintain a high degree of trust and transparency through open, sincere, and thoughtful dialogue with faculty, administrators, the Board of Trustees, students, parents, staff, alumni, donors and other members of the community. As the champion of the community, and working with the faculty and staff, the Head will be instrumental in helping Holy Child School at Rosemont make informed and thoughtful decisions, including communicating and educating the community on the considerations driving these decisions.

Maintain an optimal organizational structure and successfully retain administrators, faculty, and staff. The Head will be responsible for cultivating the skills of individual staff members, building synergies, and communicating clear individual responsibilities while promoting a collaborative and collegial culture. Prioritizing talent development and retention of staff, the Head will need to ensure the school has a culture where the best and brightest faculty and staff want to work.



Continue to elevate the profile of Holy Child School at Rosemont. Through strategic enrollment management, program innovation, and talent acquisition and retention, the next Head will continue the momentum the school's profile has enjoyed throughout its history. Leveraging the Head's deep knowledge of the trends and unique challenges of the competitive independent school landscape will position Holy Child to thrive and emerge as the destination for "Nurturing Excellence in a Joyful Catholic Community".
