

FISD School Safety Advisory Committee

Meeting – October 6th, 2022



1. Welcome – Introductions

Each member of the committee introduced themselves and spoke about their reasons for being on this committee and what campus or department they represent. Great introductions.

2. Review of Current Safety Measures and Fall Audit Results

There was presentation and discussion on the following topics.

- Thad Roher and J.T. Patton attended this webinar on August 16th, 2022, on the Fall Intruder Detection Audit
- As a result, campus administrators, district administrators, SROs, security monitors and additional staff have been trained on what the intruder audit entails by J.T. Patton and Thad Roher.
- Results of Intruder Detection Audit were reviewed.
- FISD security monitors continue to conduct daily exterior door sweeps/checks on all exterior doors, 4-5 times per day at schools.
- Daily exterior door sweeps continue to be documented on a form and shared with campus administration, district leadership, and maintenance leadership.
- Exterior door issues are documented on these sweeps. However, campus security monitors and campus staff have been instructed and do report exterior door issues to the appropriate campus personnel for the completion of work orders.
- Summary of summer safety trainings exercise between FISD and FPD and FISD, City of Friendswood and FPD were reviewed.

- FISD in partnership with the Friendswood Police Department and the City of Friendswood (FVFD and EMS) conducted Active Threat Exercises over the summer. This year those drills were on June 10th at FHS and June 7th and 8th at FJH.
- FISD administrators, security monitors and other personnel participated in these drills on both occasions.
- Safety drills are being performed on campuses this fall and the Crisis Alert System is being used during drills.
- Pre and Post meetings are occurring before and after drills – involving Law Enforcement and the Office of Emergency Management. Discussion on progress.
- August 10th and 12th – School staffs were trained by FISD and FPD on safety. Departments were trained in the month of August
- All Threat Assessment team members have been trained through the Texas State School Safety Center Threat Assessment Certification Program. Threat Assessment teams meet regularly. Discussion on this process

3. **Review of EOP and Active Threat Annex**

The committee was broken into groups to look at the FISD Emergency Operations Plan. Specific focus was placed on the Active Threat Annex and Active Shooter Appendix. Teams discussed these plans, asked questions of law enforcement, one another and of FISD leadership, and made suggestions to these plans.
